A Bill to Deploy Advanced Nuclear Technology to Secure Energy Independence

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall establish the Advanced Nuclear Deployment
2
3 Initiative (ANDI) to provide \$80 billion in federal subsidies and low-interest
4 loans for the immediate construction of Small Modular Reactors (SMRs)
5 and the hardening of the national transmission grid.
6

7 **SECTION 2.** A. Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) shall be defined as nuclear fission
8 reactors with a maximum capacity of 300 MW per unit, utilizing passive
9 safety systems that do not require operator intervention or external power
10 to prevent meltdowns. B. Hardening refers to the physical and
11 cybersecurity upgrades of the electrical grid to withstand EMPs, extreme
12 weather, and cyber-attacks
13

14 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Energy (DOE) shall streamline the licensing process for
15 SMRs, reducing the approval timeline to no more than 24 months for
16 designs previously certified by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC).
17 **Funding:** This legislation shall be funded by the rescission of \$80 billion in
18 unspent funds from the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) and the reallocation of
19 existing fossil fuel subsidies.

22 **SECTION 4.** **This legislation shall take effect at the beginning of FY 2027.**

24 **SECTION 5.** **All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void**

A Bill to Ban Companion Artificial Intelligence Chatbots

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** All online platforms and media that create, use, spread, and/or engage in the act
2 of having the user interact with any companion artificial intelligence (AI)
3 chatbot(s) in any way are now prohibited.

4 **SECTION 2.** To enforce this bill the following terms shall be defined as such:

5 A. The term “companion AI chatbot” means any software-based AI system or
6 program that exists for the primary purpose of simulating interpersonal or
7 emotional interaction, friendship, companionship, or therapeutic
8 communication with a user.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) shall enforce this Bill in the same manner, by
10 the same means, and with the same jurisdiction, powers, and duties as all
11 applicable terms and provisions of the Federal Trade Commission Act were
12 incorporated into and made a part of this Bill.

13 A. As outlined in 15 U.S. Code § 45: Any person, partnership, or corporation who
14 violates an order of the FTC after it has become final shall forfeit and pay to
15 the United States a civil penalty of no more than \$10,000 for each violation.

16 B. The FTC can send companies a “Notice of Penalty Offenses.” Companies that
17 receive this Notice and engage in prohibited practices face civil penalties of up
18 to \$50,120 per violation. The FTC adjusts the amounts of its civil penalty
19 maximums for inflation every January.

20 C. Each separate violation of an order shall be a separate offense, except that in
21 a case of a violation through continuing failure to obey a final order of the
22 FTC, each day of such failure or neglect shall be deemed a separate offense.

23 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation
24 are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Mandate Public Service

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The Federal Government shall require every American citizen to serve a
2 minimum of one year of public service, barring those with bona fide
3 medical or religious exemptions, those who are older than 18 at the time of
4 this bill's passage, and those living abroad at all times from age 18 to 24.
5 During the public service year, the citizen will be a full-time government
6 employee and receive government housing, utilities, basic clothing, food
7 stuff, medical care, and a payment of federal minimum wage.

8 **SECTION 2.** Acceptable forms of public service must include both military and
9 non-military service options. A citizen's service task(s) will be decided by
10 the government based on their preferences, education, skills, and abilities.

11 **SECTION 3.** The citizen may choose to start their year of service at any point before
12 their 24th birthday.

13 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Labor shall be tasked with establishment, oversight,
14 and enforcement of this program.

15 A. It shall be allocated additional funding as necessary.

16 B. Any citizen found in violation of this law shall be sentenced to no less than
17 a year in prison and no more than two years in prison.

18 **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect on FY 2028. All laws in conflict with this
19 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Dissolve the CIA

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- SECTION 1.** The Central Intelligence Agency will cease all operations and be disbanded permanently.
- SECTION 2.** The CIA's functions shall be transferred to the following agencies.
- A. The Department of Homeland Security shall assume all duties of foreign political and intelligence monitoring.
 - B. The CIA's jurisdiction over covert action shall be transferred to the military Joint Chiefs of Staff under the direction of the POTUS.
 - C. Any ongoing foreign CIA action and intervention operations shall cease upon the passage of this bill.
- SECTION 3.** The House Oversight Committee and House Select Committee on Intelligence shall oversee the implementation of this bill.
- SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2028. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Marquette University High School.

A Bill to Tax Carbon Emissions

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The government shall enforce a carbon tax on companies with high levels of carbon emissions and to put these funds towards renewable energy programs in the United States.

SECTION 2. Carbon emissions are defined as the release of carbon and other harmful greenhouse gasses into the atmosphere. In this case, a high level of emission is considered 10,000 metric tons of carbon or more annually.

SECTION 3. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will track and measure carbon pollution from companies, while The Department of the Treasury will collect levied tax.

A. An initial tax of \$35 per metric ton of carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e) shall be levied on applicable entities with scaled rates determined by company size. This rate shall increase by 5% plus the rate of inflation annually to ensure continued efficacy.

B. Companies must file quarterly emission reports to the EPA. Failure to file accurate reports or pay the tax within 90 days of the fiscal year's end will result in a civil penalty equal to 150% of the unpaid tax obligation, in addition to the original tax owed.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Reagan High School.

A Bill to Abolish the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** ICE shall hereafter be dismantled with agency duties separated through
3 respective existing Federal Agencies.

4 A. All ERO capabilities shall be eliminated from the agency and transferred to the
5 FBI to aid in the process of legally immigrating to the U.S.

6 B. Any Federal Funds allocated to the agency shall be transferred to the FBI and no
7 other funds shall be made available for the operation of the agency.

8 **SECTION 2.** ICE stands for the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency, a law
9 enforcement agency under the Department of Homeland Security.

10 A. ERO stands for Enforcement and Removal Operations which handles arrests,
11 deportations, and detention of immigrants.

12 B. FBI stands for the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

13 C. DOJ stands for the Department of Justice.

14 D. USCIS stands for U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.

15 E. CBP stands for Customs and Border Protection Agency.

16 F. DEA stands for the Drug Enforcement Agency.

17 **SECTION 3.** With the abolishment of ICE functions of its departments will be transferred to
18 the following departments.

19 A. Arrests and raids relating to human trafficking and drug smuggling shall be
20 carried out concurrently by the FBI and DEA with the DOJ facilitating proper legal
21 prosecution following Due Process outlined in the US Constitution.

22 B. The CBP will continue to protect the U.S. borders while helping migrants to
23 legally emigrate to the U.S. with an enforcement radius of 20 miles.

24 C. USCIS will increase its staffing to attempt to further the process of immigration.

25 D. The \$86.3 billion in funds that were previously allocated to ICE shall be used to
26 fund the changes in the Departments and Agencies necessary to carry out this
27 legislation.

28 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with this
29 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Waupaca High School.

A Bill to Implement a Universal Basic Income to Fulfill the Basic Needs of all Americans

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Financial support provided by the government in the form of standard,
2 recurring payments will hereby be distributed monthly.

3 **SECTION 2.** Universal Basic Income (UBI) is a government program providing regular,
4 unconditional cash payments to all citizens, regardless of income or work
5 status, to ensure basic needs are met, reduce poverty, and offer economic
6 security.

7 **SECTION 3.** Implementation and enforcement of this bill will be overseen by the
8 Treasury Department (via IRS).

9 A. Every household (legal documented residence) will receive \$1,000
10 monthly, which is distributed amongst any related child under the age
11 of 18 and any other adult also currently residing there.

12 B. The Treasury Department shall be given 3 trillion USD annually.

13 C. The Treasury Department shall form a sub-committee that is dedicated
14 to ensuring there will be no misappropriations of funds or fraud.

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of FY 2028. All laws in
16 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Synthetic Sanity

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The practice of synthetic sanity in correctional facilities shall hereafter be prohibited.

SECTION 2. For the purpose of this act, the term “synthetic sanity” is defined as the practice of forcibly medicating an insane criminal for the purposes of making them sufficiently sane to be eligible to be

SECTION 3. Enforcement of this Act shall be overseen by the U.S. Department of Justice
Jurisdictions include the following:

A. 1. The Civil Rights Division shall have authority to investigate allegations of synthetic sanity in all federal and state correctional facilities.

2. Any correctional facility found in violation shall be subject to:

- a. Civil penalties not exceeding \$250,000 per violation
- b. Loss or reduction of federal funding for correctional programs

3. Individuals subjected to synthetic sanity shall have the right to file a civil lawsuit for injunctive relief and damages in federal court.

4. The Department of Justice may seek court orders to immediately halt any ongoing violations.

B. 1. In any case where synthetic sanity is used and results in the execution of an individual, the immediate family or legal next of kin of the deceased shall have standing to bring a civil action for wrongful death in federal court.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1st, 2027.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Brookfield East

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Forbid Federal Debt

1 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,
3 which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution
4 when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states
5 within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

6 **ARTICLE --**

7 **SECTION 1:** The Federal Government of the United States shall be
8 forbidden from increasing the federal debt ceiling.

9 **SECTION 2:** The Federal Government of the United States shall be
10 required to decrease the federal debt limit by at least \$1
11 billion every fiscal year until it reaches \$0.

12 **SECTION 3:** Upon reaching a debt of \$0, the Federal Government of
13 the United States shall be forbidden from going into debt
14 in perpetuity.

15 **SECTION 4:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by
16 appropriate legislation.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Fort Atkinson High School.

A Bill to End Trade with Authoritarian Regimes

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall immediately end all arms sales or gifts to
2 authoritarian states.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** There will be a 5 year transition period, in which trade with authoritarian
4 states will gradually decrease, until it eventually ends. The People’s
5 Republic of China will be the only exception, in which there will be a 15
6 year transitional period.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** The President may not utilize any power granted by Congress to levy tariffs
8 in excess of 10% or make use of any war powers granted by Congress to
9 take military action against any country not considered authoritarian. The
10 President is granted Trade Promotion Authority to expand free trade
11 agreements with non-authoritarian governments for a period of 5 years
12 following the passage of this legislation.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** The Department of State will assemble a list of authoritarian countries
14 using the same criteria used by Freedom House. This list will be updated
15 annually and submitted to Congress for approval prior to coming into
16 effect.
- 17 **SECTION 5.** The Department of State will oversee the implementation of this
18 legislation.
- 19 **SECTION 6.** This legislation will take effect on FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this
20 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Streaming Entertainment Monopolies

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** No single streaming service or tv provider will any longer be allowed to hold a
3 monopoly to any certain televised event that has national interest to it.

4 **SECTION 2.** Certain events shall be defined as sporting events, award shows, political
5 debates, etc.

6 A. Streaming services shall be defined as companies such Hulu, Peacock,
7 Paramount+, ESPN+, Netflix, etc..

8 B. FTC stands for the Federal Trade Commission

9 C. FCC stands for the Federal Communications

10 **SECTION 3.** The FTC and FCC shall work concurrently through the newly formed Anti-Trust
11 Streaming Board (ASB) which would make sure that no one streaming company
12 has total rights to an event.

13 A. \$25 million shall be allocated when this bill takes effect in order to form the ASB.
14 Half of this shall come from the FTC budget and the other half shall come from
15 the FCC budget.

16 B. Then on \$5 million shall be allocated yearly in order to make sure that the board
17 keeps run

18 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in FY2028. All laws in conflict with this legislation
19 are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Waupaca High School.

A Bill to Re-establish The United States Agency for International Development

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Funding to The United States Agency for International
2 Development (USAID) be restored.

3 **SECTION 2.** USAID consisted of in-country field missions in order to
4 manage U.S. government programs in low income countries for disaster
5 relief; poverty relief; technical cooperation on global issues, including the
6 environment; U.S. bilateral interests; socioeconomic development; and
7 healthcare. Funding for USAID was suspended in July 2025 through
8 Executive Order 14169.

9 **SECTION 3.** USAID will be restored as an agency within the U.S.
10 Department of State at its FY 2024 level of funding of \$35.4 billion.

11 A. Funding for USAID will come from the budget of the U.S. Department of
12 State.

13 B. This legislation will restore the organizational structure of USAID to its
14 FY2024 state.

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of FY2027 All
16 laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Raise the Minimum Wage

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The federal minimum wage shall be raised from \$7.25 per hour to \$17.00 per hour. A. Year 1 (FY 2027): Federal minimum wage shall be raised to \$12.00 per hour. B. Year 2 (FY 2028): Federal minimum wage shall be raised to \$14.50 per hour. C. Year 3 (FY 2029): Federal minimum wage shall be raised to \$17.00 per hour.

SECTION 2. The federal minimum wage is defined as the minimum hourly pay that any employer is legally required to pay employees who are covered under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) of 1938. A. Tipped employees shall receive a minimum cash wage of \$9.00 per hour, with tips counted toward the full \$17.00 floor. B. Youth workers under the age of 20 may be paid a training wage of no less than \$12.00 per hour for the first 90 days of employment.

SECTION 3. The United States Department of Labor shall be responsible for the enforcement and implementation of this legislation. A. The Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division shall receive an additional \$500,000,000 to expand its workforce and audi capacity to enforce compliance. B. Employers found in violation shall be subject to fines not exceeding \$10,000 per violation per affected employee. C. Repeat violations may result in injunctions against the offending employer restricting continued business operations.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect at the beginning of FY 2027.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

The Railway Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall commit 1 trillion USD over 10 years towards the
2 expansion of Amtrak in the following ways:
- 3 A. Construction of new railways and passenger trains, prioritizing railways that
4 connect major cities.
- 5 B. Research aimed at lowering the cost of magnetic levitation systems.
- 6 **SECTION 2.** Amtrak shall no longer be a for-profit corporation, and the standard class of
7 its passenger services shall be made free to all American and Canadian
8 citizens.
- 9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Transportation shall be tasked with the implementation
10 and enforcement of this legislation.
- 11 A. It shall create and execute specific plans for the expansion of Amtrak.
- 12 B. Annual federal funding for the development of highways shall not
13 exceed annual federal funding for the development of railways.
- 14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this
15 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Retail Prediction Markets on Future Events to Prevent Market Manipulation

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** This legislation will prohibit retail prediction markets that allow independent individuals to trade
3 contracts based on the outcomes of future political, social, economic, or geopolitical events, including
4 but not limited to: elections, legislation, armed conflicts, and public health outcomes.

5 **SECTION 2.** Definitions: "Prediction Market" refers to any platform, exchange, or protocol that allows users to buy,
6 sell, or trade contracts whose value is derived from the outcome of a future event. "Event Based
7 Contract" refers to a financial instrument that pays out based on the occurrence or non-occurrence of
8 a real world event. "Independent individual" refers to any individual participant who is not a
9 registered institutional investor or academic researcher approved by a federal regulator.

10 **SECTION 3.** It shall be unlawful for any covered platform to offer, facilitate, or advertise event based contracts to
11 independent individuals within the United States. No prediction market shall be permitted to operate
12 under the jurisdiction of the United States unless explicitly authorized for academic research
13 purposes, or institutional risk hedging activities approved by a federal regulatory agency and
14 protected by contract. Platforms currently operating shall be required to cease offering prohibited
15 contracts within 180 days of enactment. Event contracts that do not involve a bona fide commercial
16 hedging purpose shall not be classified as commodities under the Commodity Exchange Act. All event
17 and hedge contracts will continue to be reviewed by the CFTC as they are in the status quo.

18 **SECTION 4.** The Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) shall have primary enforcement authority over
19 this legislation. The Department of Justice (DOJ) shall prosecute violations involving fraud, election
20 interference, or market manipulation. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) shall regulate advertising
21 practices and prohibit marketing that targets minors or misrepresents prediction markets as
22 "investing." Penalties for violation shall include civil fines of up to \$10 million per violation, criminal
23 liability for willful violations, and permanent bans from operating within U.S. jurisdiction.

24 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

25 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
