If you get the chicken you get half a chicken and if you get the chicken fried steak it covers a plate. Word on the street is that they have great desserts. I've never made it that far. The University of Kansas has a long history of success in college debate as a top NDT/CEDA program, and we encourage anyone interested in continuing their debate career in college to consider KU as an option for developing their skills and reaching their full potential as a debater.

On average we travel to 15 invitational tournaments a year, including: Northwestern, Kentucky, University of Houston, Harvard, University of Central Oklahoma, Wake Forest, and the University of Texas at Austin to name a few. In addition, all teams are given the opportunity to attend ADA and CEDA Nationals in the spring, and those that qualify attend the NDT. We guarantee that we will travel all students to tournaments.

Kansas has seen a lot of success in recent years: NDT champions (2009, 2018), Top speaker at the NDT (2019, 2021), Finals of the NDT (2016, 2024, 2025), Semifinals of the NDT (2021, 2022), Quarters of the NDT (2021, 2023, 2024), reached finals at CEDA (2019), won the Copeland (2018, 2025), ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in the Copeland Race (2020, 2021), and qualifying at least one team to the NDT for 57 consecutive years. With our growing squad, we expect to see success continue in the years to come.

The Jayhawks are also a family: we support each other and work hard. I encourage you to follow us on Twitter, Instagram, and “Friend” our Facebook account: Kansas Debate, to see what we have been up to this season and get a feel for our debaters and coaches. We debate a wide variety of approaches, and no matter what your style is, you are welcome as a part of our team.

In addition to our success at debate, other distinctions our university can point to include: a top ten college newspaper, highly competitive architecture program, top ranked study abroad program in the country, and a top ten honors program. Prospective students will find 137 different possible degree programs to choose from at the University of Kansas, including: Communication Studies, Business, Journalism, Political Science, and more. KU also offers smaller classes sizes (20 or fewer students) that give students more opportunities to work one-on-one with their professors. Michigan also hosts numerous top ten graduate programs, including their renowned law, business, and public policy schools. There are approximately 35,000 undergraduate students at Michigan. Students from all 50 states and more than 100 foreign countries contribute to a culturally and ethnically diverse campus community.

The University of Michigan Intercollegiate Debating Team was one of the nation's first intercollegiate forensics teams, founded in 1903. For over a hundred years, the Debate Team has excelled in teaching critical thinking skills and persuasive communication techniques.

The University of Michigan Debate Team first reached the elimination rounds of the National Debate Tournament in 1971. Michigan has reached the semifinals of the NDT nine times and finals eight times, including winning the tournament for the first time in April of 2024. Michigan's had the top speaker at the NDT once and second speaker three times. Michigan has won the Copeland Award three times, given to the top first round at-large team in the country, including most recently in 2022 and 2023. Michigan has received 39 first round at-large bids to the NDT and 61 teams have reached the elimination rounds. This year our top team won the Northwestern University Tournament and was runner-up at the University of Kentucky.

The Michigan Debate Team prides itself on the consistent academic accomplishments of all its debaters. This success is reflected by their matriculation to the nation's leading law and graduate programs, including Harvard, Yale, Stanford, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Chicago, Texas, Georgetown, Columbia, NYU, Berkeley, Emory, Virginia, etc. Michigan Debate has produced numerous lawyers, doctors, professors, entrepreneurs, teachers, etc.

I am running the policy tabroom at the tournament this weekend and should be available to discuss the University of Michigan or Michigan Debate if you are interested. I also plan to attend our tournament, The Glenbrooks, Blake, MBA, Pace Academy Round Robin/Emory University, California Round Robin, NDCA, and the Tournament of Champions.

## **When should I apply to Michigan?**

Michigan is already accepting applications. Michigan is using the Common Application again this year and you will just need to complete a few additional specific essays. Further information can be found here- <http://admissions.umich.edu/apply/>

I strongly encourage you to apply by November 1st to Michigan. Early Action is completely non-binding and if you apply by November 1, you are guaranteed a decision by late January. If you don't apply by November 1, you may not receive a decision until as late as April. Applying early gives you the best chance to get accepted, multiple chances to get accepted, and the best chance to receive merit/need-based scholarships and gain admittance to the UM Honors Program. Further information about applying can be found here- <http://admissions.umich.edu/apply/freshmen-applicants/requirements-deadlines>. New for fall 2026 first-year applicants, Early Decision (ED) is a binding plan. Students who participate in the Early Decision plan will apply by Nov. 1 and can expect a decision notification by the end of December.

## **Does Debate help you with the Admissions process at Michigan?**

The UM Admissions Office wants to attract the top students from around the country and world to Ann Arbor and debate helps facilitate this goal. Debate alone won't get you accepted to Michigan if your grades and scores are well outside of Michigan's normal range. If they are within Michigan's range and your Admissions decision is competitive, debate excellence is the type of thing that could help push your application across the finish line. Unfortunately, I likely cannot be of any help if you don't apply by November 1st.

## **Am I eligible for any merit-based or debate scholarships at Michigan?**

If you are accepted and complete your FAFSA, the University will send you an official financial aid package. The Shipman Scholars program provides merit scholarships for talented prospective undergraduate students admitted to the University of Michigan. Prospective students of high academic achievement who have been admitted as first year undergraduates will be nominated for consideration through the Admissions process. Academic achievement will be determined based on a set standard of high school grade point average and SAT/ACT test scores. The award value of the scholarship at a maximum is \$120,000. 16 Shipman Scholarships will be awarded annually. Starting in 2011, UM Debate alums have awarded merit scholarships to incoming debaters. Any student that gets accepted to Michigan is considered for these and between 1-3 scholarships are awarded each year. Final decisions are usually made in April shortly after the Tournament of Champions.

The University of Texas at Austin has a rich history of debate participation. For the past forty years, Texas Debate has operated as a university sponsored sub-entity within the Moody College of Communication's Department of Communication Studies. Together, with Texas Speech, these two university sponsored programs comprise the Texas Forensics Union—recognized by the American Forensic Association as the #1 full-service speech and debate program in the nation.

Texas Debate competes primarily in cross-examination debate formats sanctioned by the National Debate Tournament, Cross-Examination Debate Association, and American Debate Association. Texas has qualified to every National Debate Tournament since 1988. Notable program successes include one CEDA national championship (2021), one second place finish at ADA nationals (2024), three National Debate Tournament Final Four appearances (1995, 2000, 2005), one CEDA Final Four appearance (2013), multiple top-5 speaker awards at the NDT, and multiple top-5 individually ranked regular season partnerships (1995, 2024).

Although it is housed in the Moody College, Texas Debate participation is open to all UT-Austin undergraduate students. In addition to Moody students, many undergraduates from the McCombs School of Business, the Cockrell School of Engineering, and the College of Liberal Arts have participated in the program. There are limited scholarships available to the most involved competitors. Unfortunately, the program does not offer any full-rides and no longer has special means of assistance for out-of-state students.
