

2026 AIA State Division 2 Congressional Docket

At the 2024 Spring Conference “A Proposal to have Online Voting for Congressional Docket Order” was approved.

Tournament directors are required to randomly select a docket order prior to competition. The purpose is to reduce large school advantage in dictating the docket order on their own.

Congress Session 1 the docket order will be as follows:

1. A Bill to Protect Minors from Conversion Therapy
2. A Bill to Reduce Educational Disparities Through Housing Reforms
3. A Resolution to Call Upon the International Criminal Court (ICC) to Prosecute Perpetrators of Epstein Island
4. A Bill to Limit Federal Administrative Overreach

Congress Session 2 the docket order will be as follows:

1. A Bill To Mandate the Transition of All Public School Buses in the United States to Fully Electric Operation by 2040
2. A Bill to Establish a National Price Ceiling and Transparency Standards for Insulin
3. Congressional Integrity Act
4. A Bill to Generate and Reinforce Economic Growth by Promoting Resilient American Technology Transformation (GREG PRATT)

A Bill to Establish a National Price Ceiling and Transparency Standards for Insulin

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The purpose of this legislation is to ensure universal and affordable access
2 to insulin through national price regulation, elimination of out-of-pocket
3 costs for insured individuals, and increased manufacturer transparency.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Insulin means any insulin formulation approved by the Food and Drug
5 Administration (FDA) for the treatment of diabetes. Price Ceiling means the
6 maximum legal price at which insulin may be sold. Health Insurance Plan
7 includes any private health insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, TRICARE, or
8 other public health coverage. Monthly means every thirty (30) days.
9 Pharmacy means any entity authorized to dispense insulin directly to
10 consumers.
- 11 **SECTION 3.** A national price ceiling of \$35 per 30-day supply is established for all insulin
12 purchased by individuals without health insurance. All individuals with a
13 health insurance plan shall receive insulin at no out-of-pocket cost,
14 including no copayments, deductibles, or coinsurance. Access to insulin
15 under this Act shall not require participation in manufacturer assistance or
16 discount programs. Manufacturers, distributors, and pharmacies shall not
17 charge prices exceeding the limits established in this section.
- 18 **SECTION 4.** All insulin manufacturers shall report production costs, wholesale
19 acquisition costs, and list prices to the Department of Health and Human
20 Services (HHS) as determined by the Secretary.
- 21 **SECTION 5.** This Act shall be enforced by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in
22 coordination with the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
23 Any violation of this Act shall result in a civil penalty not exceeding
24 \$100,000 per violation.
- 25 **SECTION 6.** Funding for this Act shall be provided through a 20% reallocation of the
26 Department of Defense's annual discretionary budget.
- 27 **SECTION 7.** This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2029. All laws and regulations in
28 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by BASIS Peoria.

A Bill to Generate and Reinforce Economic Growth by Promoting Resilient American Technology Transformation (GREG PRATT)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall promote Resilient American Technology adoption.

2 **SECTION 2.** Resilient American Technology shall include robotics, telecommunications,
3 semiconductors, artificial intelligence (AI), energy and power systems,
4 advanced construction materials/methods, and biotechnology. Eligibility
5 for all programs in this legislation is restricted to companies with over 90%
6 U.S.-based ownership.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Departments of Energy (DOE), Labor (DOL), and Commerce (DOC) shall
8 establish the Transformation Oversight Board (TOB) to implement the
9 following:

10 A. Workforce Reskilling: \$1 billion over 5 years shall be authorized to
11 provide vouchers and subsidies to community colleges and trade
12 schools to develop "Accelerated Certification Tracks" for workers
13 displaced by automation.

14 B. Innovation Funding: \$5 billion over 5 years shall be authorized for
15 competitive grants to businesses implementing technologies described
16 in Section 2. Recipients must provide long-term employment
17 opportunities for workers graduating from Section 3A programs.

18 C. Funding shall come from reallocation of revenue from Federal
19 Communications Commission (FCC) electromagnetic spectrum
20 auctions.

21 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect on October 1, 2026. All laws in conflict
22 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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A Bill to Limit Federal Administrative Overreach

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** No federal agency shall issue an administrative subpoena or administrative
2 warrant without prior approval from a federal judge or magistrate.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** All administrative subpoenas and warrants must demonstrate probable
4 cause or reasonable suspicion, as determined by the federal judiciary.
- 5 **SECTION 3.** This legislation applies to all federal executive agencies and independent
6 regulatory agencies.
- 7 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Justice shall oversee enforcement of this legislation and
8 ensure agency compliance.
- 9 **SECTION 5.** Any agency found in violation of this legislation shall be subject to
10 budgetary penalties as determined by Congress, including partial funding
11 suspension.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage. All laws and
13 regulations in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
14 void.

A Bill To Mandate the Transition of All Public School Buses in the United States to Fully Electric Operation by 2040

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** All public school districts within the United States shall ensure that all
2 buses used for student transportation are fully electric by January 1, 2040.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this legislation:
4 A. Fully electric shall mean vehicles propelled exclusively by electric motors
5 utilizing stored battery energy, producing zero direct tailpipe emissions.
6 B. Public school district shall refer to local education agencies that receive
7 federal funding under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.
8 C. “School bus” shall include any vehicle meeting the definition under Title
9 49, Section 30125 of the United States Code.
- 10 **SECTION 3.** A. The Department of Energy (DOE), in coordination with the
11 Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of
12 Transportation (DOT), shall oversee implementation of this act.
13 B. A Federal School Transportation Electrification Fund is hereby
14 established to provide grants covering up to 80 percent of the cost of
15 vehicle replacement, charging infrastructure, and maintenance training.
16 C. Priority funding shall be directed to rural, low-income, and
17 high-pollution districts.
- 18 **SECTION 4.** All newly purchased public school buses after January 1, 2030, must be
19 electric vehicles. By 2035, at least 75 percent of all school bus fleets shall
20 be electric. By 2040, total transition to electric fleets must be completed.
- 21 **SECTION 5.** The DOE shall conduct annual progress reviews and publicly release data on
22 local compliance, emission reductions, and health outcomes. School
23 districts failing to meet annual milestones without a waiver shall lose
24 eligibility for certain federal transportation grants until compliant.
- 25 **SECTION 6.** Congress shall authorize \$20 billion annually beginning in Fiscal Year 2026
26 through 2040 for implementation, funded through a portion of the
27 Inflation Reduction Act’s green infrastructure allocation and
28 carbon-emission penalty revenues.
- SECTION 7.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Protect Minors from Conversion Therapy

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Conversion therapy for minors will hereby be banned within the United
2 States of America and its territories.

3 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this bill:

A. "Conversion Therapy" is defined as a mental health or medical professional's efforts to change someone's sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression, especially through harmful methods.

B. These “efforts” include, but are not limited to, Electric Shocks, Nausea
Drugs, Hypnosis, prescribing “Accountability Groups,” and other similar
methods the mental health or medical professional might employ.

10 C. "Minor" is defined as anyone under 18 years old.

11 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Health and Human
12 Services which will partner with the Department of Justice (DOJ).

A. Any person (or persons) found guilty of attempting any method of conversion therapy practices will have their state licensing revoked and be subject to a \$5,000-\$10,000 fee, depending on the severity of the strategies used.

B. Any person within the United States and its territories who provides services that could be considered Conversion Therapy, regardless of any past training or professional degrees and licenses, will be charged and punished accordingly.

21 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect beginning January 1, 2028. All laws in
22 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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Introduced for Congressional Debate by Pusch Ridge.

A Bill to Reduce Educational Disparities Through Housing Reforms

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** Property taxes shall be aggregated by each individual state. Subsequently,
2 each state shall determine the amount of the total revenue to spend on
3 funding public schools and distribute those funds equally to public schools
4 by dollars per pupil. Remaining property tax revenue shall be redistributed
5 to the counties and districts of origin.
- 6 **SECTION 2.** Property taxes shall be defined as taxes on owned property, calculated
7 through appraisal.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Department of
9 Education, and the Department of Transportation shall work together to
10 enforce this legislation.
- 11 D. The Department of Housing and Urban Development shall collect and
12 analyze data on housing values, property wealth concentration, and
13 residential segregation as they relate to public school funding equity,
14 and shall publish annual reports to assist states in complying with this
15 legislation.
- 16 E. The Department of Education shall ensure that public schools are
17 receiving equal amounts of money per pupil within each state.
- 18 F. The Department of Transportation shall ensure that states and the
19 counties within them that do not abide by this legislation shall have
20 their highway funding reduced by 20%.
- 21 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with
22 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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Introduced for Congressional Debate by Phoenix Country Day School.

Congressional Integrity Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** Members of Congress are required to publicly disclose donations and
2 certify that they have not linked, or solicited any linkage between, their
3 official actions and any personal benefits received.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Key terms are defined as follows:
5 A. Official actions can be defined as bill sponsorship, committee hearings,
6 amendments, votes, and any other position-related action.
7 B. Personal benefits can be defined as campaign donations, arranged job
8 offers following one’s retirement from Congress, negotiations that benefit
9 oneself, travel, or government contracts in which they, or their family
10 members, have a personal interest.
- 11 **SECTION 3.** The requirements and enforcement of this Bill are as follows:
12 A. This should be completed annually with disclosure filings and within 30
13 days of any action that falls into the categories listed above.
14 B. This will be enforced by the Department of Justice.
15 C. If a Congressperson fails to comply, they will be met with criminal
16 prosecution and a civil fine of up to \$250,000.
- 17 **SECTION 4.** Implementation will begin in May 2027. All laws in conflict with this
18 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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Introduced for Congressional Debate by Pusch Ridge.

A Resolution to Call Upon the International Criminal Court (ICC) to Prosecute Perpetrators of Epstein Island

1 **WHEREAS,** the Department of Justice has recognized Jeffrey Epstein’s private island as
2 the site of extensive violations of human rights, including the trafficking
3 and exploitation of minors; and
4 **WHEREAS,** these offenses involved perpetrators and victims from at least ten countries
5 beyond the United States, including the United Kingdom, Norway, France,
6 and more, making the crimes beyond the full jurisdiction of the US; and
7 **WHEREAS,** the lack of comprehensive international prosecution has allowed several
8 alleged co-conspirators to evade justice, denying closure to victims and
9 their families; and
10 **WHEREAS,** collaboration with the ICC would ensure impartial investigations and
11 promote transparency; now, therefore, be it
12 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled calls upon the International Criminal
13 Court (ICC) to open a formal investigation into all individuals implicated in
14 the Epstein Island operations, including enablers and co-conspirators, and
15 to pursue prosecution under applicable international law; and be it
16 **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the United States and all cooperating nations provide full
17 access to evidence, witness testimony, and financial records necessary for
18 the ICC’s investigation and commit to supporting victims through
19 international legal and humanitarian aid programs.
