Congressional Debate Legislation**

PRELIMS

A Bill to Stabilize US Medical Supply Lines

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The Regional Integration Opportunity Fund budget will be increased from
2 \$105 million to \$400 million for fiscal years 2026-2030.
- 3 **A.** Funding is for the purpose of redirecting friendshoring efforts from the
4 Middle East to North, Central, and South America.
- 5 **B.** Funding is for the expressed purpose of creating safe corridors and
6 partnerships regarding healthcare needs.
- 7 **SECTION 2.**
- 8 **A.** Friendshoring is a strategic establishment or relocation of
9 manufacturing, supply chain or other business operations within a
10 foreign jurisdiction that shares political, economic, or security values
11 for the primary purpose of mitigating risk and exposure to hostile
12 states.
- 13 **B.** Healthcare needs are defined as products or services provided by the
14 pharmaceutical, medical supply, and biomedical industries.
- 15 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of State will oversee the compliance of this legislation
16 and fund.
- 17 **A.** Budget will be allocated directly from the Department of Health and
18 Human Services “A Healthy Future” fund.
- 19 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage.
- 20 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Get Rid of Fees to Make More Immigrants Legal

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The United States will no longer charge humans immigrating to the United
- 2 States for proper and legal documentation.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** The fees that will no longer need to be paid will be defined as:
- 4 **A.** Naturalization (N-400): \$710.00 USD
- 5 **B.** Green Card (I-485): \$1440.00 USD
- 6 **C.** H-1B Visa (I-129): \$780.00 USD
- 7 **D.** L-1 Visa (I-129): \$460.00 USD
- 8 **E.** Immigrant Investor (I-129): \$3,750.00 USD
- 9 **F.** Asylum Fee (I-526): \$600.00 USD
- 10 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Education shall oversee the enforcement of this
- 11 bill.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in fiscal year 2028.
- 13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Promote Non-STEM Education in Title I Schools

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** Title I schools shall utilize 25% of all new funding received from Title I
2 allocations to fund regular meaningful non-STEM education instruction.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** For the purposes of this bill:
- 4 **A.** Non-STEM education shall be defined as experiences outside the two
5 domains defined by the Standard Occupational Classification system
6 (e.g., experiences *outside* life and physical science, engineering,
7 mathematics, and information technology; social science; architecture;
8 and health).
- 9 **B.** Regular experiences shall be defined as curricular or co-curricular
10 activities that a student may have during the scheduled school day and
11 occur at least once per week that a school is in session.
- 12 **C.** Meaningful experiences shall be defined as curricular or co-curricular
13 activities that a student has 80 minutes of direct participation per
14 week.
- 15 **D.** Funding may include direct instruction, community partnerships,
16 materials, field programs, or co-curricular programming.
- 17 **SECTION 3.** Schools that receive Title I funding shall coordinate with their state’s or
18 territory’s department of education (or equivalent entity) to approve
19 instructional scopes and plans 21 days prior to the start of the school year.
20 They shall also provide a report on participation and attendance of all
21 activities that occurred within the school year, direct outcomes of
22 participation towards school attendance and academic performance, and
23 correlational effects on STEM educational outcomes 45 days after the end
24 of the school year.
- 25 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Education shall oversee this bill and report findings to
26 Congress by the end of each federal fiscal year.
- 27 **SECTION 5.** This bill shall go into effect on October 1st, 2026.
- 28 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Build Up Venezuela

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** American oil companies that establish and utilize infrastructure in
2 Venezuela must contribute 20% of annual revenue derived from drilling in
3 Venezuela to a sovereign wealth fund.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** The Venezuelan sovereign wealth fund will be an endowment managed by
5 the American transitional government that subsidizes social services.
- 6 **A.** Projects funded by the Venezuelan sovereign wealth fund shall include
7 but not be limited to: the creation of railways, pipelines, hospitals,
8 police stations, and school zones.
- 9 **B.** Whilst infrastructure is under construction and unable to be harnessed,
10 oil companies will be required to pay an annual fee to the sovereign
11 wealth fund.
- 12 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of State shall work in conjunction with the American
13 transitional government and the Venezuelan government in order to
14 implement this legislation.
- 15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 5th, 2026.
- 16 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

FINALS

The ART (Agreement on Reciprocal Trade) Act of 2026

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** Sections 122 and 301 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 USC § 2132 and 19 USC
2 § 2411) are deleted.
- 3 **A.** Any current investigations being conducted under the auspice of the
4 above sections will immediately cease.
- 5 **A.** Any penalties, fees, or tariffs currently charged under the above
6 sections will immediately cease.
- 7 **SECTION 2.** The Office of the United States Trade Representative (USTR) shall have
8 authority to negotiate Agreements on Reciprocal Trade (ART) with foreign
9 governments.
- 10 **A.** No tariff, fee, or tax shall be enacted on imports or exports unless
11 agreed to in the ART as negotiated by the USTR.
- 12 **B.** Such agreements are not subject to approval by legislative or judicial
13 branches.
- 14 **C.** These agreements shall have an effective date of no more than five
15 years and then shall be renegotiated by the respective countries.
- 16 **SECTION 3.** The USTR shall annually report to Congress on the number of ARTs with
17 various countries, and the conditions contained therein.
- 18 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect ninety days after passage.
- 19 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Incentivize Allied Production of AI Hardware and Protect U.S. AI Innovation from Adversary Imports

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall incentivize allied nations to co-produce AI hardware
2 and data center components while applying strategic tariffs on imports
3 from adversary nations, including China and Russia, to safeguard U.S. AI
4 innovation, domestic infrastructure, and national security.

5 **SECTION 2.** Allied nations are countries formally partnered with the U.S. to produce AI
6 hardware and data center infrastructure. Adversary nations are those
7 posing economic, technological, or security risks. AI hardware and data
8 center components include GPUs, servers, storage, and memory essential
9 for AI computation.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR), in coordination with the
11 Departments of Commerce, Defense, and Energy, shall oversee funding and
12 enforcement. Up to \$1 billion annually shall support allied production,
13 domestic data center expansion, and tariff implementation. Program
14 effectiveness shall be measured by the percentage of AI hardware sourced
15 from allied nations, reduction of imports from adversary nations, growth in
16 domestic data center capacity, and speed of AI research and deployment in
17 critical sectors.

18 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2027.

19 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
