A Bill to Dismantle the CIA

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.	The Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) is hereby dissolved.
3 SECTION 2.	A CIA employee is defined as anyone who the CIA directly dictates the work
4	duties of and pays.
SECTION 3.	The Department of Homeland Security will oversee this legislation.

- A. The Department of Homeland Security will receive an extra \$20 million per year for five years during the transitional period to aid in the offboarding process and help employees transition to the private sector or other positions in the government.
- **B.** The Department of Homeland Security will form an Ethics Board that will decide which of the CIA's programs are vital to national security and will transfer responsibility of them to other, smaller intelligence agencies. All other projects will be terminated.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage and the CIA will be officially dissolved by January 1, 2030. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Seal Non-violent Federal Convictions to Promote Reintegration

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All federal nonviolent misdemeanor and felony convictions will be
2		automatically sealed from an individual's criminal record exactly one year
3		after the completion of all sentencing requirements including but not
4		limited to: fines, probation, parole, and incarceration.
5	SECTION 2.	A. A misdemeanor is defined as an offense punishable under criminal law
6		by less than 12 months in jail
7		B. A felony is defined as an offense punishable under criminal law by more
8		than 12 months in jail
9		B. A non-violent offense refers to the violation of federal law in which no
10		violent crime was committed, no weapon was involved, and no bodily harm
11		occurred.
12		C. Sealed records will be completely inaccessible to the general public,
13		including employers and landlords. These records will still be visible to local
14		law enforcement and federal government agencies by court order.
15	SECTION 3.	The Department of Justice (DOJ) and The Federal Bureau of Investigations
16		(FBI) shall oversee the implementation of this bill.
17		A. The Department of Justice (DOJ) will oversee the automatic sealing of

20		Information Center (NCIC) database, accessible only by the Federal
21		Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and other government agencies.

A Bill to Aid Nepal in Founding their New Government

2	SECTION 1.	The United States shall send \$50 million to Nepal for rebuilding the Singha

A Bill to Condition U.S. Trade with South American Nations on Amazon Deforestation Reduction

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The Amazon spans nine South American nations and is vital to global
2		biodiversity and climate stability. As deforestation rises due to illegal
3		logging, mining, and agriculture, the United States shall condition trade
4		benefits with countries containing sizable Amazon rainforest territory on
5		measurable annual reductions in forest loss.
6	SECTION 2.	A. "Trade benefits" refer to tariff reductions, preferential trade
7		agreements, and import privileges granted by the United States.
8		B. "Sizable Amazon rainforest territory" refers to the national boundaries of
9		Brazil, Peru, Colombia, and Bolivia, which together contain the majority of
10		the Amazon's land area.
11		C. "Measurable reductions" shall mean an annual decrease in deforestation
12		of at least 10%, as verified by satellite data from Global Forest Watch,
13		continuing each year until total deforestation falls to 20% of the 2024
14		baseline rate.
15	SECTION 3.	The Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR), in
16		coordination with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), shall
17		monitor deforestation data and determine eligibility for trade benefits.
18		A. Any country that fails to meet the deforestation reduction benchmark
19		for two consecutive years shall have its U.S. trade benefits suspended.
20		B. Suspended benefits may be reinstated after one full year of verified
21		improvement in deforestation rates.
22	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
23		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
