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A Bill to Revive LYMERix

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is hereby ordered to re-
3 authorize LYMERix for the general population, and Congress further
4 directs the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to provide
5 robust recommendations and framework for its distribution such that the
6 growing impacts of Lyme Disease might be curbed.

7 **SECTION 2.** Congress further encourages continued efforts to produce alternative
8 vaccinations to combat Lyme Disease as well as other tick-borne illnesses.

9 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the FDA and the CDC.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Mandate Police Access to Private Security Cameras

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

2 **SECTION 1.** Law enforcement agencies throughout the United States and its
3 territories are authorized to access any privately owned security camera
4 within their jurisdiction providing the camera is positioned such that it
5 captures a view of a public space, such as a sidewalk or roadway.

6 **SECTION 2.** When law enforcement has need of footage from such a camera, they
7 must formally request it from the camera's owner, who will then have 48
8 hours to comply with the request or to lodge a formal appeal. The law
9 enforcement request must clearly and precisely state why the footage is
10 needed.

11 **SECTION 3.** Each state and territory may determine what penalties, if any, are
12 appropriate for refusal to comply with a law enforcement request for
13 private camera footage, as well as the details of the appeal process

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Justice.

15 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

16 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Pets-in-Automobiles Welfare and Safety (PAWS) Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. All dogs and cats being transported in passenger vehicles must be safely secured with veterinarian-approved safety harnesses.

SECTION 2. Each state and territory may individually determine which safety harnesses are approved to meet the requirements of this legislation and keep our nation's pets safe, as well as what penalties are appropriate for motorists who violate this legislation.

SECTION 3. Any state or territory found to be in violation of this legislation shall lose federal highway funding until such time as compliance can be demonstrated.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) and the Department of Transportation.

SECTION 5. This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

SECTION 6. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
