

# WIRELESS INTERNET INSTRUCTIONS

Getting online is easier than ever thanks to a new event network. Simply connect to **WA-Event**; the password is **events2015**. This should get you online with minimal hassle. This network was successfully used for the 2013 GISA Conference so it should be up to the challenge of our debate tournament.

If the WA-Event network doesn't work for you, you can also try to connect to our guest network. To do so, follow these directions:

1. Connect to **WA-Guest** (not WA-WiFi.1x or WA-Kindle). Sometimes the network is called vWA-Guest.
2. Open a browser. You should be automatically redirected to the splash page. If not, go to **vbsc.woodward.edu**.
3. Click on the "**Create New Account**" button on the left hand side of the page. An email-capable mobile device is necessary when creating an account.
4. If you wish to have the login information **texted to your mobile phone** (because you cannot receive email), find your carrier in the list below and input the mobile number as an email address when creating the account.

5. Guest accounts can only be used by **one device at a time**. Each individual must create their own account in order to connect their device to the network.

## Important:

1. While our Wi-Fi network is much better than it has been in previous years, it can still be spotty in certain parts of the campus. If you are having trouble connecting, please try again later or in a different location. While we are happy to provide these instructions, **we cannot provide technical support** or field questions or complaints about the school's wireless network. If the internet doesn't work, we apologize — but we can't fix it.
2. Please **do not** unplug ethernet cords from teachers' computers in order to plug your own device(s) into the network. Plugging in via ethernet **does not work** but **will** result in offenders being **removed from the tournament**.
3. Please **do not** unplug computers, smartboards, projectors, refrigerators, or any other devices from electrical outlets. If a room is short on outlets, please use a power strip. If you do not have one, please contact a member of the tournament staff to borrow one. Unplugging things in our classrooms jeopardizes our ability to host this event and will result in offenders being **removed from the tournament**.
