Bill F - A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Create a Fair and Independent Department of Justice

1	RESOLVED,	By two-thirds	s of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2		proposed as a	an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,
3		which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution	
4		when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states	
5		within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:	
6			ARTICLE
7		SECTION 1:	The Attorney General shall be elected by a direct vote of
8			the American people concurrent to elections for the
9			offices of President and Vice President.
10		SECTION 2:	The Attorney General shall head the Department of
11			Justice, an independent branch of government whose
12			budget shall be determined by Congress.
13		SECTION 3:	The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article
14			by appropriate legislation.
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Finals 3 - A Bill to Bolster the Nigerian Military to Quell the Boko Haram Insurgency

1	BE IT ENACTE	NACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	The United States shall conduct joint operations with the Nigerian military		
3		against insurgent attacks and provide \$100 million annually in aid toward		
4		Nigerian bottom-up stabilization programs and conflict mitigation		
5		systems.		
6	SECTION 2.	Bottom-up stabilization programs are defined as programs that restore		
7		local governance or ensure the distribution of services or resources to		
8		those susceptible to insurgency. Conflict mitigation systems will be		
9		defined as military systems that pursue the demobilization,		
10		deradicalization, rehabilitation, and/or reintegration of individuals		
11		affiliated with Boko Haram.		
12	SECTION 3.	USAID will work with the Departments of Defense and State to coordinate		
13		proper implementation with the Federal Republic of Nigeria.		
14		A. The U.S. Department of Defense will submit an annual report on		
15		the efficacy of these programs and joint operations to Congress.		
16		B. Based on their findings from the report in Section 3A, Congress		
17		may choose to end some, or all support provided by this		
18		legislation.		
19	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this		
20		legislation are hereby declared null and void.		
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
