## The Presidential Library Ethics Act (PLEA)

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:		
2	SECTION 1.	A sitting President is hereby prohibited from soliciting donations of any	
3		size or sort to foundations supporting their future presidential libraries,	
4		as are the Vice President and all members of the cabinet appointed by	
5		the President.	
6	SECTION 2.	Violation of this legislation shall be deemed an impeachable offense, and	
7		any illegally solicited donations shall be returned to their donor. In the	
8		case of an anonymous donor or in the event that returning the donations	
9		should prove impractical, any illegally solicited donations shall be turned	
10		over to the Smithsonian Institution.	
11	SECTION 3.	This legislation shall be overseen by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).	
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.	
13	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.	

## A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Strengthen Religious Liberties

1	RESOLVED,	That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the
2		Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and
3		purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of
4		three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its
5		submission by the Congress:
6	ARTICLE —	
7	SECTION 1.	The right to practice one's religious beliefs shall not be infringed in any
8		public environment, so long as no clear and present danger is presented
9		to others through that practice.
10	SECTION 2.	The government shall not penalize any citizen or organization from acting
11		according to their religious beliefs unless such actions constitute a clear
12		and present danger to others.
13	SECTION 3.	Religious expression by public figures and in governmental arenas shall
14		not be construed as government establishment of religion.
15	SECTION 3.	The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate
16		legislation.

## A Bill to Protect SNAP for U.S. Citizens

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:		
2	SECTION 1.	Benefits paid to documented citizens of the United States through the	
3		Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) shall no longer be	
4		halted during government shutdowns.	
5	SECTION 2.	Under no circumstances will SNAP payments be made to undocumented	
6		workers and residents during a government shutdown.	
7	SECTION 3.	This legislation shall be overseen by the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS).	
8	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage. Should the	
9		government be shut down at the time of passage, SNAP benefits shall be	
10		restored for U.S. citizens immediately.	
11	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
