

A Resolution to Urge the Sale of Non-Essential Federal Land

1 **WHEREAS**, the federal government of these United States currently owns more
2 than 640 million acres of land (28% of all land in the U.S.) much of which is
3 underutilized or considered unessential to national interests; and

4 **WHEREAS**, maintaining this vast amount of federal land incurs ongoing costs
5 and prevents potential revenue that could be generated through its responsible
6 sale; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the national debt has surpassed \$37 trillion, posing a long-term threat
8 to economic stability and future generations, while the sale of non-essential
9 federal land could generate billions in revenue to offset this burden; now,
10 therefore, be it

11 **RESOLVED**, By this Congress that: the federal government should direct the
12 Department of the Interior to identify non-essential federal land for the purpose of
13 sale in a manner that prioritizes deficit reduction and economic vitalization; and, be it

14 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That appropriate protections shall remain in place to
15 safeguard ecologically sensitive areas, national parks, and indigenous lands
16 during the sale process.

A Bill to lead the world in technology

Executive Agencies:

National Artificial Intelligence Agency (NAIA) - 5 billion

- A. In this new world of quickly growing Artificial Intelligence, there needs to be checks on it. This department is tasked with the research and containment of AI, and to make sure that AI is aligned with human values — in a nutshell, tasked with making sure AI doesn't doom us all.

National Technological Initiative Agency (NTIA) - 20 billion

- A. This department will invest in and research upcoming technologies based on the ideas and advice of technological experts across the world. The purpose of this department is to increase the rate at which we as a country and as humans develop new technologies that advance the human race.

Federal Department of Sustainable Energy (FDSE) - 20 billion

- A. This department will be fully contributed to getting the United States of America closer to complete energy independence, while remaining purely on renewable sources of energy eg; Nuclear, Wind, Solar, Hydropower, etc

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

A Bill to Standardize Driver's Licenses Across the Nation

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

1. **SECTION 1:** Congress shall set a national minimum age of 17 in order to get an
2. intermediate license, and a minimum age of 18 to be eligible for an
3. unrestricted license. The minimum age to get a learner's permit shall be
4. set to 15, so that adolescents have the ability to practice driving.
5. Exceptions shall be made for minors going to college early, so that they
6. have transport, but they must prove that they can drive safely first.
7. **SECTION 2:** A learner's permit is defined as a document that grants permission to an
8. individual to learn to drive by driving with an older certified driver present.
9. An intermediate license is a document that can be obtained by one who
10. holds a learner's permit after taking a test, and it places restrictions on
11. nighttime driving and driving with passengers. An unrestricted license
12. allows the owner to drive with no restrictions and no supervisor.
13. **SECTION 3:** This change shall be overseen by the Federal Highway Administration.
14. **SECTION 4:** This legislation shall take effect on January 1st, 2026, but those who
15. already have their licenses and are under the new minimum age for the
16. respective license shall be exempted and shall not have their license
17. revoked.
18. **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

An Act to Abolish and Prohibit the Celebration of Birthdays

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS ASSEMBLED HERE THAT:

SECTION 1: *This Act will Abolish and Prohibit the Celebration of a Birthday.*

Past the Implementation Date, the Celebration of a Birthday will be barred at any Singular Date on the Gregorian Calendar, as well as at any time on the 24-Hour Time Measurement of a Standard Clock, by Any Person(s) of and/or within the United States of America.

SECTION 2: *“Birthday” is defined as the anniversary of the “Date of Birth” date as seen on a legal birth certificate document.*

“Celebration” is defined as the act of enjoying events or (special) occasions via activities and in absence of a somber tone.

“Abolish and Prohibit” is defined as being banned upon the Implementation Date of this Act.

SECTION 3: *This Act will affect the Entirety of the United States Population.*

This Act will affect the general public of the United States regardless of age, sex/gender preference, race, ethnicity, religion, legal/immigration status, or any other explanations for human diversity.

This Act will also affect any and all United States Territories.

SECTION 4: *This Act will be funded by the Department of Defence and will be enforced by both the Supreme and State Courts of the United States.*

Triple Letter Organizations (i.e. FBI, CIA) will also stand as Enforcers of this Act.

SECTION 5: *Monetary Fees, Incarceration, Death Penalty, Exile, and Adjacent Punishments will face Incompliant Individuals of this Act.*

SECTION 6: *This Act will go into effect on January 1 2026.*

SECTION 7: *All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.*

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Diego Ucan, Hood River Valley High School

A Bill to Amend 10 U.S. Code § 251 to Impose Time Restrictions on Federal Active Duty National Guard

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** 10 U.S. Code § 251 will be amended to include that The President’s
2 deployment of Title 10 Federal Active Duty National Guard troops must be
3 subject to, in every case of deployment, a 60% affirmative vote in the
4 Senate marking every seventh day since the deployment of the first troops
5 in a given operation.
- 6 **SECTION 2.** 10 U.S. Code § 251: The subsection of the U.S. Code Title 10 awarding the
7 President the power to organize the National Guard and direct it to another
8 state in a number of their choosing. Federal Active Duty National Guard
9 troops: National Guard troops under the direction of the President and the
10 funding of the Federal Government.
- 11 **SECTION 3.** The United States Senate will oversee the enforcement of this change to
12 CODE and the Senatorial hearings due to come following the deployment
13 of Federal Active Duty National Guard troops.
- 14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 19, 2025. All laws in conflict with
15 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Repeal Section 1021 of the National Defense Authorization Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** Section 1021 of the National Defense Authorization Act is repealed.
- 2 **SECTION 2.** National Defense Authorization Act: a legislative act that grants authorities
3 to the Defense Department and all of its members to execute what the
4 nation asks of the Department.
- 5 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Defense will oversee enactment through the Armed
6 Forces. Transfer of individuals detained through this section will be
7 handled by the Armed Forces.
- 8 A. People detained through Section 1021 of the National Defense
9 Authorization act will be released from indefinite detention and given a
10 trial within 6 months of release from indefinite detention.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
12 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Phonics in Oregon School Curriculum

1 **SECTION 1.** This bill will require phonics to be taught in elementary school curriculum

3 **SECTION 2.** Phonics: a method of teaching beginners to read and pronounce words by
4 learning the phonetic value of letters, letter groups, and especially syllables
5 Require: to demand as necessary or essential : have a compelling need
6 for

7 **SECTION 3.** This bill will be implemented and enforced by the Oregon Department of
8 Education and by local school district's administrations.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with this
10 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Raise Oregon's Estate Tax Exemption Threshold

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Oregon's estate tax exemption threshold will be increased from \$1 million
2 dollars to \$2 million dollars.

3 A. The marginal rate of taxation will stay the same.

4 **SECTION 2.** Estate Tax: a tax levied on the net value of the estate of a deceased person
5 before distribution to the heirs.

6 Exemption Threshold: the minimum salary or compensation level that an
7 employee or asset must meet to be classified as "exempt" from certain
8 laws.

9 **SECTION 3.** The US Department of the Treasury and the Oregon Department of
10 Revenue will oversee the implementation of the bill.

11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
12 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reverse and Prevent Intercensal Redistricting

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** Congressional redistricting shall henceforth be limited to that which occurs automatically
3 following each constitutionally-mandated decennial census. States shall be prohibited from
4 engaging in any additional redistricting outside of this process.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** Any redistricting implemented since the most recent census is hereby nullified, with any
6 affected districts reverting to their form as set as a direct result of the 2020 Census.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Justice and the Census
8 Bureau.
- 9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- 10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Equity and Authenticity in College Admissions

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** As a condition of accreditation, no institute of higher education within the United States
3 and its territories may request or consider any student’s scores on the SAT as part of its
4 admissions process.

5 **SECTION 2.** An institute of higher education is defined as a college, university, or other entity that
6 provides education after high school. The SAT refers to the standardized test owned,
7 developed, and published by the College Board and administered by Educational Testing
8 Services.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on July 1, 2026.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

An Act to Award a Congressional Gold Medal to Rudy Giuliani

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
3 shall make appropriate arrangements for the award, on behalf of Congress, of a gold medal
4 of appropriate design to Rudolph William Louis Giuliani, in recognition of his service to our
5 nation’s largest city during its darkest hour, as well as to the country as a whole during
6 multiple presidential administrations.

7 **SECTION 2.** As soon as may be arranged, this award shall be presented to Mayor Giuliani at a ceremony
8 planned for this purpose.

9 **SECTION 3.** For the purpose of the award referred to in Section 1, the Secretary of the Treasury
10 (referred to in this Act as the “Secretary”) shall strike a gold medal with suitable emblems,
11 devices, and inscriptions to be determined by the Secretary.

12 **SECTION 4.** There is authorized to be charged against the United States Mint Public Enterprise Fund
13 such amounts as may be necessary to pay for the costs of the medals struck under this Act.
14 The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in bronze of the gold medal described in
15 Section 2 under such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, at a price sufficient to
16 cover the cost thereof, including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead
17 expenses, and the cost of the gold medal. The amounts received from the sale of duplicate
18 medals shall be deposited in the United States Mint Public Enterprise Fund.

A Bill to Update Maps

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The use of the Mercator Projection shall be eliminated in maps within all agencies and
3 offices of the federal government, particularly those maps that are on display. These maps
4 shall be replaced with ones that utilize the Gall-Peters Projection or, where practicable,
5 globes.

6 **SECTION 2.** Only when necessary for navigational purposes shall the continued use of the Mercator
7 Projection be permitted.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Geological Survey.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Milk Choice in Schools

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** All public schools in the United States and its territories shall henceforth provide raw milk
3 as an option for students during breakfast and lunch.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this legislation, raw milk shall be defined as the unpasteurized milk of a
5 cow.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** Schools may determine based on demand precisely how much raw milk to provide at each
7 meal, but it must be a reliable option for children and families who desire it.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Education and the Food and
9 Drug Administration (FDA).
- 10 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
- 11 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Jumpstart Domestic Rubber Production

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall establish a fund of \$2 billion per year for each of the next five years to
3 increase domestic rubber production toward a goal of rubber independence.

4 **SECTION 2.** These funds shall be used to increase farming of guayule (*Parthenium argentatum*), Russian
5 dandelion (*Taraxacum kok-saghyz*), and any other plants that may be used to produce
6 rubber, as well as to build additional factories for the processing and refinement of rubber.
7 These funds may also be used to expand and improve any infrastructure deemed necessary
8 to this goal.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Agriculture, which shall be
10 responsible for disbursing and monitoring the use of these funds.

11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Remove the Social Security Cap

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** All payroll earnings shall henceforth be subject to the Social Security payroll tax, regardless
3 of how much those earnings total each year.

4 **SECTION 2.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Social
5 Security Administration (SSA), with the latter organization specifically tasked with
6 determining appropriate rates for those income levels that were not covered before this
7 point.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026.

9 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Kill the Shadow Docket

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Supreme Court of the United States is hereby prohibited from making motions and
3 issuing orders on the shadow docket. All motions and orders must henceforth be made
4 with the utmost transparency and respect for procedure.

5 **SECTION 2.** The shadow docket refers to those motions and orders that are made outside of ordinary
6 procedure, specifically without having reached final judgment, decision on appeal, and/or
7 oral arguments.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

9 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Request International Judicial Intervention for the Sep. 1 Caribbean Boat Attack

- 1 **WHEREAS** On September 2, 2025, President Donald Trump announced that the U.S. Navy had one day
2 prior attacked and destroyed a Venezuelan vessel in international waters, murdering all 11
3 people onboard; and
- 4 **WHEREAS** This attack happened without any clear evidence of the specious claims that the Trump
5 administration has made to justify it; and
- 6 **WHEREAS** Even if those claims were proven to be accurate, this action remains highly questionable
7 under international law and sets a dangerous precedent for how the United States and
8 other nations interact with one another, particularly given that Secretary of State Marco
9 Rubio has indicated that the United States intends to continue to undertake attacks of this
10 sort in the future; and
- 11 **WHEREAS** Actions such as these could very well boil over into military conflict if not promptly and
12 properly addressed through diplomatic means; now, therefore be it
- 13 **RESOLVED** by the Congress here assembled that the International Court of Justice (ICJ) is called upon to
14 initiate proceedings involving the United States and Venezuela to examine this incident,
15 mediate any disputes, and ensure that justice is served; and be it
- 16 **FURTHER RESOLVED** that Congress also calls upon the International Criminal Court (ICC) to investigate
17 the actions of President Trump, Secretary of Defense/War Pete Hegseth, and other
18 relevant figures to determine whether any charges of war crimes or other international
19 transgressions against these officials might be appropriate; and be it
- 20 **FURTHER RESOLVED** that Congress commits to doing everything in its power to ensure our nation’s full
21 cooperation with whatever actions these courts deem appropriate.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish the Right to Unionize

1 **RESOLVED,** That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United
2 States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
3 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from
4 the date of its submission by the Congress:

5 **ARTICLE —**

6 **SECTION 1.** An empowered and respected labor force being necessary to the prosperity and integrity of
7 a free state, the right of the people to unionize shall not be infringed.

8 **SECTION 2.** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.
