

Bill A: A Bill to Fund and Modernize Military Infrastructure in US

Territories

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The United States shall hereby appropriate \$50 billion annually over a fifteen year period to modernize military infrastructure in US territories to ensure that U.S. military installations located within these territories are capable of maintaining modern defense operations.

SECTION 2. A. US Territories shall be defined as Guam, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI).

B. Military infrastructure shall refer to all defense-related facilities, including of naval bases, airfields, radar systems, energy grids, and supply depots operated by the Department of Defense (DoD), Navy Installations Command (CNIC), or Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

C. Modernization shall include of but is not limited to projects redirected towards structural repairs, digital and cyber upgrades, renewable energy conservation, and climate resilience measures designed to withstand natural disasters.

SECTION 3. The DoD will work with the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to conduct biannual audits of all expenditures and issues public reports to Congress. Funding for this bill will come from the Department of Defense. Non-profit government organizations (NGOs) will be prioritized for funding. Failure to conduct biannual audits and issue public reports will result in funding being frozen until Congress receives the necessary appropriations.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take place at the start of FY 2026.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict within this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill B: A Bill to Establish a State Pharmaceutical Corporation

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. In the face of medicine affordability and access challenges, a state pharmaceutical corporation shall be established in the United States. 2 billion dollars shall be diverted from current subsidies of private pharmaceutical companies to fund the creation of a state pharmaceutical corporation. An additional 2 billion dollars shall be diverted from the Department of Defense for funding.

SECTION 2. A state pharmaceutical corporation is defined as a federal government-owned enterprise that researches, develops, manufactures, and distributes medicines to the public.

SECTION 3. The Department of Health and Human Services shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect at the start of FY 26-27.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill C: A Bill to Implement the Construction of Solar Panels on US Housing

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. In order to combat the issues presented by global warming, every house in US states and territories shall be required to to install solar panels on the roof. The owner(s) of the houses shall be responsible for arranging the installation of these solar panels and will be provided with \$10,000 of compensation per house after the installation. After 1 year of passing, any houses found in violation of this shall be subject to a \$10,000 fine.

SECTION 2. Houses shall be defined as buildings in which people live in, including apartments, townhouses, condominiums, and mansions.

SECTION 3. The Department of Housing and Urban Development shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill D: A Bill to Reevaluate US Territories

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The federal government shall conduct a referendum in the U.S. territories of Puerto Rico, Guam, U.S. Virgin Islands, and American Samoa by Fiscal Year 2027.

SECTION 2. A referendum shall be defined as a popular vote by the population of each country on whether they want to become a U.S. state or become independent.

SECTION 3. The U.S. Interior Department's Office of Insular Affairs and the U.S. Department of State shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect in FY 2027.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill E: The Paid Parental Leave Act (P.P.L. ACT)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All corporations either operating within or otherwise based in/founded in the United States are hereby required to provide paid parental leave to all employees, indiscriminate to gender.

SECTION 2. This bill establishes paid parental leave for all employed Americans.

A. "Paid parental leave" shall be defined as a minimum of 12 weeks of paid leave for all employees who have worked for their current place of employment for at least 1 year.

SECTION 3. The Bureau of Labor in conjunction with the Internal Revenue Service shall be responsible for the implementation and oversight of this bill.

A. Corporations that reported less than \$5 million in annual revenue for the previous year shall receive the funding to carry out today's legislation through the return of 0.5% of the federal taxes from these companies. Corporations that reported more than \$5 million in annual revenue for the previous year shall be responsible for paying for the policy themselves.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented immediately upon passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill F: A Bill to Build AI Databases in Space

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States shall promote the development of spaced data structure. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) shall assist private entities in designing and launching AI databases into space.

SECTION 2. AI databases shall be defined as a system or facility, whether terrestrial or space-based, whose primary function is the processing, training, storage, or management of data specifically for the development, operation, or enhancement of Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning models and applications.

SECTION 3. The Department of Commerce shall oversee this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation will be implemented in FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
