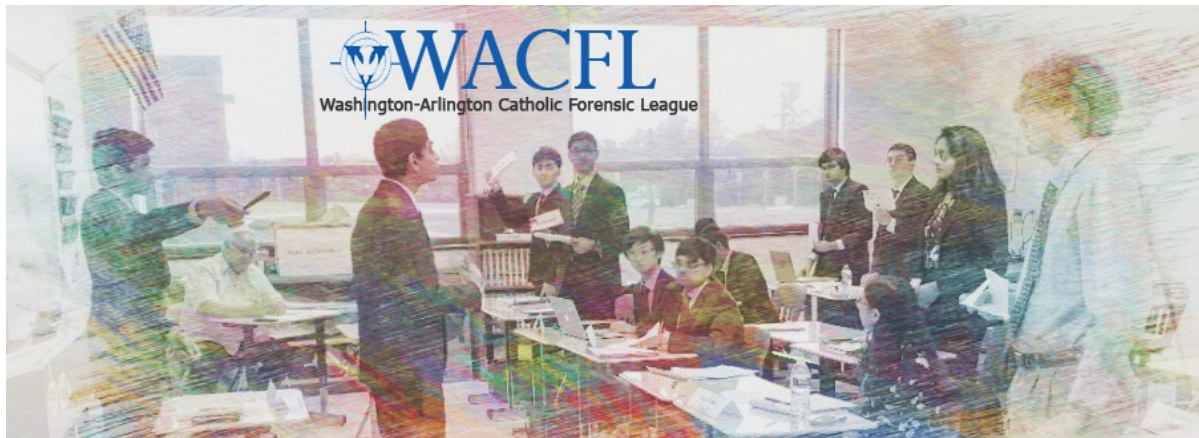

Bill #D1390

National Voting Integrity and Election Security Act

The federal government shall establish clear standards to strengthen voting integrity.

This includes voter registration verification, secure ballot procedures, as well as post

1 **Article I:** election audits. An allocation of \$90 million shall be provided to the Department of
Homeland Security as well as the Election Assistance Commission for the purpose of
Implementation, technology upgrades, and for the training of election officials.

Voting integrity refers to the protection of elections from fraud, outside interference,

and administrative error while ensuring that all eligible citizens have equal access to

vote. This includes safeguarding voter databases, securing proper voting equipment,

3 **Article II:** preventing unlawful voting practices, and maintaining transparency in vote counting.
These measures aim to preserve public trust in elections while helping ensure accurate
Election outcomes.

5 **Article III:** This policy shall take effect on November 3, 2026.

6 **Article IV:** Department of Homeland Security for the purpose of overseeing and
enforcement of this legislation.

A Bill to Tighten the Laws on Firearm Possession in the United States

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** It shall be illegal for any person who is deemed to possess a mental to possess, purchase,
2 or sell a firearm. It shall be illegal for any person to knowingly sell or transfer a firearm to
3 an individual under the age of 18. Any person 18 years of age or older who illegally
4 possesses, sells, or transfers a firearm in violation of federal law shall be subject to a
5 mandatory minimum sentence of 30 years imprisonment.

6 **SECTION 2.** (a) "Firearm" means any handgun, rifle, shotgun, semi-automatic weapon, automatic
7 weapon, or any other device designed to discharge a projectile by means of gunpowder or
8 explosive force, including the frame or receiver of such weapon.

9 (b) "Possess" means to knowingly have physical custody or control of a firearm.

10

11 (c) "Transfer" means the sale, gift, loan, trade, or any other conveyance of a firearm to
12 another person.

14 (d) "Knowingly" means that the individual was aware of the conduct and its nature.

17 **SECTION 3.** (a) The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives shall oversee enforcement of
18 this Act in coordination with the U.S. Department of Justice.

Bill #E1393

Bill to Amend the City Zoning Code to remove restrictions in order to increase the number of homes available

1 **Article I:**

The federal government will amend the city zoning codes to address housing affordability, ending parking minimums for multi-family units and beginning to build missing middle housing by-right in areas, allowing for the neighborhood to have options for all different income levels and household sizes.

3 **Article II:**

“Zoning Reform” refers to changing the regulations, such as single-family-only zoning, to increase more diverse housing options. “Missing Middle Housing” refers to building townhouses and duplexes that are more affordable, than the single-family houses. “By-Right” refers a process where projects are based on the zoning strands without public hearing.

5 **Article III:**

This policy will be enacted on March 28, 2026.

6 **Article IV:**

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development will oversee this bill.

Iranian People Freedom and Self-Determination Act

It is the policy of the United States to support the Iranian people in their pursuit of freedom, human rights, and self-determination by engaging directly with the people rather than the governing authorities, expanding access to information and secure communication, supporting independent civil society humanitarian aid, and opposing repression through lawful, non-military means while affirming that Iran's political future must be determined by its people.

1 **Article I:**

2

This Act includes the creation of programs and mechanisms to support the Iranian people directly, including secure and uncensored communication networks, humanitarian aid delivery systems, independent media and civil society funding, and educational and cultural exchange initiatives. The Act also establishes targeted measures against individuals and entities responsible for repression and human rights abuses, while explicitly excluding the general population from penalties, and provides for regular reporting to Congress on the implementation and effectiveness of these programs.

This policy will be enacted on May 4, 2026.

The United States Congress will oversee this bill.
