A Bill to Increase The Minimum Wage

A Bill to Defund the National Aeronautics and Space Administration

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1**. NASA will be henceforth defunded and abolished, with research reallocated to other departments.
- **SECTION 2.** NASA shall be defined as the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.
- **SECTION 3.** The Department of the Treasury shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.
 - A. NASA Earth, biological, and physical science research and funding will be relocated to the Department of the Interior.
 - B. Aeronautics research formerly carried out by NASA will be relocated to the Department of Defense. The \$966 million formerly allocated to NASA for this purpose will be allocated to the Department of Defense.
 - C. STEM engagement efforts formerly carried out by NASA will be relocated to the Department of Education. The \$144 million formerly allocated to NASA for this purpose will be allocated to the Department of Education.
 - D. The remaining \$21.799 billion formerly given to NASA will be allocated to the Department of the Treasury.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect January 1st, 2035.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement Desalination Plants in America

1	SECTION 1. The US Federal Government will hereby invest in
2	desalination plants within a 50 mile radius of at risk coastal cities.
3	SECTION 2 . Terms will be defined as such;
4	A. Desalination Plants shall be defined as industrial facilities that use
5	chemical or physical processes in order to reduce or recover salt
6	concentrations within water supplies.
7	B. Coastal cities shall be defined as cities located on the interface or
8	transition areas between land and sea, including large inland lakes wit
9	access to saltwater.
10	C. "At risk" shall be defined as cities experiencing drought an average of
11	at least one day per month per year, using data provided by the
12	Environmental Protection Agency, since 2015.
13	SECTION 3. The Department of Interior will receive 20 billion dollars to
14	be allocated to private and state entities for the creation of desalination
15	plants. The Environmental Protection Agency will oversee the disposal of
16	brine and other waste products. Additionally the EPA will receive 20 million
17	dollars to be allocated to research and development of disposal.

A Bill to Reestablish Diplomatic Relations with Cuba.

- **SECTION 2.** Eyewitness testimony is a firsthand account of an event, such as a crime, given in court by someone who saw it happen.
- **SECTION** 3. The Department of Justice (DOJ) will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.
- SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect in fiscal year 2028. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
