

A Bill to Cap the Maximum Driving Age in California

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STATE LEGISLATURE HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1. In order to reduce the number of traffic accidents caused by the elderly
3	and to improve roadway safety, the California State Legislature shall establish a
4	maximum driving age of 80 years.
5	SECTION 2. The California Department of Motor Vehicles, California Highway Patrol,
6	and municipal police departments shall jointly enforce the following provisions:
7	A. Individuals over the age of 70 shall be required to take annual vision and road
8	safety tests to maintain or renew their driver's licenses.
9	B. Individuals over the age of 80 shall be prohibited from operating motor
10	vehicles on public roads.
11	SECTION 3. Those in violation of this legislation will face the following penalties:
12	A. A fine of \$400 for the first violation. The fine shall increase by \$200 for each
13	subsequent violation, up to a maximum of \$1,400.
14	B. Fines collected shall be allocated to programs that expand elderly access to
15	public transportation, paratransit services, and community shuttle systems.
16	SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect on January 1st, 2027.
17	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Eliminate Al-Generated Songs From Music Streaming Platforms.

- **WHEREAS**, the production and promulgation of artificially-generated music takes away from authentic creators, both monetarily and creatively.
- WHEREAS, Liz Pelly, author of *Mood Machine: The Rise of Spotify and The Perfect Playlist*, concedes that: "transparency has been a major problem on streaming services for nearly a decade and that users should get a clearer understanding of what they're consuming and where it's coming from" and
- WHEREAS, Connor Green of Suffolk University finds that "In today's world, every artist depends on the digital economy. If the courts permit AI to create millions of songs that sound like real artists, musicians will certainly take a massive hit" and
- **WHEREAS**, AI Music collects millions of streams whilst infringing copyright, and now, therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED,** That the Student Congress here assembled shall eliminate AI-generated songs/artists from music streaming services, for the protection of job security and the creative process.

A Bill to Ensure Foster Care for Unaccompanied Migrant Minors

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.

The United States shall create a Federal Foster Placement Network under the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), in collaboration with the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR), for the care of unaccompanied migrant minors detained at or near the U.S. border.

SECTION 2.

This program shall:

- A. End the use of large-scale detention centers and mass shelters for unaccompanied minors within one year of implementation.
- B. Recruit, license, and train foster families to house these minors through regional and national partnerships.
- C. Prioritize placement with verified relatives or linguistically and culturally appropriate families when feasible.
- D. Provide minors with access to trauma-informed therapy, K–12 public education, and legal counsel during immigration proceedings.

SECTION 3.

Funding shall be provided by reallocating \$500 million from the Department of Homeland Security's detention facility operating budget to the Department of Health and Human Services for FY2025 pilot implementation in the states of Texas, Arizona, New Mexico, and California.

SECTION 4.

All foster placements under this bill must meet the following minimum standards: A. Completion of federal-level child welfare screenings by foster families .B. Monthly in-person visits by trained caseworkers. C. Physical and mental health evaluations within 72 hours of placement.

SECTION 5.

The Office of Refugee Resettlement shall publish quarterly public reports detailing: A. The number of minors placed in foster homes. B. Average duration of foster care placement. C. Outcomes regarding reunification, asylum, or other immigration resolution.

SECTION 6.

This legislation shall take effect by October of 2027.

SECTION 7.

All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Safe and Inclusive Community Act (S.I.C.A)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Hate and extremist groups shall not be approved for public event requests.
2	SECTION 2.	Hate and extremist groups shall be defined as any and all groups included
3		in the Southern Poverty Law "Active Hate Groups" list.
4		
5	SECTION 3.	The bill shall be overseen and enforced by city municipalities tasked with
6		approving and granting public event requests.
7		A. This bill will only apply to gatherings large enough to require
8		prerequisite permissions.
9		B. Any violations of the bill shall result in a 10% reduction of federal grant
10		funds allocated to "community events" or "community facilities".
11		
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
