Safety and Security Procedures

The safety of all participants at Bronx Science is of utmost importance to us. We, unfortunately, are in a time where there is a need to enhance security procedures at the tournament. Bronx Science also believes in an open tournament and welcomes individuals to observe and learn at the event

To that end, the tournament will institute the below security protocols which all attending schools must follow.

- 1. Schools must register all participants at the tournament who are not competitors or judges as follows:
 - a. Adults that are not judging must be entered in to the "Observer Adult" judging pool. This includes parents, chaperone, coaches or adults that are affiliated with the team who intends to enter the building.
 - b. All student-observers (who are not competitors) must be entered into the "Observer Student" event. This is for all non-competing student attendees who will be at the tournament.
 - c. Schools do not need to register competitors or judges as those individuals are already accounted for in tabroom.
- 2. At registration (on Friday or Saturday), the adult moderator will receive colored wrist bands for all days of competition. Each day will have a different color. The number of wristbands will be determined based on the number of competitors, judges and observers.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the adult moderator to distribute the wrist bands to the school's participants and ensure that all participants wear the correct colored wrist band each day which need to be visible.

ANY PERSON THAT IS NOT REGISTERED WITH A SCHOOL CANNOT BE ON THE SCHOOL PREMISES.

We ask all participants to be aware of their environment and report to tab any issue that may exist. We hope to make this process as easy as possible. As this is our first time implementing these procedures, we know there will be some bumps and appreciate your patience in advance. It is with your help and cooperation that the tournament will run smoothly and safely.
