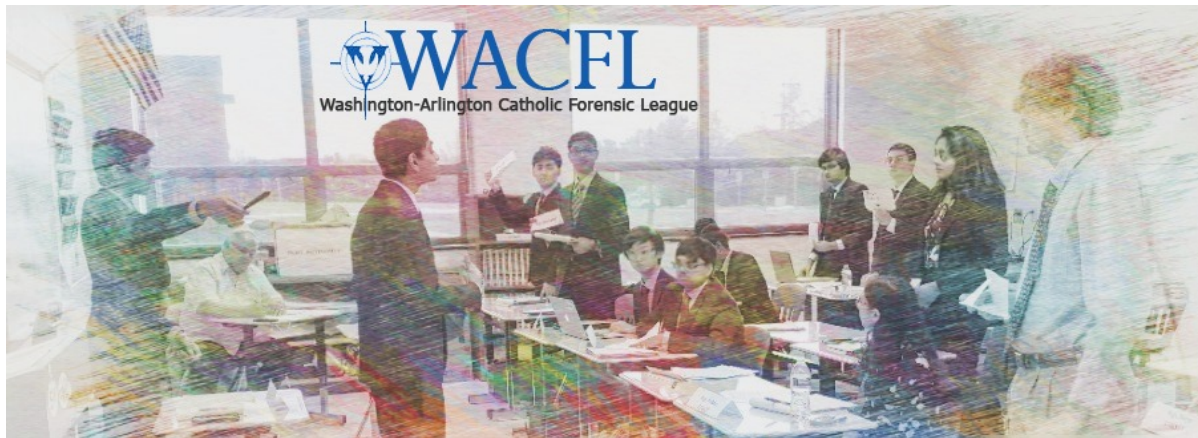

D230

A Bill to Require All Federal Immigration Employees to Collect Biometric Data from Any Individual Entering and Exiting the Country

1 BE IT ENACTED HERE BY THE CONGRESS THAT:

2 ARTICLE I: Customs and Border Protection shall be required to collect biometric data
3 from all individuals who wish to enter or exit the United States of
4 America.

5 ARTICLE II: Biometric Data – A person’s unique physical and behavioral
6 characteristics such as fingerprints, photographs, and signatures used to
7 conduct background checks to ensure national safety and security.

8 ARTICLE III: Customs and Border Protection, United States Citizenship and
9 Immigration Services, and Immigration and Customs Enforcement will
10 oversee the execution of this bill.

11 A. USCIS will oversee biometrics appointments scheduled before an
12 exit from the United States.

13 ARTICLE IV: This bill will be implemented on November 9th, 2025.

14 ARTICLE V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Improve the Availability of Vaccines

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government shall establish guidelines to require vaccines for all
2 U.S. citizens, unless there's a pre-existing medical contradiction.

3 **SECTION 2.** Medical contradiction shall be defined as a special condition which is
4 necessary for withholding a specific medical treatment or medication.

5 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Federal
6 Drug Administration (FDA), shall oversee the implementation of this
7 legislation.

8 **SECTION 4.** The Food and Drug Administration shall provide 20 million dollars in
9 funding towards this legislation.

10 **SECTION 5.** This bill shall be implemented immediately upon its passage.

11 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill # 412

A Bill to Increase Federal Oversight of National Guard Deployments

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government shall increase oversight of National Guard
2 domestic deployments to ensure accountability, transparency, and the
3 protection of civilian rights during such operations.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Increased Oversight refers to federal review of at least 75% of National
5 Guard domestic deployments, requiring DoD approval before activation and
6 post-deployment evaluations for accountability.
7 Domestic Deployment refers to any mobilization of National Guard forces
8 inside U.S. borders for non-combat purposes.
9 Civilian Rights refer to constitutional protections guaranteed to all U.S.
10 citizens, including the right to peaceful assembly and due process.
- 11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Defense (DoD) will oversee the implementation of this
12 legislation while managing all domestic deployments of the National Guard.
13 A. Governors must submit deployment requests to the DoD for review
14 within 12 hours of activation.
15 B. The DoD must publish a report within 30 days after each deployment,
16 outlining the mission, duration, and public impact.
17 C. The DoD Inspector General will investigate any reported misuse of the
18 National Guard.
- 19 **SECTION 4.** Funding for oversight operations will be allocated from the annual defense
20 budget of the DoD. Additional funding may come from reallocation of
21 unused state National Guard training funds.
- SECTION 5.** This bill shall be implemented immediately upon its passage.
- SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill # 413

A Bill to Help Create a More Selective VISA Program for International Graduates in STEM-Related Fields

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** To strengthen U.S. competitiveness by creating a selective visa program that
2 retains exceptional foreign graduates in STEM and high-need fields to
3 promote innovation and national security.

4 **SECTION 2.** High-Need "Field" is defined as any field that includes STEM, healthcare,
5 cybersecurity, defense tech, and energy, as designated by the DOL. A
6 qualifying graduate is defined as a Non-U.S. citizen earning a bachelor's,
7 master's, or doctoral degree in STEM or high-need fields from a U.S.
8 institution. A Merit-Based Visa Program is defined as a competitive
9 application system for work authorization based on merit and national
10 interest.

11 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), along with the U.S. The
12 Department of Labor (DOL) and Department of State (DOS) will oversee
13 the implementation of this legislation.

14 A. The DHS, DOL and DOS will conduct a selection process regarding
15 visa distribution.

16 B. The DHS will enforce a cap of 100,000 visas issued per year.

17 C. After five years of lawful employment and good standing as determined
18 by the DOL and DOS will have the chance to apply for expedited
19 permanent residency.

20 D. The Department of Labor shall publish annual reports on program
21 outcomes and recommend field adjustments.

SECTION 4. Funding for this legislation shall be appropriated through the DHS
immigration services budget and supplemented by ATVP application and
renewal fees.

SECTION 5. This bill shall be implemented immediately upon its passage.

SECTION 6. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Funding to the National Guard

SECTION 1: This bill will allocate an additional \$10 million in funding to the National Guard currently present in American cities, to better equip these troops to reduce crime in major United States cities.

SECTION 2: National Guard presence is defined as active deployment of National Guard troops (of any state) at the behest of the executive for law enforcement purposes.

SECTION 3: This bill shall go into effect on January 2nd, 2026.

SECTION 4: The Department of Defense will provide the funding necessary for this bill, diverting it from funds used to pay top officials and funds diverted towards American allies abroad.

SECTION 6: All laws in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared null and void.

D550: A Bill to Regulate the Deployment of the National Guard in U.S. Cities to Protect Civil Liberties

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The National Guard shall only be deployed in U.S. cities under a declared state of emergency that has been approved by both the state governor and the U.S. Secretary of Defense.

SECTION 2. A “state of emergency” shall be defined as a situation involving (a) natural disasters that exceed the response capabilities of local and state agencies, or (b) severe threats to public safety where local law enforcement is demonstrably unable to maintain order. “Deployment” shall mean the active presence of National Guard troops in civilian areas for operational purposes.

SECTION 3. The Department of Defense, in coordination with the Department of Homeland Security, shall oversee enforcement of this legislation.

- A. All deployments must be reported to Congress within seven (7) days, detailing purpose, duration, and troop count.
- B. Any unauthorized deployment will trigger a mandatory federal review and may result in the withholding of federal emergency management funds to the violating state.

SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reserve Use of the National Guard for the State Government during Domestic Issues to prevent Deployments Not Agreed to by the State

SECTION 1. To respond to the use of the National Guard against the wishes of the state, the use of the National Guard must be reserved for the state government.

SECTION 2. To deploy the National Guard, a state's governor must create a formal request, and the state senate must vote on it for a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority.

SECTION 3. This will be overseen by the State Executive and Legislative Branches, with the National Guard Bureau still managing funding and training for troops.

A. During times of foreign war, the authority of the National Guard will be transferred to the Department of Defense to use as reserve troops for the US Army and Air Force.

SECTION 4. "All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void."

Resolution #D593

A Resolution to Remove the National Guard from United States' Cities

- WHEREAS,** The United States has deployed the National Guard to several cities within the country, and
- WHEREAS,** The National Guard is defined as a reserved military force that acts for both State and Federal governments, but when used domestically, the National Guard is under the authority of the State governments in accordance with the Posse Comitatus Act and with exceptions from the Insurrection Act of 1807, and
- WHEREAS,** The Posse Comitatus Act is an act that prohibits the National Guard, when under the directory of the Federal Government, from participating in domestic law enforcement; the Insurrection Act is an act that allows for the use of the National Guard by the Federal Government in cases of suppressing insurrections, and
- WHEREAS,** The deployment of the National Guard to United States' cities by the Federal Government causes tension, oppression, feelings of militarization and violates the Posse Comitatus Act as there is no current insurrection.
- THEREFORE** Be it resolved by the Student Congress here assembled that the United States shall withdraw the National Guard from United States' cities and allow for the Civilian Police forces to handle any persisting issues.

Bill D594

A Bill to Expand and Modernize the H-1B Visa Program

SECTION I. To address labor shortages and improve the legal immigration system, the United States shall expand the annual H-1B visa cap and modernize the application process to reduce delays and uncertainty for employers and skilled workers.

SECTION II. “H-1B visa” refers to a nonimmigrant visa that allows U.S. companies to employ foreign workers in specialty occupations requiring specialized knowledge and a bachelor’s degree or higher.

SECTION III. The annual H-1B visa cap shall be increased from \$85,000 to \$150,000. The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) shall also establish an online application and lottery system designed to process all petitions within six months. The Department of Homeland Security will oversee implementation through USCIS, in coordination with the Department of Labor to ensure compliance with wage and employment standards.

SECTION IV. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Protect our Children against Diseases

1 **SECTION 1.** State educational programs that do not mandate the Measles
2 Vaccine, Smallpox Vaccine and other essential vaccines will not receive funding
3 from federal programs.

4 **SECTION 2.** “Essential Vaccine” shall be any vaccine which prevents prolonged
5 illness, disability or death from any such disease with heavy success.

6 “Federal Programs” are programs made by the central governing body of the
7 United States of America, namely the Legislative and Executive Branches.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Center for Disease Control (CDC), Federal Drug Administration
9 (FDA), and the entirety of the Department of Health (DOH) will be in charge of the
10 execution of this bill.

11 A. CDC, FDA, and DOH will coordinate this measure with each other and with state
12 educational programs.

13 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
14 void.

A Bill to Require Vaccines to Attend School

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2

3 **SECTION 1.** To improve the overall health of the United States, children must have updated
4 vaccinations to attend a public school. A vaccination verification form must be
5 signed and submitted by the beginning of every school year before the child is
6 permitted to matriculate to school in the fall. A trained medical professional will
7 administer the vaccines at the correct time and using medically approved dosages.

8 **SECTION 2.** Vaccines are required for students in grades PreK–12; these vaccines must be in
9 line with the list of required vaccines as established by the American Academy of Pediatrics’
10 Recommended Child and Adolescent Immunization Schedule.

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
12 will oversee the implementation of this program. The Centers for Medicare and
13 Medicaid Services will provide funding for vaccines for those who cannot afford
14 them.

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect upon enactment.

16 **SECTION 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

Bill #D900

A Bill to Mandate COVID Vaccines for All Government Employees

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **ARTICLE 1.** Vaccines for all unprotected COVID strains will be mandated for government employees, barring religious and medical exemptions.
3. **ARTICLE 2.** A vaccine shall be defined as two doses of medication and additional booster shots given in order to prevent a disease. An unprotected strain shall be defined as a variant illness stemming from the COVID virus for which a vaccine has not yet been mandated. Government employees shall be defined as individuals who work for a governmental agency or body, including schools and public transportation workers.
4. **ARTICLE 3.** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will be tasked with the enforcement of this bill.
5. **ARTICLE 4.** This bill will be funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
6. **ARTICLE 5.** This bill will take effect on January 22nd, 2025.
7. **ARTICLE 6.** All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reform Immigration

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **ARTICLE 1.** Undocumented immigrants currently residing in the United States shall be granted a one-time pathway to legal status based on length of residency, completion of service requirements, and eligibility.
3. **ARTICLE 2.** Service requirements” means verified court-ordered community service. “Eligibility” means applicants must demonstrate fluency in English and pass a U.S. civics test along with having no major criminal infractions.
4. **ARTICLE 3.** The Department of Homeland Security, through USCIS, shall administer this program.
5. **A.** Individuals residing for fewer than 5 years are not recipients of any amnesty and are subject to immediate deportation.
6. **B.** Individuals residing between 5 and 10 years must complete 200 hours of community service for permanent residency with an expedited path to citizenship.
7. **C.** Individuals residing for more than 10 years, or who entered the U.S. prior to age 18, shall be eligible for immediate permanent residency with an expedited path to citizenship.
8. **ARTICLE 4.** An amount of 500 million dollars will be appropriated to the funding of this bill from the budget of the DHS for implementation and enforcement.
9. **ARTICLE 5.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
10. **ARTICLE 6.** All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

Bill #D-972
A Bill to Mandate COVID-19 Vaccination for School Attendance in Virginia

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **ARTICLE I.** Documentary proof of receiving the current, most updated COVID-19
2 vaccine shall be required for attendance at a public or private school or
3 daycare within the Commonwealth of Virginia. Proof must be submitted
4 annually before the start of the next school year.

5 **ARTICLE II.** COVID-19 is the contagious disease caused by infection with the
6 coronavirus SARS-CoV 2.

7 A. Immunization for school attendance as defined by the Virginia
8 Department of Health (VDH) is being vaccinated in accordance with the
9 current harmonized vaccination schedule as recommended by the CDC.

10 B. Documentary proof as defined by Chapter 110 of the Administrative
11 Code of Virginia is an official immunization record signed by a physician,
12 nurse, or health department official.

13 **ARTICLE III.** The VDH and local school districts will oversee enforcement of this bill as
14 defined by Section § 22.1-271.2 of the Code of Virginia.

15 **ARTICLE IV.** This legislation will take effect on August 1st, 2026.

16 **ARTICLE V.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement National Guard in U.S. Metropolitan Areas with High Crime Rates

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **ARTICLE I.** This bill will dispatch the National Guard to Metropolitan areas with crime
2 rates greater than or equal to 6%.

3 **ARTICLE II.** Metropolitan areas are regions consisting of a densely populated urban area
4 with a minimum population of 50,000.

5 B. Crime rates shall be defined as the amount of crimes (property and
6 violent) on average per 100,000 people turned into a percentage.

7 **ARTICLE III.** The Department of War will oversee enforcement along with the specific
8 enforcement mechanism.

9 **ARTICLE IV.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026.

10 **ARTICLE V.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Resolution #D1050

A Resolution to Remove the National Guard Occupying US Cities

WHEREAS, deploying the National Guard into American Cities to support ICE oversteps legal boundaries set to separate military and civilian jurisdictions, raising concerns about federal overreach and constitutional integrity; and

WHEREAS, this deployment places a substantial financial burden on the country as it diverts taxpayer funds from essential community programs, public safety initiatives, and economic recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, the presence of the National Guard during peaceful protests has escalated confrontations between the military and the people, suppressing the constitutional right to assembly and expression; and

WHEREAS, the occupation of the National Guard muddles the difference between law enforcement and military intervention, eroding civil liberties and public confidence in democratic institutions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled calls for the immediate withdrawal of the National Guard from U.S. cities where they are currently deployed in a policing role; and be it

THEREFORE Be it resolved by the Student Congress here assembled that the federal government establish clear legal boundaries to prevent unauthorized or excessive domestic deployment of military forces, leaving public safety within cities to the trained civilian law enforcement agencies already present.

Bill Number D1111

A Bill to delay but require Hepatitis B vaccination for infants.

SECTION 1. The CDC must recommend Hepatitis B vaccinations once a child reaches 4 years of age. Parents or legal guardians are not required to vaccinate their children until they reach the age of four, unless a licensed physician determines the vaccine is medically necessary at an earlier age. Parents will be required to vaccinate their children after the age of four.

SECTION 2.

- A. **Hepatitis B vaccine** --- Any immunization approved by the US food and drug administration (FDA) for the prevention of Hepatitis B virus infection.
- B. **Required** --- Mandated by the federal, state, or local law as a condition for school entry, child-care enrollment, or any other youth public program.

SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) shall oversee implementation of this Act.

- A. Licensed physicians are allowed to require a Hepatitis B vaccination if they believe it is a medical necessity.
- B. All insurance companies must provide full coverage of the hepatitis B vaccination.
- C. This bill will go on effect on September 10, 2026

SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Amend the 1807 Insurrection Act to Prevent Presidential Exploitation

1 **Section 1.** Title 10, section 251 of the 1807 Insurrection Act shall be amended so that for any instance
2 the Insurrection Act is invoked for domestic deployment of the armed forces, the President
3 must notify the Speaker of the House and Senate Majority Leader within 24 hours. Continued
4 deployment beyond 7 days must be authorized by a joint resolution of Congress. In cases of
5 national emergency which require immediate action, the President may act without prior
6 approval for up to 72 hours. After that period, continued use of military forces requires
7 Congressional authorization.

8 **Section 2.** The “Speaker of the House” is the leader of the U.S. House of Representatives. The “Senate
9 Majority Leader” is the member of the Senate who leads the party with the most seats. “Title
10 10, Section 251 of the 1807 Insurrection Act” authorizes the President to use the U.S. military
11 domestically to enforce federal laws or suppress rebellion when state authorities cannot
12 maintain order. “Congressional approval” means that both the House of Representatives and
13 the Senate formally agree to a decision—usually by passing a law or joint resolution—
14 allowing the government action to proceed.

15 **Section 3.** The Executive Branch shall be responsible for carrying out this legislation, contacting
16 congress within 24 hours upon invocation of the Insurrection Act for domestic deployment.

17 **Section 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill D1210

A Bill to Expand American Research on mRNA Technology to Protect Against Current and Future Infectious and Autoimmune Disease

1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government shall increase the funding of research on mRNA
2 technology to protect against autoimmune and infectious diseases.

3 **SECTION 2.** A. “mRNA technology” shall be defined as biotechnology that uses
4 synthetic messenger RNA to stimulate or regulate immune responses within the human
5 body, to prevent or treat disease.

6 B. “Autoimmune disease” is defined as a condition where the body’s own immune
7 system attacks its cells. This includes but is not limited to type 1 diabetes, rheumatoid
8 arthritis, multiple sclerosis (MS), and inflammatory bowel disease (IBD)

9 C. “Infectious disease” shall be defined as an illness caused by pathogens, including
10 viruses, bacteria, and fungi which enter the human body and cause infection.

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the National
12 Institutes of Health (NIH) shall enforce and oversee this legislation.

13 A. The NIH will be responsible for distributing funding toward research grants and
14 partnerships with universities and private research companies.

15 B. The federal government shall allocate \$5 billion annually, beginning in fiscal year 2026,
16 and continuing for five years.

17 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Mitigate Tariffs on Goods Imported Into the US

- SECTION 1.** The federal government shall mitigate any tariffs imposed on the imports to a base of 2.5% and modify the tariff by 1-2% or as required by the specific product.

A Bill to Prohibit Deployment of the National Guard Upon the American People

- b. The President of the United States of America or the Governor of a state may deploy a specified National Guard to any state or territory only with emergency discretion from Congress.
- c. The Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of Maryland are exempt from these guidelines at the request of the District of Columbia's municipal government.

Section 2. Congressional approval of presidential deployment of National Guards or gubernatorial deployment of the National Guard to other states will require a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority in both the House of Representatives and the United States Senate.

- a. In the event of an emergency in which a national guard is imperative to the rescue of civilians or containment of an emergency, the president may call an extraordinary occasion congressional meeting to pass the necessary deployment vote to one or more states, of or not of origin.

Section 3. The United States Supreme Court is responsible for upholding such guidelines and can block any order in violation of this law.

- a. Any blocked order can be legally challenged no later than 15 days after being issued.

Section 4. This legislation, if passed, will take effect on January 1, 2026.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

- WHEREAS,** communities in Southern California and beyond have expressed fear, distrust, and reduced participation in public life due to the risk of being wrongly stopped, which has adverse effects on social cohesion, economic activity, and public health; and
- RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled overturn the *Vasquez Perdomo v. Noem* order to reinstate the lower court’s enjoined restrictions that prohibit immigration officers from making stops based on appearance, language, or ethnic attributes; and, be it

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** This legislation shall ensure U.S. military readiness by preparing military
2 installations, personnel, and operations for the impacts of climate change
3 and extreme weather events, sea-level rise, and other climate-related risks.
4 It shall reinforce military bases to help with climate modeling, predictions,
5 and assessments.
- 6 **SECTION 2.** Climate change shall be defined as “long-term shifts in temperatures and
7 weather patterns.” (EPA).
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Energy (DOE), Environmental Protection Agency (EPA),
9 and the Department of Defense (DOD) shall cooperate to oversee,
10 implement, fund, and enforce this bill.
- 11 A. The DOD will conduct a climate vulnerability assessment for all U.S.
12 military bases and installations, domestic and international.
- 13 B. The DOD will identify high-risk installations and begin upgrading
14 infrastructure for climate resilience to retrofit military facilities to meet
15 green building standards, including renewable energy and
16 climate-resilient design. New bases shall utilize solar, wind, and
17 geothermal energy when applicable.
- 18 C. The military will integrate climate resilience training into readiness
19 programs to prepare personnel for extreme weather and disaster
20 scenarios. Training will cover disaster response coordination and
21 operating in adverse environmental conditions.
- 22 D. \$5 billion will be allocated for this bill and there shall be an annual audit
23 and Congressional hearing of the expenses and functions. The budget
24 shall be readjusted when appropriate.
- 25 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
26 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Establish A Curated Carbon Tax

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Facilities that receive subsidies from the United States federal government will
3 be prohibited from emitting more than 10 metric tons of carbon in regions
4 classified as having "dangerous" air quality.

5 **SECTION 2.** Whereas, "Dangerous" is are areas air quality levels are defined as air quality
6 index (AQI) values over 100.

7 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Environmental Protection and Internal
8 Revenue Service will work in conjunction to oversee the enforcement of this
9 legislation.

10 a. Any facility found in violation of this legislation will face a carbon
11 tax of 10\$ per ton of CO₂ (Carbon Dioxide) emitted

12 b. 50% of collected tax money will invested into improving solid waste
13 management to reduce the open burning of waste and end large-scale
14 waste incineration

15 c. 50% of collected tax money will be invested into research and
16 development of renewable energy

17 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect by January of 2026.

18 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
19 null and void.

Bill D1791

A Bill to Increase Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1. A.** An additional \$20 billion is authorized to provide humanitarian aid to
2 Ukraine, supporting civilian relief, medical assistance, food and shelter
3 programs, and the reconstruction of essential infrastructure.

4 **SECTION 2. A.** “Humanitarian aid” is defined as assistance provided to meet the basic
5 needs of civilians affected by the conflict, including, but not limited to,
6 food, water, shelter, and medical care.

7 **SECTION 2. B.** “Civilian relief” shall be defined as support directed specifically towards the
8 non-combatant population in Ukraine to ensure access to essential
9 resources, protection, and basic living conditions during and after the
10 conflict.

11 **SECTION 2. C.** “Reconstruction” shall be defined as the process of rebuilding and restoring
12 critical infrastructure, including hospitals, schools, housing, transportation
13 systems, and utilities, that have been damaged or destroyed as a result of
14 the war.

15 **SECTION 2. D.** “Essential infrastructure” is defined as systems and facilities necessary for
16 the functioning of society and the economy, including energy, clean water,
17 healthcare, education, and communication networks.

18 **SECTION 3.** The US Department of State shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.

19 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
20 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Address Climate Change by Expanding Renewable Energy Infrastructure

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1** The United States will expand its renewable energy infrastructure by
2 carrying out a variety of wind and solar projects to help address the issue of
3 climate change and decrease greenhouse gas emissions.

4 **SECTION 2.** Renewable energy is defined as energy that comes from natural resources
5 such as solar, wind, geothermal, and hydroelectric power.

6 Climate change is defined as a change in global or regional climate patterns
7 and is attributed largely to the increased levels of atmospheric carbon
8 dioxide produced by the use of fossil fuels.

9 Greenhouse gas emissions are defined as gases such as methane and carbon
10 dioxide that trap heat within the Earth's atmosphere.

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Energy and the Environmental Protection Agency shall
12 oversee the implementation of this legislation.

13 A. The DOE shall monitor public and government compliance. The EPA shall
14 ensure environmental standards are met in solar and wind installation
15 projects.

16 **SECTION 4.** The funding for this legislation shall come from the Department of Energy
17 and the Environmental Protection Agency's existing budget.

18 **SECTION 5.** This bill shall be implemented immediately upon its passage.

19 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
