#### Dear Senators:

Yesterday in the United States, this nation suffered what cybersecurity officials are calling the most severe data breach to ever occur in the history of our nation. Due to a failure in the National Artificial Intelligence Initiative Office's oversight, all U.S. artificial intelligence systems are in the midst of outages and classified national defense files along with the personal data of over 200 million Americans have been exposed.

Included in the leaked information are home addresses, biometric data, financial accounts, and encrypted communication records of both civilians and federal workers, including members of this very Congress. Analysts within the Department of Defense have now confirmed that internal agencies have retained unauthorized access to this data and are actively exploring how to use the system's predictive algorithms for "domestic threat management."

Reports indicate that a classified government AI program has been programmed to flag individuals as potential national security risks based on private communications, search history, and other personal information without human review or judicial oversight.

As public trust in the government dissolves, Congress faces an urgent decision. One proposal calls for the complete defunding and dismantling of all federally used AI systems in order to ensure privacy from here on out while the other calls for granting the federal government full immunity from lawsuits in order to continue vital federal operations that require the use of AI.

The United States urges Congress to intervene in this crisis. Take into account the severity of your decision making, as the security of millions of Americans are at stake.

# A Bill to Suspend Government-Funded Artificial Intelligence Programs

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The United States shall terminate all government-funded Artificial
2		Intelligence (AI) programs and partnerships until federal privacy regulations
3		are enacted.
4	SECTION 2.	AI programs shall be defined as internal AI initiatives of government
5		agencies, including research and data centers. Al partnerships shall be
6		defined as collaboration between the government and external agencies.
7	SECTION 3.	The White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP), National
8		Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), and Office of Management
9		and Budget (OMB) shall oversee the enforcement of this legislation in
10		conjunction with federal agencies that oversee AI programs and
11		partnerships relevant to their missions. These enforcement details include:
12		A. Regulating the suspension of all programs and partnerships in
13		accordance with this legislation and federal law.
14		B. Monitoring the establishment of federal privacy regulations.
15		C. Establishing clear regulatory pathways to reinstate AI programs and
16		partnerships after federal privacy regulations are enacted.
17	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect immediately after passing. All laws in
18		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# **Governmental Artificial Intelligence Data Protection Act**

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

L	SECTION 1.	The United States shall grant agencies and contractors of the federal
2		government who use Artificial Intelligence (AI) statutory immunity.
3	SECTION 2.	Statutory immunity shall be defined as legal protection from prosecution
1		and liability in relation to lawsuits that are specifically related to the release
5		of data.
õ	SECTION 3.	The Department of Justice (DOJ) shall oversee the enforcement of this
7		legislation in coordination with the White House Office of Science and
3		Technology Policy (NIST). These enforcement details include:
)		A. Establishing a submission process allowing entities to report their Al
10		system and a report of their AI use to the DOJ within 14 days to be
11		granted immunity.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect immediately after passing. All laws in
13		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
