

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: The federal minimum wage for tipped workers will be raised, gradually, over a period of five years. The minimum wage for these workers will increase from \$2.13 to \$7.25, the current minimum wage for nontipped workers.

Article II: Tipped workers are defined as primarily service workers who make most of their income from tips and are currently being paid below federal minimum wage for nontipped workers (\$7.25).

Article III: This legislation will be implemented gradually and shall be completed in 2030.

Article IV: This legislation will be carried out through the Wage and Hour Division within the Department of Labour.

1. Employers who do not follow this legislation will be subject to a fine not less than \$10,000 per affected worker.

Article V: All other laws in conflict with this legislation shall hereby be declared null and void.

A BILL TO TERMINATE AI ADVANCEMENTS TO
KEEP AMERICA IN INDEPENDENCY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: All grants towards the advancements of Artificial Intelligence moving forward to fix current technologies should be put at halt.

A BILL TO BAN ANIMAL TESTING FOR COSMETICS NATIONWIDE

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: No animal shall be used in the testing of cosmetic products.

3 Article II: "Cosmetic Products" refers to products or substances meant for the
4 external body, like skin, hair, and teeth. "Testing" refers to the scientific
5 use of non-human animals in experiments and research to assess the safety
6 and effectiveness of products

7 Article III: This bill will take effect as of January 1, 2026.

8 Article IV: The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Health
9 and Human Services, through the National Institutes of Health, will
10 oversee this bill, ensuring that all companies responsible for animal testing
11 stop. The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of
12 Health and Human Services, through the National Institutes of Health, will
13 advise companies on the funds being used for the animals being tested on
14 new computer software that can replace the use of animals.

15 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null
16 and void.

A Bill to Ban the Consumption of Energy Drinks by Minors

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted to purchase or consume energy drinks and they need a drivers ID or a state ID to purchase.

Article II: For the purposes of this bill, "energy drink" shall be defined as any beverage containing more than 80 milligrams of caffeine per 8 fluid ounces, with or without additional stimulants such as taurine, guarana, or ginseng. This does not include soda, coffee, or tea.

Article III: This bill shall take effect on March 1 2026.

Article IV: The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) shall oversee enforcement of this bill, in coordination with state health departments. Retailers found selling energy drinks to minors will face fines of up to \$500 per offense.

Article V: All laws in conflict with this policy shall be hereby declared null and void.
