Topics:

Lincoln-Douglas – January/February 2026 topic

Parliamentary – Topics to be written

Policy – 2025-26 topic – "Resolved: The United States federal government should significantly increase its exploration and/or development of the Arctic."

Public Forum – February 2026 topic

Rules:

Policy schedule – Entries in policy debate are exclusive of other events, students may not double enter in policy and another event.

Debate/extemp double entries – Students who double enter in Lincoln-Douglas, Parliamentary, or Public Forum AND extemporaneous speaking do so at their own risk; students who are late to extemp prep will not be given extra time.

Round pairings – Rounds 1 and 2 of all debate events including policy are preset, round 3 of all debate events and round 4 of policy are all power matched based on win-loss record.

Internet – Usage follows all OSAA rules respective to the event the student is participating in. **Speaker points** – The range for speaker points for all debate events is 25-30, with 25 being the lowest with improvement needed in all areas, and 30 being the best speech you've ever heard.

Sweepstakes – Sweepstakes points will be awarded according to a modified version of the points system found in the OSAA Speech Handbook Section 11.2. The modified version is as follows:

Debate – 15 points for first, 10 for second

IE – 10 points for first, 8 for second, 6 for third

Fees:

\$10 each entry for both IE and debate, with a \$20 one-time school fee. Policy debate entries are sponsored by the Forensic League of Eugene and are free, and any school that has entries in policy debate will have their school fee waived as well.

Judges:

Obligation – Teams are expected to provide one speech judge for every 6 IE entries and one debate judge for every 2 debate entries in the tournament. Policy debate entries will require one judge for every 2 entries to be in the specific policy debate judge pool. If you are a new program and meeting judging obligations is a barrier, please contact the tournament director for more information.

Arrival and food – Judges are expected to check in by 7:30am unless otherwise noted in the availability note on Tabroom. Food is provided for judges in the judges lounge.

Training – If you are new to judging or would like a refresher, please attend the judge training in room 17 at 7:30am.

Topics – If you are judging extemp, impromptu, or parliamentary, please pick up the topics from the Tabroom before you go to your round.
