A BILL TO TAX CARRIED INTEREST AS INCOME

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Carried interest will be taxed at the ordinary income tax rate instead of the capital gains tax rate.

SECTION 2. Carried interest will henceforth be taxed at the same rates as income in terms of percent per bracket.

SECTION 3. This bill will be reinforced by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), as is standard for all alterations to the tax code.

SECTION 3. This law will go into effect for the next tax year.

SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Regulate Sanctuary Cities

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All sanctuary cities not in cooperation with federal immigration authorities are hereby striped of federal funding.

SECTION 2. "Sanctuary city" is hereby defined as a city within the United States with policies designed to lessen the prosecution of unauthorized immigrants.

SECTION 3. U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, in conjunction with the Justice Department, will oversee the implementation of this legislation.

A. The Justice Department stands to withdraw grant funding from cities that do not comply with federal law.

B.

SECTION 4. This law will go into effect January 1, 2017.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Establish Regulations for Self-Driving Automobiles

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- SECTION 1.** Self-driving automobiles will not be allowed to drive on public roads;
- SECTION 2.** Self-driving is defined as an automobile that is not operated by a human, rather a central processing unit or other automatic operation system;
- SECTION 3.** This passage of this legislation will be overseen by the National Highway and Traffic Safety Administration under the supervision of the Department of Transportation
- A. \$1 billion will be allocated from the defense budget to fund NHTSA enforcement of this law
 - B. The NHTSA will have the power to determine whether an automobile should be considered "self-driving"
- SECTION 4.** This law will be implemented in FY 2016 upon passage;
- SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
