

Participants **MUST** be from a school and have official school adult supervision

We welcome students who represent schools and who are school adult supervised teams to our tournament. WSFA/WIAA regulations prohibit unsupervised students and students who are not from schools from attending the tournament. This means that students who are not participating as part of a school may not attend tournaments in Washington State. If you are not from a school and you are participating without a school official "supervising" you during the tournament, you will be dismissed from the tournament without refund. Concerns? So, if you are not participating as a school representative, you may not participate in our tournament.

Our Online Policies

- Make sure that your students have active Tabroom accounts well ahead of the tournament. Otherwise, they won't be able to compete.
- Students and Judges should have Cameras on. This is a safeguard against outside assistance, and it is an important accessibility feature. Cameras also help maintain the social atmosphere of speech and debate. That said, if there is a significant reason you need the camera off, you are not required to have the camera on.
- **MAKE SURE YOUR STUDENTS ARE READY TO GO. They need a decent webcam, working microphone and speakers, and MOST IMPORTANT, reliable internet connection.**
