


**A BILL TO RAISE THE MINIMUM AGE FOR MARRIAGE TO EIGHTEEN
IN ALL U.S. STATES**



BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- Article I:** With this new policy in place, every state must require both parties planning on forming a marital contract to be at least 18 years old.
- Article II:** This bill will make any marriage under 18 years of age, including marriages that are of custom/religion, even if they include parental consent, illegal and void. This bill will not nullify legal marriages under 18 years of age prior to the passing of this bill.
- Article III:** This bill will be implemented on June 1st, 2026.
- Article IV:** The Children's Bureau and The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' will work in tandem to oversee the enforcement of the bill along with the specific enforcement mechanism.
- Article V:** State that all other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Foreign Aid to Developing Nations Impacted by Climate Change

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: The United States shall increase foreign aid to developing nations that are most affected by the impacts of climate change, with the goal of promoting sustainable development and long-term climate resilience.

Article II: An additional \$10 billion per year shall be allocated to the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to fund renewable energy projects, clean water initiatives, agricultural adaptation programs, and disaster relief efforts.

Article III: This bill shall take effect on October 1, 2026, marking the start of the next fiscal year.

Article IV: The Department of State and USAID shall oversee implementation and provide annual public reports to ensure transparency and effective use of funds.

Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation shall be hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban the Mandatory Implementation of School Uniforms Nationwide

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.

The United States shall prohibit all public educational institutions from requiring students to wear standardized school uniforms as a condition of attendance.

SECTION 2.

For the purposes of this legislation:

- a. *School uniforms* are defined as clothing or attire mandated by a school or district policy requiring all students to wear identical or near-identical outfits.
- b. *Public educational institutions* include any elementary, middle, or high schools funded primarily by state or local government resources.

SECTION 3.

Public schools may establish reasonable dress codes ensuring safety, decency, and prevention of gang-related apparel, provided such policies allow individual expression and cultural or religious attire.

SECTION 4.

The U.S. Department of Education shall oversee compliance by:

- a. Reviewing district-level policies for uniform mandates.
- b. Withholding up to 5% of federal education grants from noncompliant districts.

SECTION 5.

This law shall take effect at the beginning of the following academic year after passage.

SECTION 6.

All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO RELOCATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article 1: We must redirect certain federal funding to schools so that students come FIRST.

Article 2: Redirect: meaning we defund less important or other fundings and use the money on our students.

Article 3: Implement by 08/01/26

Article 4: Section 1

1. The Department Of Education will oversee the creation of this bill.

1. Funds shall be reallocated away from the following programs

A. U.S foreign military aid to countries currently engaged in offensive warfare or that are found violating human rights.

B. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (also known as ICE) deportations until detainees are given proper due process.

C. Immigration detainment centers that are found to be violating human rights.

D. Reductions only apply to discretionary foreign military, deportation, and detainment spending. Needed humanitarian and refugee programs will remain.

2. Funds shall be reallocated to causes as follows

A. 40% will be spent on providing breakfast and lunch to students.

B. State and local funding will no longer go toward student meals; it will become a federally funded program that is guaranteed to every American public school student.

C. 60% to increase other educational needs such as teacher salaries, better educational plans, and keeping schools renovated to maintain a safe and modern environment

Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Apply Antitrust Laws to Professional Sports Leagues

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.

The statutory labor exemption under federal antitrust law shall no longer apply to collective bargaining activities of professional sports leagues or their players' associations.

SECTION 2.

For the purposes of this bill:

a. *Professional sports league* means any league engaged in professional baseball, basketball, football, or hockey that operates in interstate commerce.

b. *Players' association* means any labor organization representing professional athletes within such a league.

SECTION 3.

The Clayton Act and the Norris-LaGuardia Act shall be amended to ensure that professional sports players' associations are subject to the same federal antitrust rules as other business entities.

SECTION 4.

The intent of this legislation is to restore fair competition in professional sports by preventing collusion and anti-competitive practices in player contracts and salary negotiations.

SECTION 5.

This act shall take effect one year after passage.
