

A Bill to Protect Access to Gender Affirming Care for Minors

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall grant minors over the age of 14 the right to provide
2 medical consent (MC) to best practice medical procedures, grant minors
3 experiencing puberty the right to provide MC to puberty blockers, affirm
4 the legality of minors having access to HRT, require insurance to cover HRT
5 and puberty blockers, and institute a program to fund HRT/puberty
6 blockers for minors whose legal guardians are unable or unwilling to cover
7 such treatments and who are uninsured; with all providers required to
8 meet standards of care that shall be set by the Department of Health and
9 Human Services.

10 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this act:

11 I. HRT shall be considered as therapy replacing gonadal steroids for the
12 purposes of reducing gender dysphoria and/or affirming the gender
13 identity of transgender individuals.

14 II. Transgender individuals shall be considered as those identifying as a
15 gender other than that originally on their birth certificate.

16 III. Puberty blockers shall be considered as compounds to suppress the
17 production of gonadal steroids within the body to delay puberty.

18 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen and enforced by the Department of
19 Health and Human Services, with funding managed by the Department of
20 the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service.

21 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect in the fiscal year of 2026. All laws in conflict
22 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reverse and Prevent Intercensal Redistricting

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congressional redistricting shall henceforth be limited to that which occurs automatically
3 following each constitutionally-mandated decennial census. States shall be prohibited from
4 engaging in any additional redistricting outside of this process.

5 **SECTION 2.** Any redistricting implemented since the most recent census is hereby nullified, with any
6 affected districts reverting to their form as set as a direct result of the 2020 Census.

7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Justice and the Census
8 Bureau.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Equity and Authenticity in College Admissions

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** As a condition of accreditation, no institute of higher education within the United States
3 and its territories may request or consider any student’s scores on the SAT as part of its
4 admissions process.

5 **SECTION 2.** An institute of higher education is defined as a college, university, or other entity that
6 provides education after high school. The SAT refers to the standardized test owned,
7 developed, and published by the College Board and administered by Educational Testing
8 Services.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on July 1, 2026.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Update Maps

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The use of the Mercator Projection shall be eliminated in maps within all agencies and
3 offices of the federal government, particularly those maps that are on display. These maps
4 shall be replaced with ones that utilize the Gall-Peters Projection or, where practicable,
5 globes.

6 **SECTION 2.** Only when necessary for navigational purposes shall the continued use of the Mercator
7 Projection be permitted.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Geological Survey.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Milk Choice in Schools

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** All public schools in the United States and its territories shall henceforth provide raw milk
3 as an option for students during breakfast and lunch.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this legislation, raw milk shall be defined as the unpasteurized milk of a
5 cow.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** Schools may determine based on demand precisely how much raw milk to provide at each
7 meal, but it must be a reliable option for children and families who desire it.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Education and the Food and
9 Drug Administration (FDA).
- 10 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
- 11 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Jumpstart Domestic Rubber Production

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall establish a fund of \$2 billion per year for each of the next five years to
3 increase domestic rubber production toward a goal of rubber independence.

4 **SECTION 2.** These funds shall be used to increase farming of guayule (*Parthenium argentatum*), Russian
5 dandelion (*Taraxacum kok-saghyz*), and any other plants that may be used to produce
6 rubber, as well as to build additional factories for the processing and refinement of rubber.
7 These funds may also be used to expand and improve any infrastructure deemed necessary
8 to this goal.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Agriculture, which shall be
10 responsible for disbursing and monitoring the use of these funds.

11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Remove the Social Security Cap

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** All payroll earnings shall henceforth be subject to the Social Security payroll tax, regardless
- 3 of how much those earnings total each year.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Social
- 5 Security Administration (SSA), with the latter organization specifically tasked with
- 6 determining appropriate rates for those income levels that were not covered before this
- 7 point.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
- 9 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Kill the Shadow Docket

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Supreme Court of the United States is hereby prohibited from making motions and
3 issuing orders on the shadow docket. All motions and orders must henceforth be made
4 with the utmost transparency and respect for procedure.

5 **SECTION 2.** The shadow docket refers to those motions and orders that are made outside of ordinary
6 procedure, specifically without having reached final judgment, decision on appeal, and/or
7 oral arguments.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

9 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
