### A Bill to Remove Consumerism From Christmas

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

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## A Bill to Mandate the Deadline For Everyone's Houses To Be Decorated Two Weeks Before Christmas Eve

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Everyone must have Christmas decorations up at least 2 weeks before
2		Christmas Eve if they plan to celebrate the holiday.
3	SECTION 2.	The minimum Christmas decorations allowed to qualify are a visible
4		Christmas tree, Christmas lights, and a wreath on the front door.
5	SECTION 3.	Law enforcement and HOA will be in charge of overseeing implementation.
6	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on November 14, 2025. All laws in conflict
7		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### A Bill to Make All Little Pigs Houses out of Brick to Prevent Big Bad Wolf Attacks

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	This bill shall fund the construction of little pigs' houses to be built out of
2		brick in order to prevent big bad wolves from blowing down their houses
3		and attacking them.
4	SECTION 2.	The Department of Animal Safety and Housing (DASH) shall oversee the
5		enforcement of this bill.
6		A. DASH shall inspect all pig residences to ensure they meet brick
7		construction standards and issue a "Wolf-Proof Certification" once
8		approved.
9		B. Violations such as the use of straws or sticks for any little pig's home,
10		will ultimately result in a mandatory rebuilding process and fines up to
11		50 acorns.
12	SECTION 3.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Prevent Discrimination Among Reindeer.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	No reindeer shall discriminate against any other reindeer on the basis of
2		distinct physical traits, especially traits that may endow that specific
3		reindeer with abilities that are seen as either a liability to the herd or a
4		special advantage for one reindeer over another.
5	SECTION 2.	The following definitions will apply:
6		A. Discrimination: any treatment that singles out one reindeer as
7		different and worthy of poor treatment or bullying based solely on
8		a physical trait.
9		B. Liability: a situation in which the herd may believe that a physical train
10		of one reindeer disadvantages the herd as a whole in some way. The
11		belief may or may not be based in fact.
12		C. Special advantage: a situation in which the herd may believe that a
13		physical trait of one reindeer advantages the herd as a whole in some
14		way. The belief may or may not be true.
15	SECTION 3.	The North Pole Agency for Equitable Treatment of Animals shall oversee
16		the enforcement of this law.
17		A. Reindeer found to be in continued violation after two verbal warnings
18		will be required to participate in mandated group therapy.
19		B. If group therapy fails to resolve the conflict, three months of Carolling
20		will be required as a last ditch effort to rehabilitate the offending
21		reindeer.
22	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on March 1, 2026 to allow for full
23		implementation before the next holiday season.
24	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## The Caffeine Rights Act (CRA)— Coffee Refills Must Be Free for Anyone Awake Before 8 a.m. by Government Decree.

1	SECTION 1.	Drip coffee purchased by a demonstrably conscious customer, and
2		delivered to that customer before 8 AM, will endow that customer with
3		unlimited free refills for the rest of the morning. Refills will not be
4		extended to customers that do not pick up their coffee in person before 8
5		AM, nor shall this apply to coffee beverages that are not drip coffee, such
6		as lattes, mochas, cappuccinos, etc.
7	SECTION 2.	Drip coffee is any coffee beverage that consists primarily of coffee,
8		including syrups, but excluding more than an inch of a milk or milk
9		substitute, including foam.
10	SECTION 3.	The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau will supervise and enforce this
11		amendment.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2026.
13	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Subsidize Blood for All Vampires

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	A subsidy to offset the cost of blood will be provided to all vampires on a
2		monthly basis to prevent the dehumanizing situation of vampires needing
3		to obtain blood from animals or be driven to an assault on a citizen.
4	SECTION 2.	Blood may include any form of blood product that is stored in a sanitary
5		condition and obtained through legal means, excluding coercion.
6	SECTION 3.	The Department of Health and Human Services will oversee the distribution
7		of the subsidy and oversee the safe and controlled distribution of blood.
8	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on October 31st, 2026.
9	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
