A Bill to Replace the Federal Income Tax with a Fair Tax

1.	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2.	SECTION 1.	The United States Federal Income Tax will be replaced by a
3.		consumption tax model called The Fair Tax.
4.	SECTION 2.	The Fair Tax would replace the federal individual income tax,
		corporate income tax, payroll tax, estate and gift taxes with a
5.		twenty-three percent national sales tax.
6.	SECTION 3.	A. The Fair Tax would outsource the administration of the
7.		national sales tax to the governments of the 50 states and the
8.		District of Columbia. Currently, 45 states and D.C. collect
9.		statewide sales taxes. In states without a sales tax, the
10.		Secretary of the Treasury (or another state) would administer
11.		the national sales tax.

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A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish a Right to Healthcare

RESOLVED,	By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the
	following article is proposed as an amendment to the
	Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
	intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified
	by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
	seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
	- ARTICLE -
SECTION 1.	All citizens of the United States and its territories are
	henceforth entitled to comprehensive healthcare free of
	charge.
SECTION 2.	Comprehensive healthcare shall include at minimum
	preventative, urgent, and emergency 9 care in the areas of
	traditional healthcare, dental care, ophthalmological care,
	and 10 behavioral healthcare.

	appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Fund Health Savings Accounts for Low-Income Citizens

- 6. **A.** Poverty line is defined by the Heath and Human Services as a
- 7. generated income of \$15,060 or less per year for individuals and
- 8. \$20,440 for couples.
- 9. **B.** Health savings account is defined as a tax-advantaged savings
- 10. account for individuals that allows you to set aside money to cover
- 11. qualified medical expenses.
- 12. **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will
- 13. oversee enforcement of this bill.
- 14. **A.** HHS will conduct a yearly review to identify eligible citizens.
- 15. **B.** HHS will establish and fund a savings account for all eligible citizens
- 16. and provide an HSA finance card.

A Bill to Federally Regulate Cryptocurrencies

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** This Congress finds that cryptocurrency volatility and regulation
- gaps have caused scams and environmental harm, necessitating
 protective measures.
- 5. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
- 6. A. "Cryptocurrency": Digital currency secured by cryptography, excluding
 7. U.S. dollar-pegged ones
- 8. "Crypto Permit": Federal authorization for personal traders to legally trade9. and mine, subject to SEC approval
- 10. C. "KYC" (Know Your Customer): Process to verify client identities and11. prevent fraud
- 12. **D.** "AML" (Anti-Money Laundering): Regulations to prevent financial crimes, including money laundering
- 14. **E.** "Mixer services": Platforms that obscure transaction histories
- 15. **F.** "Blockchain analytics software": Tools for analyzing blockchain16. transactions and enhancing transparency
- SECTION 3. The SEC will oversee the enforcement of this legislation. The IRS will enforce environmental taxes on crypto mining and enhance blockchain analytics and audit capabilities. FinCEN will monitor
 KYC and AML compliance for decentralized exchanges and crypto ATMs. The Department of Justice (DOJ) will help close mixer services.
- A. Prohibit cryptocurrencies as legal payment tender unless pegged to the
 U.S. dollar.
- 25. **B.** Impose a 10% tax on crypto profits for environmental damage.

A Bill to Exempt Cash Tips from Federal Income Taxes to Raise Working Wages

2.	SECTION 1.	The United States will amend the Internal Revenue Code of
3.		1986 to provide that tips shall not be subject to income or
4.		employment taxes. This policy will be targeted towards
5.		adjusting the salary of wage working and low-income
6.		constituents.
7.	SECTION 2.	A. The Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (part VII of subchapter
8.		B of chapter 1) will be amended to allow taxpayers to claim
9.		a 100% deduction at filing for cash tips.
10.		B. "Cash Tips" will be defined as gratuity payments in the form
11.		of cash, credit and debit card charges, and checks that are
12.		intended to reward services provided by wageworkers.
