## A Bill to Make Valentine's Day a Federal Holiday

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
2. **SECTION 1.** Valentine's Day (February 14) shall be recognized as a
3. federal holiday.
4. **SECTION 2.** When Valentine's Day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, it shall
5. be observed on the Friday preceding or the Monday
6. following, respectively.
7. **SECTION 3.** On the day Valentine's Day is observed, all non-essential
8. federal government offices shall be closed, stock market
9. trading shall be suspended, and every federal government
10. employee shall be paid for a normal day's work. State and
11. local governments and private businesses are strongly
12. encouraged to observe Valentine's Day similarly as they are
13. able.
14. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
15. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
16. and void.

## A Bill to Increase Taxation on Private Jets

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
2. **SECTION 1.** The federal excise tax for fuel sold to be used in a luxury
3. private aircraft shall be increased to \$2.00 per gallon.
4. **SECTION 2.** The 49 USC § 80503(a)(1) definition of private aircraft shall be
5. utilized, namely: “a civilian aircraft not being used to transport
6. passengers or property for compensation.” A private aircraft
7. shall be classified as luxury when its estimated value exceeds
8. \$1 million.
9. **SECTION 3.** Proceeds raised through this tax increase shall be diverted to
10. the Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE)
11. to be used to fund existing tax incentives for the
12. development and use of renewable energy in transportation,
13. as well as to create new ones.
14. **SECTION 4.** Should a customer be found to have bypassed or attempted
15. to bypass this tax increase by using fuel purchased for other
16. purposes in a luxury private aircraft, they shall be fined an
17. amount equal to ten (10) times the total value of the
18. fraudulently purchased fuel.
19. **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Federal Aviation
20. Administration (FAA), with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS)
21. responsible for the excise tax.
22. **SECTION 6.** This legislation shall take effect one month from passage, and
23. all laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
24. and void.

## A Resolution to Encourage the Curtailing of Excessive Absentee Voting

1.     **WHEREAS** Absentee voting was originally designed with a very limited
2.                 scope to protect the right to vote when intractable
3.                 extenuating circumstances, in particular military service,
4.                 made physical presence at a polling place unduly
5.                 challenging; and
6.     **WHEREAS** Absentee voting has since been abused in many jurisdictions
7.                 to allow citizens to vote absentee for less legitimate reasons
8.                 or even without providing any reason whatsoever; and
9.     **WHEREAS** The sanctity of our elections is indisputably crucial for the
10.                ongoing viability of our republic, and so we must do all we
11.                can to prevent opportunities for voter fraud as well as to
12.                eliminate the space for conspiracies to fester around
13.                perceptions thereof; now, therefore, be it
14.    **RESOLVED** by the Congress here assembled that all States and Territories
15.                are encouraged to eliminate no-excuse absentee voting;
16.                and be it
17.    **FURTHER RESOLVED** that Congress encourages all States and Territories to
18.                be conscientious and conservative in determining which
19.                situations truly justify absentee voting, and to accept no
20.                others.



## The Crustacean Live-Boiling Abolition and Welfare (CLAW) Act

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
2. **SECTION 1.** Lobsters, crabs, and all other crustaceans must henceforth be
3. killed quickly and humanely prior to cooking them, whether
4. by boiling, steaming, or any other method.
5. **SECTION 2.** Any restaurant or other business found to be in violation of this
6. legislation shall be fined \$1,000 for each inhumanely killed
7. crustacean. Should a restaurant or other business be found to
8. have violated this legislation more than twenty (20) times in a
9. single year, their license to serve food shall in turn be
10. suspended for a period of one (1) year.
11. **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Animal and Plant
12. Health Inspection Service (APHIS), which shall additionally be
13. tasked with determining humane methods for killing
14. crustaceans and publicizing those methods clearly and
15. promptly to restaurants and businesses as well as to the
16. general public.
17. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect one week from passage.
18. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
19. and void.

## A Bill to Invalidate Tattoos as Legal Evidence

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
2. **SECTION 1.** Tattoos and all other superficial skin markings are hereby
3.                   declared to be inadmissible as evidence in a court of law.
4. **SECTION 2.** Any persons currently serving a sentence on the basis of
5.                   tattoo evidence shall have their cases reopened and retried
6.                   with such evidence left out. When such a retrial results in a
7.                   verdict of not guilty, such persons shall be fully exonerated of
8.                   their previous conviction.
9. **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of
10.                  Justice.
11. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage. All
12.                  laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
13.                  and void.

## A Bill to Ban the Sale of Toy Guns

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The sale of toy guns and any other products marketed
3. toward children that are designed to resemble and/or imitate
4. firearms of any kind is hereby prohibited.
5. **SECTION 2.** Any business found to be in violation of this legislation shall be
6. fined a minimum of \$5,000 and a maximum of \$20,000 per
7. infraction and shall be shut down if found to be violating this
8. legislation more than five times in a twelve-month period.
9. **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the U.S. Consumer
10. Product Safety Commission.
11. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2024.
12. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
13. and void.

## A Bill to Abolish ICE

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
2. **SECTION 1.** Congress hereby abolishes the United States Immigration and
3. Customs Enforcement (ICE).
4. **SECTION 2.** Congress directs the Executive to consider carefully which
5. tasks that heretofore have been carried out by ICE are
6. indeed worth continuing and which can be jettisoned. Those
7. tasks which must be upheld shall be reassigned to other
8. agencies. These decisions and reassignments are to be
9. carried out in a manner that upholds the human rights of all
10. first and foremost and which further upholds our nation's
11. commitments to due process, equal protection,
12. non-discrimination, privacy, and family values and integrity.
13. **SECTION 3.** ICE employees who are laid off as a result of this legislation
14. shall be offered reassignment to other federal agencies
15. where opportunities exist for which they are qualified. Those
16. ICE employees who are eligible for federal severance pay
17. under 5 U.S.C. § 5595 shall be offered it should reassignment
18. prove impossible or should they prefer to seek another path
19. even where reassignment is available
20. **SECTION 4.** Funds saved through this abolition shall be delivered to our
21. nation's immigration courts to facilitate lawful immigration,
22. asylum-seekers, and meaningful paths to citizenship for law16
23. abiding undocumented workers.
24. **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage,
25. and all laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
26. declared null and void.
