Item 1 - A Bill to Implement a National Tax on Meat Consumption to Reduce Environmental Impact

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** A national tax on meat consumption is hereby implemented to reduce the environmental impact of meat production.
- **SECTION 2.** "Meat consumption" refers to the purchase and consumption of all types of meat, including beef, pork, poultry, and lamb.
- **SECTION 3.** The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will oversee the collection and enforcement of this tax.
 - A. A tax rate of 10% will be applied to all meat products sold.
 - B. Revenue generated from this tax will be used to fund sustainable agriculture initiatives.
 - C. Violations will result in fines up to \$50,000 per incident.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Item 2 - A Bill to Mandate the Use of Biometric Identification for Voting to Prevent Election Fraud

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** The use of biometric identification for voting is hereby mandated to prevent election fraud and ensure the integrity of the electoral process.
- SECTION 2. "Biometric identification" refers to the use of unique physical characteristics, such as fingerprints or facial recognition, to verify voter identity.
- **SECTION 3.** The Federal Election Commission (FEC) will oversee the implementation and regulation of biometric identification in voting.
 - A. All polling stations must be equipped with biometric identification systems.
 - B. Violations will result in fines up to \$100,000 per incident.
 - C. Annual reports on the effectiveness and security of biometric voting systems will be published.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Item 3 - A Resolution to Regulate the Use of Genetic Data by Insurance Companies to Protect Consumer Privacy

- WHEREAS, Advances in genetic testing have made it possible to obtain detailed information about an individual's genetic makeup; and
- WHEREAS, There is concern that insurance companies could use genetic data to discriminate against individuals based on their genetic predispositions; and
- WHEREAS, The misuse of genetic data could lead to privacy violations and unfair treatment of consumers; and
- WHEREAS, Regulating the use of genetic data by insurance companies can protect consumer privacy and prevent discrimination; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled encourages the regulation of the use of genetic data by insurance companies to protect consumer privacy and prevent discrimination; and, be it
- **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will oversee the development and enforcement of regulations regarding the use of genetic data by insurance companies.
