A Bill to Ban the Payment of College Athletes

A Bill to Create a National US History Education Standard BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:

- **SECTION 1:** A National US education standard will be created, consisting of textbooks, tests, and materials for the classroom.
- **SECTION 2:** Materials will be defined as anything determined necessary to teach the curriculum created.
- **SECTION 3:** The Department of Education will oversee the enforcement of this bill through incentive funds for adoption of the new materials, as well as creation of the new materials.
- **SECTION 4:** This bill will go effect by the 30TH of July 2026
