

# A Bill to Implement a Universal Basic Income to Fulfill the Basic Needs of all Americans

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Financial support provided by the government in the form of standard,  
2 recurring payments will hereby be distributed monthly.

3 **SECTION 2.** Universal Basic Income (UBI) is a government program providing regular,  
4 unconditional cash payments to all citizens, regardless of income or work status, to ensure  
5 basic needs are met, reduce poverty, and offer economic security.

6 **SECTION 3.** Implementation and enforcement of this bill will be overseen by the  
7 Treasury Department (via IRS).

8 A. Every household (legal documented residence) will receive \$1,000 monthly, which  
9 is distributed amongst any related child under the age of 18 and any other adult  
0 also currently residing there.

1 A. The Treasury Department shall be given 3 trillion USD annually.

2 A. The Treasury Department shall form a sub-committee that is dedicated to ensuring  
3 there will be no misappropriations of funds or fraud.

4 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of FY 2028. All laws in  
5 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Nationally Increase Mental Health Funding in High Schools

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1           **SECTION 1.** An annual allocation of \$13,000,000,000 shall be designated  
2           for mental health funding in high schools across the United States. This  
3           funding will be distributed among approximately 26,727 public and private  
4           high schools, ensuring that each student receives an average of \$750 per  
5           year for mental health resources.

6           **SECTION 2.** Mental health funding shall be defined as financial resources  
7           allocated specifically for the employment of mental health professionals  
8           such as psychologists, the provision of counselling services, and the  
9           implementation of technology or programs designed to identify students  
10          with mental health challenges within a school environment. This funding  
11          shall not be utilized for religious studies or any kind of unrelated  
12          educational activity.

13          **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education and the Department of Health  
14          and Human Services oversee the implementation of adopted regulations to  
15          carry out this legislation.

16          A. The Department of Education shall manage grants distributed to  
17          schools, providing appropriate amounts per school, and conducting  
18          audits to ensure proper use.

19          B. The Department of Health and Human Services shall receive data  
20          collected by the Department of Education. This data will inform the  
21          development of recommendations and support the development of a  
22          mental health curriculum.

23          C. Federal funding will be contingent upon compliance; states that do not  
24          meet the established mental health budget will receive reduced federal  
25          funding, which in turn will affect funding available for high schools.

26          D. Recipients will be required to collect data regarding student access to  
27          mental health services and to submit annual reports detailing how funds  
28          were allocated, as well as changes in student attendance, academic  
29          performance, and incidents of violence.

30          **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on December 1, 2026. All  
31          laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Re-establish The United States Agency for International Development

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1                    **SECTION 1.**    Funding to The United States Agency for International
- 2                    Development (USAID) be restored.
- 3                    **SECTION 2.**    USAID consisted of in-country field missions in order to
- 4                    manage U.S. government programs in low income countries for disaster
- 5                    relief; poverty relief; technical cooperation on global issues, including the
- 6                    environment; U.S. bilateral interests; socioeconomic development; and
- 7                    healthcare. Funding for USAID was suspended in July 2025 through
- 8                    Executive Order 14169.
- 9                    **SECTION 3.**    USAID will be restored as an agency within the U.S.
- 10                   Department of State at its FY 2024 level of funding of \$35.4 billion.
- 11                   A. Funding for USAID will come from the budget of the U.S. Department of
- 12                   State.
- 13                   B. This legislation will restore the organizational structure of USAID to its
- 14                   FY2024 state.
- 15                   **SECTION 4.**    This legislation will take effect at the beginning of FY2027 All
- 16                   laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Forbid Federal Debt

1 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is  
2 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,  
3 which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution  
4 when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states  
5 within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

## 6 **ARTICLE --**

7 **SECTION 1:** The Federal Government of the United States shall be  
8 forbidden from increasing the federal debt ceiling.

9 **SECTION 2:** The Federal Government of the United States shall be  
10 required to decrease the federal debt limit by at least \$500  
11 billion every fiscal year until it reaches \$0.

12 **SECTION 3:** Upon reaching a debt of \$0, the Federal Government of  
13 the United States shall be forbidden from going into debt  
14 in perpetuity.

15 **SECTION 4:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by  
16 appropriate legislation.

# A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Ban Gambling

**RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

## **ARTICLE --**

**SECTION 1:** Gambling in the United States and any territory subject to its jurisdiction is hereby prohibited.

**SECTION 2:** Gambling shall be defined as when a person bets something of monetary value on a chance outcome out of their control or influence, with the understanding that they will either lose their original value or gain increased value on the original bet. A. Chance outcomes include, but are not limited to, lotteries, online gambling, and card games.

**SECTION 3:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

# **A Bill to Establish a Nationwide Nap Class**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

**SECTION 1.** Primary and Secondary Schools must allot one hour of the school day to a dedicated nap class.

**SECTION 2.** Nap class shall be treated like a normal class, and an educator must be present to supervise students.

- A. Students shall be graded on a pass/fail basis.
- B. Students without diagnosed sleep disorders who are unwilling to participate for the majority of the academic year must fail the class.
- C. The nap class must begin between 12 and 1 pm local time.

**SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Education will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.

- A. The ED shall allocate \$10,000,000 of its annual budget to enforce the provisions of this legislation.

**SECTION 4.** Any institution found in violation of this legislation after its implementation shall have its federal funding revoked.

- A. Federal funding shall be reinstated upon compliance with this legislation.

**SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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## A Bill to Ban Guns at Protests

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Firearms are hereby banned at all protests, regardless of whether an individual possesses  
3 licensing or permits that would otherwise enable them to carry.

4 **SECTION 2.** Each state and territory is directed to regard protests as “sensitive places” (as defined in  
5 the Supreme Court decision *District of Columbia v. Heller* and reaffirmed in *New York State*  
6 *Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen*) and to apply penalties for violation of this legislation  
7 accordingly.

8 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and  
9 Explosives (ATF).

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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## A Bill to Reclaim Congressional War Powers

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
  - 2 **SECTION 1.** The Authorization for Use of Military Force of 2001 (AUMF; Pub. L. 107–40, 115 Stat. 224) is
  - 3 hereby repealed.
  - 4 **SECTION 2.** The President shall once again require the consent of Congress in order to use military
  - 5 force preemptively.
  - 6 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
  - 7 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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## A Bill to Delineate the Rights of the Press to Enter Places of Worship

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
  - 2 **SECTION 1.** No person, including any journalist or other member of the press, may enter a private place
  - 3 of worship without the consent of the legal owner or an authorized representative.
  - 4 **SECTION 2.** Should a journalist or other member of the press violate this legislation, they shall be held
  - 5 liable to relevant trespassing statutes the same as any other person would be.
  - 6 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Justice.
  - 7 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
  - 8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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## The Cryptocurrency Limitation against Executive Abuse and Nefariousness (CLEAN) Act

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The President, Vice President, and all Executive cabinet members are prohibited from  
3 acquiring, holding, accessing, soliciting, accepting, and otherwise interacting with their own  
4 digital assets while holding Executive office.

5 **SECTION 2.** Any digital assets held by any such Officers at the time of implementation must be placed  
6 into a qualified blind trust. The same shall be expected of any such assets of newly elected  
7 or appointed Executive Officers henceforth. Failure to comply shall be deemed an  
8 impeachable offense.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Office of Government Ethics (OGE).

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Ban Handleless Car Doors

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** All automobiles sold or manufactured in the United States shall henceforth be required to  
3 have mechanical handles on all doors.

4 **SECTION 2.** An automobile is defined as a self-propelled passenger vehicle manufactured for use on  
5 public roads, and a mechanical handle is defined as a hand-operated implement that opens  
6 a door on an automobile through mechanical means alone (without requiring electricity).

7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Office of Government Ethics (OGE).

8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to End the U.S. Military Presence in Okinawa

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall defund all U.S. military operations in Japan's Okinawa Prefecture over a  
3 period of two (2) years.

4 **SECTION 2.** The Department of Defense is directed to begin closing all Okinawa bases and reassigning  
5 all personnel currently stationed in Okinawa immediately in order to conclude operations  
6 prior to the end of this funding.

7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Defense.

8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect at the start of the next fiscal year.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Enforce the TikTok Ban

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Per the Protecting Americans from Foreign Adversary Controlled Applications Act (Pub. L.  
3 118–50, 138 Stat. 955), the prohibition on the following is reaffirmed: “a foreign adversary  
4 controlled application [...] directly or indirectly operated by (1) ByteDance, Ltd. or TikTok  
5 (including subsidiaries or successors that are controlled by a foreign adversary); or (2) a  
6 social media company that is controlled by a foreign adversary and has been determined by  
7 the President to present a significant threat to national security.”

8 **SECTION 2.** The January 2026 deal to avert this ban by divesting TikTok’s U.S. operations to the newly  
9 created TikTok USDS Joint Venture LLC is declared to have been a fake divestiture since  
10 ByteDance continues to code the application. Only a divestiture that totally divorces  
11 ByteDance from TikTok shall suffice if the app is to evade this ban.

12 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect 30 days from passage.

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Call for a Sphere-of-Influence World Order

- 1   **WHEREAS** Modern geopolitical history has made it clear that the world contains but three distinct and  
2                   viable great powers: the People’s Republic of China, the Russian Federation, and the United  
3                   States of America; and
- 4   **WHEREAS** The momentum of recent global events indicates a trend toward a world order where each  
5                   of these great powers acts as steward of its own third of the globe, together ensuring a  
6                   balanced, safe, and harmonious world order; now, therefore be it
- 7   **RESOLVED** by the Congress here assembled that the United States should move toward consolidating  
8                   greater influence and power over its corner of the globe in order to support a new world  
9                   order based on spheres of influence; and be it
- 10 **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the President is encouraged to organize a conference with the heads of state  
11                   of China and Russia for the purpose of developing a detailed map of each great power’s  
12                   sphere of influence and a productive plan for this new world order.
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## A Resolution to Recommend the Abandonment of Snow-Day Makeups

- 1   **WHEREAS** Safety should be the top and sole priority when a school district is determining whether to  
2                   cancel school due to inclement weather; and
- 3   **WHEREAS** Stress about a school year extending into summer vacation can cause administrators to  
4                   hesitate to make the safe call; and
- 5   **WHEREAS** Educators are masters of adaptation and flexibility and can adjust their curricula as  
6                   necessary even should there be an unusual number of snow days; and
- 7   **WHEREAS** A true snow day, in which school is fully canceled and students are temporarily liberated  
8                   from academic expectations, is a time-honored tradition and a legitimate silver lining of life  
9                   in the colder and snowier parts of our country; now, therefore be it
- 10 **RESOLVED** by the Congress here assembled that departments of education throughout the United  
11               States and its territories are encouraged to remove requirements that snow days be made  
12               up, whether that be through remote learning days or by extending the school year in any  
13               manner.
