

**A RESOLUTION TO ENCOURAGE GOVERNORS TO DEPLOY THE NATIONAL GUARD**

1 **WHEREAS**, there is tremendous tension across the United States in urban centers large  
2 and small; and

3 **WHEREAS**, recent interactions between federal agents and citizens of the United States  
4 have resulted in casualties; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the federal government clashes with state governments over control and  
6 authority of the National Guard; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the New Hampshire House passed a bill to limit control of the federal  
8 government over the National Guard; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Governor Tim Walz has authorized deployment of the National Guard to  
10 Minnesota; therefore, be it

11 **RESOLVED** that the Student Congress here assembled reminds all state governors that  
12 the National Guard stands ready to be deployed to support public safety in  
13 cities nationwide.

**A BILL TO PREVENT UNNECESSARY DEPLOYMENTS TO PREVENT MISUSE OF THE  
NATIONAL GUARD**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** In the case that the President or Acting President of the United States of  
3 America were to deploy the National Guard for over thirty days in a year,  
4 the President or Acting President would have to provide a written rationale  
5 to Congress for the extended time of the deployment. If Congress does not  
6 approve, the National Guard would be withdrawn.

7 **SECTION 2.** The Acting President refers to a person who assumes the powers and  
8 duties of the Presidential office when the President is unable to do so.

9 **SECTION 3.** Implementation of this bill shall begin on January 1, 2027.

10 **SECTION 4.** The government agency that will oversee the enforcement of the bill shall  
11 be the Department of Defense by ordering all National Guard units to  
12 stand down and withdraw.

13 **SECTION 5.** All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared  
14 null and void.

**A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT WORLDWIDE SANCTIONS AGAINST NORTH KOREA**

1 **WHEREAS**, North Korea has resumed missile testing and calls for greater missile  
2 production as a “war deterrent” as South Korea engages in diplomacy with  
3 China and Japan; and

4 **WHEREAS**, North Korea has accused South Korea of surveillance using drone  
5 technology; and

6 **WHEREAS**, North Korea hackers are using QR codes to engage in malicious phishing  
7 schemes; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Kim Jong Un has pledged “unconditional” support of Russian President  
9 Putin; and

10 **WHEREAS**, North Korea stole billions of dollars in crypto in 2025; therefore, be it

11 **RESOLVED** that the Student Congress here assembled urges all nations to support  
12 economic sanctions against North Korea.

**A RESOLUTION TO ENGAGE SOUTH KOREAN INNOVATION IN CRYPTOCURRENCY**

1 **WHEREAS**, South Korea is recognized as an early adopter and innovator in crypto; and

2 **WHEREAS**, South Korea created secure systems to verify the identification of crypto  
3 traders many years ago and continues to establish best practices for crypto  
4 management; and

5 **WHEREAS**, South Korea is poised to be one of the top digital markets in the world,  
6 potentially investing as much as 25 percent of its budget in crypto by  
7 2030; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the United States government looks to make strong investments in crypto  
9 in 2026 and beyond; and

10 **WHEREAS**, South Korea is about to launch its spot crypto Exchange-Traded Funds  
11 (ETF's) in 2026; therefore, be it

12 **RESOLVED** that the Student Congress here assembled wants to engage with South  
13 Korea in adopting its cryptocurrency standards for use in the United  
14 States.

## **A BILL TO ELIMINATE TARIFFS ON THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Congress, with ultimate authority over the  
3 establishment of tariffs, orders the elimination of all tariffs on the  
4 Republic of Korea.

5 **SECTION 2.** Tariffs are defined as a tax or duty imposed by the federal government on  
6 goods imported from another country.

7 **SECTION 3.** The bill goes into effect immediately upon passage.

8 **SECTION 4.** The government agencies responsible for implementation and enforcement  
9 are the Office of Tariff Affairs & Trade Agreements as well as Customs  
10 and Border Protection.

11 **SECTION 5.** All other laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and  
12 void.
