A Bill to Ban the Payment of College Athletes

1	BE IT ENACTED	BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2	SECTION 1.	As athletics are a non-mandatory element of a college education and one
3		which provides clear non-monetary benefits to students who participate,
4		the financial compensation of college athletes is hereby unconditionally
5		prohibited.
6	SECTION 2.	This prohibition shall apply to all students competing on teams that are
7		officially affiliated with a specific college or university, regardless of the
8		size, popularity, and competitiveness of the league(s) in which a team
9		competes.
10	SECTION 3.	This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education.
11	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
12	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The AI Manhattan Project Act (AIMPA)

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:		
2	SECTION 1.	Congress shall apportion \$30 billion to the Department of Defense and	
3		the Department of Energy for the immediate initiation of the AI	
4		Manhattan Project.	
5	SECTION 2.	The term AI Manhattan Project shall refer to the government	
6		consolidation of all relevant private and public sector resources to	
7		develop Artificial General Intelligence capabilities as soon as possible. As	
8		a matter of national defense, such a project would receive top priority	
9		and be executed with the strictest confidentiality to protect against	
10		foreign espionage.	
11	SECTION 3.	The Congressional Budget Office shall be tasked with bringing about the	
12		economic feasibility of such an expensive undertaking. All funding	
13		options shall be open for consideration, including significant reallocation	
14		of the current budgets of the Department of Defense and the	
15		Department of Energy.	
16	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Defense	
17		and the Department of Energy.	
18	SECTION 5.	This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.	
19	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.	

A Bill to Fund Air Conditioning in Developing Nations

1	BE IT ENACTED E	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:		
2	SECTION 1.	Congress shall establish an annual fund of \$5 billion for each of the next		
3		ten years to be used to support the proliferation of air conditioning in		
4		developing nations.		
5	SECTION 2.	This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Agency for International		
6		Development (USAID), which shall be specifically tasked with developing		
7		an efficient and equitable means by which developing nations may apply		
8		for and receive these funds.		
9	SECTION 3.	This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.		
10	SECTION 4.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
