

ROUND 1

A Resolution to Invoke the War Powers Act

Whereas: The United States arrest of Venezuelan President Nicholas Maduro was military force against Venezuela; and

Whereas: The United States Congress has not authorized military force against Venezuela; and

Whereas: When invoked, the War Powers Act of 1973 requires presidents to notify Congress within 48 hours of deploying U.S. forces and must end hostilities within 60 to 90 days without authorization;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

1. The War Powers Act of 1973 applies to the United States' military action in Venezuela; and
2. The War Powers Act of 1973 is hereby invoked regarding United States action in Venezuela; and
3. The President shall notify Congress within 48 hours of deploying United States forces in Venezuela; and
4. The United States must end hostilities with Venezuela within 60 days absent authorization from Congress.

1 ROUND 1

2 A Bill to Repeal Medicaid Work Requirements

3 Whereas: HR1, the “One Big Beautiful Bill” Act, established work requirements as a condition
4 of receiving Medicaid benefits; and

5 Whereas: Obtaining medical care should not be contingent on working or participating in other
6 work activities; and

7 Whereas: Administrative burdens and paperwork requirements caused by the work requirement
8 will cause many people who should be eligible for Medicaid to lose their Medicaid; and

9 Whereas: Lack of access to medical care is a public health threat because people will be unable
10 to obtain medical care for communicable diseases; and

11 Whereas: The administrative burden on states from work requirements outweigh any savings
12 from Medicaid work requirements;

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

14 All work requirement for Medicaid eligibility that are contained in HR 1, the “One Big Beautiful
15 Bill” Act, are hereby repealed.
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ROUND 2

A Bill to Preempt State Regulation of Artificial Intelligence

Whereas: The United States artificial intelligence industry is critical to future economic growth and national security; and

Whereas: States are enacting regulations of artificial intelligence; and

Whereas: These state regulations create inconsistent requirements for artificial intelligence; and

Whereas: State regulation of artificial intelligence will destroy the United States' artificial intelligence industry;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

All state laws regulating artificial intelligence are preempted by federal law and are null and void.

1 ROUND 2

2 A Bill to End the Senate Filibuster

3 Whereas: The filibuster in the United States Senate means that legislation requires 60 votes to
4 pass the Senate; and

5 Whereas: The filibuster allows a minority in the Senate to stop important legislation; and

6 Whereas: The filibuster has entangled the Senate in procedural maneuvering instead of
7 substantive debate; and

8 Whereas: The filibuster has prevented the passage of the federal budget, caused several federal
9 government shutdowns, and will cause more federal government shutdowns in the future;

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

11 The filibuster in the United States Senate is hereby eliminated.
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ROUND 3

A Bill to Establish Term Limits for United States Supreme Court Justices

Whereas: United States Supreme Court justices are appointed for life and can only be removed if they are impeached and convicted of high crimes or misdemeanors; and

Whereas: Lifetime limits for United States Supreme Court justices make them unaccountable; and

Whereas: Lifetime limits for United States Supreme Court justices allow for corruption; and

Whereas: Lifetime limits for United States Supreme Court justices can, depending on when openings occur, allow one political party to dominate the Supreme Court;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

United States Supreme Court justices are hereby limited to one term of 10 years.

1 ROUND 3

2 A Bill to Reinstate Noncitizen Eligibility for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
3 benefits

4 Whereas: Prior to the passage of HR1, the “One Big Beautiful Bill” Act, persons defined as
5 “qualified aliens” were eligible for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance (SNAP¹) benefits; and

6 Whereas: HR1, the “One Big Beautiful Bill” Act, limits eligibility for SNAP benefits to
7 noncitizens who are Lawful Permanent Residents, noncitizen nationals², citizens of the Compact
8 of Free Association states³, and Cuban and Haitian Entrants; and

9 Whereas: The groups who will no longer be eligible for SNAP benefits because of HR1 are
10 asylees, refugees, public interest parolees, individuals with deportation or removal withheld,
11 conditional entrants, victims of trafficking, battered noncitizens, certain Afghan Nationals
12 granted parole between July 31, 2021, and September 30, 2023, and certain Ukrainian Nationals
13 granted parole between February 24, 2022, and September 30, 2024; and

14 Whereas: People not lawfully in the United States have never been eligible for SNAP benefits;
15 and

16 Whereas: The HR 1 restrictions on noncitizen eligibility for SNAP will cause mass hunger by the
17 loss of subsistence food benefits for low income persons; and

18 Whereas: The noncitizens who will lose SNAP benefits because of HR 1 went through legal
19 processes to come to the United States, and many of them escaped oppression in other countries
20 to come to the United States;

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 22 1. The restrictions on noncitizen eligibility for SNAP benefits in HR1, the “One Big
23 Beautiful Bill” Act are hereby repealed.
24 2. Persons previously defined as qualified aliens are hereby eligible for SNAP benefits.
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26 ¹ SNAP is known as CalFresh in California.

27 ² Noncitizen nationals are people born in American Samoa and Swain’s Island after December 21, 1952, or residents
of the Northern Mariana Islands who choose not to become United States citizens.

28 ³ The Compact of Free Association states Micronesia, Palau, and the Marshall Islands.
