A Bill to Increase Equity and Authenticity in College Admissions

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1. As a condition of accreditation, no institute of higher education within the United
3	States and its territories may request or consider any student's scores on the SAT
4	as part of its admissions process.
5	SECTION 2. An institute of higher education is defined as a college, university, or other entity
6	that provides education after high school. The SAT refers to the standardized test
7	owned, developed, and published by the College Board and administered by
8	Educational Testing Services.
9	SECTION 3 . This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education.

- 10 **SECTION 4**. This legislation shall take effect on July 1, 2026.
- 11 **SECTION 5**. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

	A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish the Right to Unionize
1	RESOLVED , That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the
2	United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the
3	Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states
4	within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
5	ARTICLE —
6	SECTION 1. An empowered and respected labor force being necessary to the prosperity and
7	integrity of a free state, the right of the people to unionize shall not be infringed.
8	SECTION 2 . The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Jumpstart Domestic Rubber Production

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1. Congress shall establish a fund of \$2 billion per year for each of the next five
3	years to increase domestic rubber production toward a goal of rubber
4	independence.
5	SECTION 2 . These funds shall be used to increase farming of guayule (Parthenium
6	argentatum), Russian dandelion (Taraxacum kok-saghyz), and any other plants
7	that may be used to produce rubber, as well as to build additional factories for the
8	processing and refinement of rubber. These funds may also be used to expand and
9	improve any infrastructure deemed necessary to this goal.
10	SECTION 3 . This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Agriculture, which shall
11	be responsible for disbursing and monitoring the use of these funds.
12	SECTION 4 . This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
13	SECTION 5 . All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reverse and Prevent Intercensal Redistricting

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1 . Congressional redistricting shall henceforth be limited to that which occurs
3	automatically following each constitutionally-mandated decennial census. States
4	shall be prohibited from engaging in any additional redistricting outside of this
5	process.
6	SECTION 2 . Any redistricting implemented since the most recent census is hereby nullified,
7	with any affected districts reverting to their form as set as a direct result of the
8	2020 Census.
9	SECTION 3 . This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Justice and the
10	Census Bureau.
11	SECTION 4 . This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
12	SECTION 5 . All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Remove the Social Security Cap

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1 . All payroll earnings shall henceforth be subject to the Social Security payroll tax,
3	regardless of how much those earnings total each year.
4	SECTION 2 . This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS)
5	and the Social Security Administration (SSA), with the latter organization
6	specifically tasked with determining appropriate rates for those income levels that
7	were not covered before this point.
8	SECTION 3 . This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
9	SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Combat Golden Mussel Infestation

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1. Congress shall allocate \$120 million in initial funding to establish and expand
3	inspection and decontamination stations to prevent the spread of golden mussels
4	(Limnoperna fortunei) and other invasive mussel species.
5	SECTION 2. An additional \$100 million shall be allocated annually for ongoing operations,
6	staffing, enforcement, monitoring, maintenance, and public education related to
7	mussel prevention and control.
8	SECTION 3. The United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) shall serve as the lead
9	administering agency and may coordinate with:
10	a. National Park Service, Regional water authorities, County and municipal
11	governments, Tribal governments, Marina and reservoir operators,
12	Federal agencies as applicable
13	SECTION 4. Funding shall be drawn from the General Fund of the U.S Treasury, with
14	supplemental matching opportunities sought from federal invasive species
15	programs and interstate water protection agreements.
16	SECTION 5. This legislation shall take effect January 1, 2026.
17	SECTION 6. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
