## A Bill to Ban Gain-a-Function Bioweapons Research

1	SECTION 1.	All genetic modification of bioweapons shall be hereby banned, regardless
2		of research motive.
3	SECTION 2.	Bioweapons shall be defined as any virus, bacteria, or other microorganism
4		used as a weapon or designed to be implemented as a weapon.
5		Genetic modification of a bioweapon shall be defined as the selective
6		breeding or direct gene editing of a bioweapon in order to change the
7		bioweapon's behavior.
8	SECTION 3.	The Center for Disease Control will oversee the implementation and
9		enforcement of this bill.
10		A. All facilities researching bioweapons shall cease all research which
11		involves genetic modification of a bioweapon.
12		B. Funds used for said genetic modification research shall be reallocated
13		to other programs within the facilities.
14		C. The CDC will destroy its copy of the variola virus along with any strains
15		of variola that the center may have created.
16	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with
17		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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# A Bill to Redirect Surplus U.S. Food Waste to Combat Global Hunger

1	SECTION 1.	The United States shall implement a program to redirect surplus food
2		waste from farms, manufacturers, and retailers to other nations who are
3		experiencing severe food insecurity.
4	SECTION 2.	Surplus food waste shall be defined as excess, safe-to-consume food which
5		is discarded due to oversupply, cosmetic imperfections, or nearing
6		expiration but still meeting USDA food safety standards.
7	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) shall oversee the processing,
8		collection, and distribution of surplus food
9		A. Incentives include a 30% federal tax credit based on the food;s fair
10		market value. In addition, food donors receive liability protections if the
11		food causes harm.
12		B. A logistics framework shall be established in coordination with
13		international aid organizations to facilitate efficient delivery to receipt
14		nations.
15	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2027. All laws in conflict with
16		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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### A Bill to Shut Down ICE

1	SECTION 1.	All Illegal deportations and searches committed by ICE will be shut down
2		and all ICE agents who have committed unlawful activities will be
3		imprisoned. If workers of ICE continue to work and continue to deport then
4		they will be federal criminals and be charged with felonies.
5	SECTION 2.	Illegal deportations and searches are defined as unlawful ways to deport or
6		subject someone to deportation. Unlawful activities is defined as
7		committing any crimes or activities illegal to any citizen of The United
8		States.
9	SECTION 3.	The Department Of Homeland Security (DHS) will oversee these
10		enactments.
11		A. All parts of ICE within the U.S. will be subject to be disbanded and
12		removed from the DHS and will NOT be rebuilt
13		B. The DHS will be fully responsible for removing all parts of ICE and will
14		be responsible for arresting the unlawful ICE agents.
15	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 3rd, 2026 All laws in conflict with
16		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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### A Resolution to Withdraw the United States from NATO

1	WHEREAS,	The United States currently appropriates billions of dollars to the North
2		Atlantic Treaty Organization, and
3	WHEREAS,	NATO has been woefully ineffective at deterring aggression from foreign
4		adversaries such as Russia, and
5	WHEREAS,	The United States would greatly benefit from a security organization
6		organized under stronger principles, therefore, be it
7	RESOLVED,	That under section 1250A of the 2024 National Defense Authorization
8		Act, the United States will leave the North Atlantic Treaty Organization $\nu$
9		the consent of this Congress.

## A Bill to Implement Juvenile Justice Reform

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All Prisons, Detention Centers, and Jails will change the way they handle
2		minors in their systems, by shifting from punishment to rehabilitation. This
3		will be through limiting out-of-home placement, adolescent development
4		science, community based support, and keeping minors out of the adult
5		criminal justice system.
6	SECTION 2.	Rehabilitation will be defined as reintegrating minors into society.
7		Punishment will be defined as having minors serve traditional time in
8		Prison, Detention Centers, and Jails. Adolescent development science will
9		be defined as the science of psychological, social, emotional, cognitive, and
10		biological changes that happen during the period of adolescence.
11	SECTION 3.	The Bureau of Prisons(BOP) will oversee the enforcement and the
12		implementation of the bill.
13		A. All Prisons, Detention Centers, and Jails Nation-wide will implement
14		Juvenile Justice Reform Nation-wide.
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16	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
17		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Phase Out Oil Drilling

1	SECTION 1.	The United States will hereby begin phasing out oil drilling operations in
2		order to facilitate a green transition.
3	SECTION 2.	Application for Permit to Drill (APD): A permit overseen by the Bureau of
4		Land Management which prevents firms from drilling without government
5		approval.
6		APD Maximum: The maximum amount of APDs that the BLM is permitted
7		to issue in a given financial year.
8		GHG Protocol: An internationally recognized standard for quantifying the
9		carbon footprint of firms.
10	SECTION 3.	The Bureau of Land Management will be responsible for implementation.
11		A. The BLM will no longer offer extensions on preexisting APDs. Any
12		company seeking an extension on their APD must apply for a new
13		permit.
14		B. The APD maximum will be set to 6,000 in FY 2027. In every subsequent
15		year, the APD maximum shall decrease by 100, until the APD maximum
16		reaches 1,000, at which point the APD maximum will remain constant.
17		C. Firms will be required to submit their GHG protocol with their APD;
18		based on this metric, firms with lower GHG emissions will be prioritized
19		by the BLM for APD grants.
20		a. Any company found to be falsifying GHG protocols will be
21		permanently denied APDs.
22	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on October 1st, 2027. All laws in conflict
23		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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
