A Bill to Provide Oversight to the Federal Election Process

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2 **SECTION 1.** All elections for federal offices shall be administered by a Committee for
3 Federal Elections. This Committee, under the oversight of the
4 Department of Justice, shall standardize procedures for all elections of
5 federal officials across the country.
6 **SECTION 2.** The Committee shall be responsible for the following:
7 A. Creating standards for and verifying voter eligibility for federal
8 elections
9 B. Identifying polling locations
10 C. Hiring and training poll workers
11 D. Procuring and testing technology for electronic balloting
12 E. Collecting, verifying, and ratifying election results.
13 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice will oversee the creation of the Committee for
14 Federal Elections. The chair of the Committee shall be appointed by the
15 president with the advice and consent of the Senate.
16 **SECTION 4.** The committee shall be in place by March 2026 to oversee the November
17 2026 elections.
18 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Student Loan Relief

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** No federally funded student loan shall have a repayment schedule set until
3 the recipient of said loan has earned a minimum of \$50,000 in a calendar
4 year.

5 **SECTION 2.** After verification of income, the loan repayment shall begin in the
6 following calendar year.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Internal Revenue Service shall verify income through federal tax
8 reporting. They shall report to the Department of Education when a loan
9 recipient has achieved the necessary threshold.

10 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect starting on January 1, 2026

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Stop Patents on Genetically Modified Food

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** No new patents shall be issued on livestock or agriculture which contains
3 genetic modifications shall be issued to any for-profit corporation. All
4 current patents for genetically modified agriculture or livestock will expire
5 on January 1, 2026

6 **SECTION 2.** Genetic modifications include both artificial introduction of genetic
7 materials in a laboratory, or selective breeding for such items as pesticide
8 resistance, high crop yield, bacterial resistance, increased muscle mass, or
9 improved taste.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration
11 will identify which patents fall under section one of this act. They will
12 communicate which patents are invalid to the United States Patent Office
13 for further action.

14 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect upon passage.

15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Encourage Supportive Care for the Mentally Ill

1 **WHEREAS, Supportive Care is a method of treating mental illness which provides housing and**
2 **support services in an outpatient setting; and**

3 **WHEREAS, this type of care is often less expensive than traditional inpatient treatment in**
4 **hospital settings; and**

5 **WHEREAS**, for many people, Supportive Care provides them with a measure of dignity which is
6 crucial for their mental well-being; and

7 **WHEREAS, most of the same treatments and therapies done in inpatient centers can be provided**
8 **in this environment; and**

9 **WHEREAS, current Supportive Care centers in places such as New York City have shown**
10 **promising results; and**

11 **WHEREAS**, many abandoned or underutilized apartment complexes, which contribute to urban
12 blight, can be converted to Supportive Care centers; now, therefore, be it

13 **RESOLVED,** By the Congress here assembled that states and local communities set up
14 subsidized housing for the supportive care of mentally ill individuals

A Bill to Track Taser Incidents within Local Policing

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All local law enforcement agencies (LEA) shall, within 24 hours of the
3 incident, report any occurrence in which a taser, shock stick, or other
4 electric deterrent is utilized which results in the serious injury or death of
5 an individual. Such reports will include written statements, images, video,
6 and/or audio of the incident.

7 **SECTION 2.** Electrical deterrents use electricity to stun or immobilize individuals.
8 Serious injury shall include any incident where an individual requires
9 medical attention lasting more than 24 hours, requires hospitalization, or
10 results in a permanently disabling condition.

11 **SECTION 3.** Reports of such incidents shall be turned over to the Civil Rights Division
12 of the Department of Justice for review. Failure to turn over reports shall
13 be considered a possible civil rights violation and may lead to an
14 investigation of LEA policies and procedures.

15 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect immediately upon passage.

16 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Require Presidential Income Tax Disclosure

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Section 304 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 is amended to
3 include the following: Within fifteen days of officially receiving the
4 nomination for the office of president or vice-president of a major party,
5 candidates shall be required to publically release their federal income tax
6 returns for the previous three years in which they filed. Upon failure to do
7 so, the Federal Elections Commission shall subpoena such information
8 from the Internal Revenue Service, and publish it themselves, with a
9 statement attached that the candidate chose not to make this information
10 public on their own.

11 **SECTION 2.** A major party is one which received any electoral votes in the previous
12 presidential election, or received at least 25% of the popular vote in at
13 least ten states.

14 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Elections Commission will oversee implementation of this
15 legislation.

16 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect starting in June of: 2026

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Wave (A) Legislation 7

A Bill to Mandate Plans for Water Rationing

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Every state shall create and submit a plan detailing mandatory water
3 rationing in the event of severe drought.

4 **SECTION 2.** The plan shall include a description of what conditions will cause the plan
5 to go into effect, the mechanism by which the state will enforce
6 mandatory rationing, and the percentage of water which the state
7 believes it will save.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of the Interior will oversee implementation of these
9 plans.

10 A. States not in compliance shall have their federal highway funds
11 suspended, as overseen by the Department of Transportation.

12 **SECTION 4.** After passage, states shall have one calendar year in which to submit
13 their plan.

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Wave (A) Legislation 8

A Resolution to Reform Teacher Evaluations

- 1 **WHEREAS**, current "Race to the Top" grant monies are contingent on states using
2 student achievement in teacher evaluations ; and
3 **WHEREAS**, many states only use a small fraction of student achievement in their teacher
4 evaluation systems; and
5 **WHEREAS**, observation based evaluations are subjective and often demonstrate
6 favoritism; now, therefore, be It
7 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that states should make teacher
8 evaluations based solely or mostly on student achievement measures.

Wave (A) Legislation 9

A Bill to Provide Guidelines for Concussion Prevention in Youth Sports

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Department of Health and Human Services will establish guidelines for
3 diagnosis and treatment of concussions in elementary, secondary, and post-
4 secondary students, including timelines for returning to athletic competition
5 after traumatic brain injury.

6 **SECTION 2.** A committee, including experts in brain injuries, will assist the Secretary of HHS
7 in establishing these guidelines.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Health and Human Services will provide grants to states
9 which adopt these recommendations.

10 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on January 1, 2026

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
