

A Bill to Implement An Interlinked Health Database Within the United States.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The US shall be required to implement an interlinked health database, in
2 which medical professionals can access a patient's records from other
3 practitioners and pharmacies.

4 **SECTION 2.** “Health” refers to the prescriptions, surgeries, shots, and other medical
5 treatment a patient has received from a legal practitioner.

6 “Interlinked Database” refers to “a structured set of data held in a
7 computer, especially one that is accessible in various ways.”

8 **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Health and Human Services as well as The
9 Department of Homeland Security will oversee the passing of this bill.

10 A. The Department of Health and Human Services is the department
11 created to “protect the health of the U.S. people”, and “[provide] essential
12 human services.”

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in Fiscal Year 2025. All laws in conflict with
16 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Dignified Enforcement and Treatment Act (D.E.T.A)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT :

1 **SECTION 1.** Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officers shall ensure all
2 suspects are detained in a manner that is dignified, justified, and peaceful,
3 so long as doing so does not entirely restrict the operational goals of the
4 DHS. In an effort to minimize the violation of personal liberties and
5 discourage improper uses of force, new mechanisms will be established to
6 ensure oversight and accountability.

7

8 **SECTION 2.** \$5 million shall go towards the DHS budget to fund Body Worn Camera
9 systems, or BWCs.

10 A. In any given ICE operation or detainment, half of all officers present will
11 be required to record the event via BWCs.

12 B. Any individual detained by ICE will be granted unrestricted access to all
13 footage documenting the incident. The legal counsel of any detained
14 individual may also be granted unrestricted access, so long as proper
15 consent is obtained. Any footage obtained by a detainee or a detainee's
16 legal counsel may also be publicized at the discretion of the detainee.

18 **SECTION 3.** The DHS shall be required to obtain a warrant from the district attorney
19 before proceeding with any premeditated operations. Though warrants do
20 not have to be obtained for individual or spontaneous detentions,
21 operations involving the detention of multiple suspects at once or the
22 probing of private spaces and businesses must be court-approved on the
23 basis of probable cause.

25 **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with
26 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Nationally Ban the Importation Of Unethically Produced Cacao Beans and Goods.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** To prevent the support of a cruel, inhumane, and exploitative industry, the
2 United States shall stop all importation of unethically produced cacao
3 beans and goods.

4 SECTION 2. Definitions regarding this bill:

5 A. Unethically produced cacao beans and goods are defined as goods
6 produced in countries noted in The Bureau of International Labor Affairs'
7 List of Goods Produced by Child Labor or Forced Labor. This list includes but
8 is not limited to Ghana, Brazil, Côte d'Ivoire, and the Netherlands.

9 **SECTION 3.** Customs and Borders Protection as well as the Food and Labor
10 Administration will work in tandem with The Bureau of International Labor
11 Affairs in order to regulate and enforce rules about the sale of cacao beans
12 and goods in American stores.

13 A. All cacao beans and goods entering the United States will be inspected
14 by the agencies above. Products found to be in violation will be sent
15 back and fined.

16 B. Products found within violation of the regulation will be sent back to
17 the producer and fined at a rate of \$10,000 per every 1 ton of cacao
18 beans or 1 ton of cacao product.

19 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on February 14, 2031, in respect to
20 Valentine's Day

21 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit the Use of *WeChat* by U.S. Government Officials

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The telecommunications and messaging application *WeChat*, developed by
3 Chinese technology company Tencent in 2011, is hereby prohibited from
4 use by officials of the United States government.

5 **SECTION 2.** Under the National Intelligence Law of the People's Republic of China,
6 Tencent is legally obligated to provide user data to state authorities upon
7 request. This obligation enables the Chinese Communist Party to access
8 the personal and proprietary information of users outside of China, including
9 members of the United States government. This constitutes a serious
10 national security risk to the government and people of the United States.

11 **SECTION 3.** *WeChat* shall be blocked on all government-issued devices, and access to
12 all *WeChat* services shall be prohibited on government networks. Any
13 government official found to have used *WeChat* following the passage of
14 this bill, including by installing or accessing the application or its services,
15 shall be subject to suspension or termination of employment, depending on
16 the severity of the violation.

17 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall be enforced by the National Security Agency in
18 conjunction with other United States intelligence agencies, including the
19 Federal Bureau of Investigation.

19 **SECTION 5.** This law shall take effect immediately upon passage.

20 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
21 and void.
