A Resolution to Demand that the President Re-Sign the Rome Statute

1. **WHEREAS,** International law and the promise of world peace are only
2. possible when the nations of the world work together to
3. support these lofty goals; and
4. **WHEREAS,** The withdrawal of the United States from the Rome Statute in
5. 2002 dealt a serious blow to our nation's credibility and to the
6. values we claim to hold dear, both at home and abroad;
7. and
8. **WHEREAS,** It is not too late to reverse course and reclaim our position as
9. a moral leader for the entire globe; now, therefore be it
10. **RESOLVED,** by the Congress here assembled that the President of the
11. United States is called upon to sign back onto the Rome
12. Statute of the International Criminal Court (ICC) and reaffirm
13. our nation's commitment to upholding the work of the ICC,
14. including our full cooperation in the enforcement and
15. execution of all ICC arrest warrants; and be it
16. **FURTHER RESOLVED,** that, should the President answer this call, Congress
17. as a whole implores all Senators to vote to ratify the Rome
18. Statute

A Bill to Replace the Federal Income Tax with a Fair Tax

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The United States Federal Income Tax will be replaced by a
3. consumption tax model called The Fair Tax.
4. **SECTION 2.** The Fair Tax would replace the federal individual income tax,
5. corporate income tax, payroll tax, estate and gift taxes with a
6. twenty-three percent national sales tax.
7. **SECTION 3. A.** The Fair Tax would outsource the administration of the
8. national sales tax to the governments of the 50 states and the
9. District of Columbia. Currently, 45 states and D.C. collect
10. statewide sales taxes. In states without a sales tax, the
11. Secretary of the Treasury (or another state) would administer
12. the national sales tax.
13. **B.** Taxpayers will receive a monthly prebate for the cost of
14. sales tax on necessities up to the federal poverty level.
15. **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026.
16. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
17. and void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish a Right to Healthcare

1. **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the
2. following article is proposed as an amendment to the
3. Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
4. intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified
5. by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
6. seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

9. **– ARTICLE –**

11. **SECTION 1.** All citizens of the United States and its territories are
12. henceforth entitled to comprehensive healthcare free of
13. charge.

15. **SECTION 2.** Comprehensive healthcare shall include at minimum
16. preventative, urgent, and emergency care in the areas of
17. traditional healthcare, dental care, ophthalmological care,
18. and behavioral healthcare.

21. **SECTION 3.** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by
22. appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Fund Health Savings Accounts for Low-Income Citizens

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The United States federal government will contribute \$1,000
3. annually to a health saving account for citizens below the
4. poverty line.
5. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
6. **A.** Poverty line is defined by the Health and Human Services as a
7. generated income of \$15,060 or less per year for individuals and
8. \$20,440 for couples.
9. **B.** Health savings account is defined as a tax-advantaged savings
10. account for individuals that allows you to set aside money to cover
11. qualified medical expenses.
12. **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will
13. oversee enforcement of this bill.
14. **A.** HHS will conduct a yearly review to identify eligible citizens.
15. **B.** HHS will establish and fund a savings account for all eligible citizens
16. and provide an HSA finance card.
17. **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026.
18. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
19. and void.

A Bill to Federally Regulate Cryptocurrencies

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** This Congress finds that cryptocurrency volatility and regulation
3. gaps have caused scams and environmental harm, necessitating
4. protective measures.
5. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
6. **A.** "Cryptocurrency": Digital currency secured by cryptography, excluding
7. U.S. dollar-pegged ones
8. **B.** "Crypto Permit": Federal authorization for personal traders to legally trade
9. and mine, subject to SEC approval
10. **C.** "KYC" (Know Your Customer): Process to verify client identities and
11. prevent fraud
12. **D.** "AML" (Anti-Money Laundering): Regulations to prevent financial crimes,
13. including money laundering
14. **E.** "Mixer services": Platforms that obscure transaction histories
15. **F.** "Blockchain analytics software": Tools for analyzing blockchain
16. transactions and enhancing transparency
17. **SECTION 3.** The SEC will oversee the enforcement of this legislation. The IRS will
18. enforce environmental taxes on crypto mining and enhance
19. blockchain analytics and audit capabilities. FinCEN will monitor
20. KYC and AML compliance for decentralized exchanges and crypto
21. ATMs. The Department of Justice (DOJ) will help close mixer
22. services.
23. **A.** Prohibit cryptocurrencies as legal payment tender unless pegged to the
24. U.S. dollar.
25. **B.** Impose a 10% tax on crypto profits for environmental damage.
26. **C.** Create a "Crypto Permit" for personal traders, requiring SEC approval.
27. **D.** Mandate KYC and AML for decentralized exchanges and ATMs.
28. **E.** Terminate all mixer services that conceal transaction details.
29. **F.** Allocate a total of \$250 million to the SEC for blockchain analytics
30. software and auditing cryptocurrency transactions.
31. **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in FY 2026.
32. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
33. void.

A Bill to Implement Ranked Choice Voting to Reform Federal Elections

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** Congress shall require Ranked Choice Voting for elections for
3. both Senators and Representatives in all states. The House
4. elections shall use Multi-Member Districts to choose
5. representatives.

7. **SECTION 2.** Ranked Choice Voting in conjunction with Multi-Member
8. Districts will replace the current election structure
9. **A.** Ranked Choice Voting is defined as a system where each voter
10. ranks candidates for an office in order of preference
11. **B.** For Multi-Member Districts, if a state is entitled to six or more
12. Representatives in Congress, the State shall establish a number of
13. districts for the election of Representatives in the State that is less
14. than the number of Representatives which the state is entitled, and
15. Representatives shall be elected only from districts so established
16. **C.** Each district must have equal population as practicable per the U.S
17. Constitution
18. **D.** Each district elects 3 to 5 representatives.
19. **E.** The number of representatives shall be the total U.S population
20. divided by the population of the smallest state.
21. **SECTION 3.** The Federal Election Commission will oversee the
22. enforcement of this legislation. \$2 billion dollars shall be
23. allocated towards the process of adopting the RCV system.
24. Such funding shall be used for equipment, software, and
25. infrastructure necessary for the system.

27. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026
28. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
29. and void.

A Bill to Exempt Cash Tips from Federal Income Taxes to Raise Working Wages

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The United States will amend the Internal Revenue Code of
3. 1986 to provide that tips shall not be subject to income or
4. employment taxes. This policy will be targeted towards
5. adjusting the salary of wage working and low-income
6. constituents.
7. **SECTION 2. A.** The Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (part VII of subchapter
8. B of chapter 1) will be amended to allow taxpayers to claim
9. a 100% deduction at filing for cash tips.
10. **B.** "Cash Tips" will be defined as gratuity payments in the form
11. of cash, credit and debit card charges, and checks that are
12. intended to reward services provided by wageworkers.
13. **SECTION 3. A.** The Secretary of the Treasury will oversee the
14. implementation of this legislation along with the specific
15. enforcement mechanism.
16. **B.** The Internal Revenue Service will be responsible for
17. providing the 100% tax deduction for cash tips.
18. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
19. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
20. and void.
