

# A Bill to Halt Expansion of United States ICBMs

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The US Federal Government shall halt any expansion or replacement of  
3 Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles (ICBMs).

4 **SECTION 2.** An ICBM is defined as any land-based missile that uses projectile motion  
5 to deliver warheads on a target with a range of more than 3,500 miles.

6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Defense, Department of Homeland Security, and  
7 Department of Energy shall be responsible for the enforcement of this  
8 bill.

9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will be implemented immediately upon passage. All laws  
10 in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Support Venezuelan Migrants

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Government shall allocate \$500 million to the Peruvian  
3 government to supplement their efforts to support Venezuelan migrants  
4 within Peru's borders.

5 **SECTION 2.** The Department of State will be responsible for distributing aid to the  
6 Republic of Peru. Aid will be distributed in the following allocations:

7 A. \$250 million will be earmarked for building infrastructure related  
8 to resettlement, including housing and transportation infrastructure.

9 B. \$150 million will be earmarked for training and resources to the  
10 National Police of Peru to combat Tren de Aragua.

11 C. \$100 million will be allocated for direct payments to refugee  
12 support organizations operating in Peru.

13 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State, in conjunction with the Department of  
14 Government Efficiency, will deploy a monitoring and evaluation  
15 framework to determine the efficacy of the aid. The framework should  
16 include spot checks and financial auditing to ensure that aid is being used  
17 to its maximum efficiency. Congress may terminate aid early if reports  
18 indicate that it is being used for illegitimate purposes.

19 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in  
20 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Provide Paid Parental Leave

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All United States based public and private employers shall be required to  
3 provide 35 weeks of paid parental leave to all parents with a newborn.

4 **SECTION 2.** A. Parental leave shall be defined as an excused absence from work for  
5 the purpose of meeting basic infant needs, parental health needs, and  
6 key bonding milestones.

7 B. Paid shall be defined as providing the parent with 100% of their typical  
8 wages or salary.

9 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Labor, United States Office of Personnel  
10 Management, and the Employee Benefits Security Administration will be  
11 tasked with implementing and enforcing this legislation:

12 A. If employers fail to comply, the minimum fine will be \$50,000 per  
13 infraction and will be given to the Employee Benefits Security  
14 Administration.

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the start of the fiscal year 2027. All  
16 laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill Imposing Fees on Remittance Transfers to Fund Immigration Reform

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A fee equal to 10 percent of the United States dollar amount shall  
3 be imposed on the sender of all remittance transfers.

4 **SECTION 2.** “Remittance transfer” shall be defined as any electronic transfer  
5 of funds from a sender to a designated recipient by a remittance  
6 transfer provider.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Treasury, in conjunction with the Consumer  
8 Financial Protection Bureau and remittance transfer providers,  
9 shall develop and make available a system for remittance transfer  
10 providers to submit the remittance transfer fees collected in  
11 accordance with section 3344(b) of title 31, United States Code.  
12 The funds collected shall be allocated to the annual budget of the  
13 Department of Homeland Security to fund immigration reform,  
14 which includes but is not limited to border security and addressing  
15 court backlog.

16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with  
17 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Recognize the Republic of Somaliland as an Independent Nation

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The US shall officially recognize the Republic of Somaliland as an  
3 independent nation.

4 A. The officially recognized territory will span from its current border  
5 with Djibouti to the west; from its current border with Ethiopia to  
6 the south; from the coast of the Gulf of Aden to the north, and  
7 from the former border of British Somaliland to the east.

8 B. The US will work with the government of Somaliland to open  
9 embassies in both Hargeisa and Washington, D.C.

10 C. The US will recommend that our allies, the United Nations, and  
11 the greater international community to extend the same  
12 recognition to Somaliland.

13 **SECTION 2.** The official recognition of Somaliland enables activities including, but not  
14 limited to, establishing diplomatic, economic, and military relations.

15 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State will oversee the implementation of this  
16 legislation.

17 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect immediately upon passage. All laws in  
18 conflict are hereby declared null and void.

# The Clean Energy Investment Act

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The US shall take the following steps to hasten the transition to nuclear  
3 energy:

4 A. The United States shall equally appropriate \$100 billion over the  
5 next ten fiscal years to the Department of Energy (DOE) for the  
6 expansion of nuclear energy infrastructure.

7 B. These funds (the “Nuclear Energy Expansion Fund”) shall be  
8 prioritized for the construction of new reactors, the  
9 modernization of existing facilities, and the research and  
10 development of Small Modular Reactors (SMRs).

11 C. An additional excise tax of 15% shall be levied on all domestic  
12 extraction and production of coal, oil, and natural gas.

13 D. All existing federal subsidies for fossil fuel exploration and  
14 production are hereby terminated.

15 E. All revenue generated from this tax shall be deposited into the  
16 Nuclear Energy Expansion Fund established in SECTION 1A.

17 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Energy shall oversee the distribution of grants and  
18 infrastructure project selection. The Internal Revenue Service shall be  
19 responsible for the collection and enforcement of the new excise taxes.

20 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with  
21 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
