A BILL TO PROTECT ASYLUM SEEKERS

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: Foreign Nationals not currently residing within the United States or a United States port
3 of entry, or those who have not been within the United States within the past year, are
4 hereby eligible to file Form I-589.

5 Article II: Foreign Nationals shall hereby be defined as persons who have emigrated to the United
6 States but not currently possessing U.S. citizenship; persons possessing Lawful
7 Permanent Resident status; or persons designated by law as a protected person.

8 Article III: The provisions of this bill shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

9 Article IV: The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) shall hereby be responsible for enforcing
10 the provisions of this bill.

11 A. 100 million dollars shall be redirected from the budget of the Department of War for
12 the purpose of handling immigration processing backlog and reinforcing existing
13 immigration systems.

14 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO STRENGTHEN SCHOOL SECURITY AND THREAT PREVENTION PROGRAMS

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: Public K–12 schools shall establish and maintain comprehensive security threat
3 prevention and response programs to protect students and staff from active threats,
4 intrusions, and other safety risks.

5 Article II: A. “Security threat” refers to any incident or credible risk that endangers the safety of
6 students and staff, including but not limited to active shooters, intruders, bomb threats, or
7 other violent acts.

8 B. “Threat prevention and response programs” refers to a structured plan including threat
9 assessment, prevention strategies, emergency drills, communication protocols, and
10 resolution efforts.

11 Article III: The provisions of this bill shall take effect on August 1, 2027

12 Article IV: A. The Department of Education, in partnership with the Department of Homeland
13 Security, shall issue national guidelines for school threat prevention programs and ensure
14 compliance.

15 B. All Schools shall establish secure entry and emergency communication systems, a
16 school threat assessment team, and conduct security threat drills to identify risks.

17 C. Provide recovery resources including counseling for students and staff after an
18 incident or drill.

19 D. \$10 billion shall be allocated from general revenues to effectuate this legislation.

20 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO REDISTRIBUTE IMMIGRATIONS & CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT FUNDING

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: Funding for Immigration & Customs enforcement (ICE) will be reduced to \$25 billion, which will be preserved and redistributed. All remaining funds in excess of this amount are hereby returned to the general fund of the United States Treasury.

Article II: “Redistributed” shall mean the mandatory redirection of ICE budgetary priorities away from detention expansion and toward agency-wide civil-right compliance, professional procedures, background checks for officers and field safety.

Article III: The provisions of this bill shall take effect on January 1, 2027.

Article IV: The Department of Homeland Security, in coordination with the Office of Management and Budget, shall oversee the implementation and enforcement of this legislation.

A. Enforcement shall occur through mandatory compliance inspections, budget freezes, and financial penalties assessed against non-compliant ICE field offices after a 1-year grace period.

B. All federal immigration detention facilities slated for closure under this budget reduction shall transition under the direct management of the General Services Administration for decommissioning or civilian repurpose.

C. Funding for the national officer retraining rollout shall be derived from a 20% annual budget contribution from the preserved \$25,000,000,000 asset pool held by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement.

Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO BAN THE USAGE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN THE U.S. BANKING SYSTEM

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I: All federally regulated financial institutions shall be banned from utilizing artificial intelligence systems in any banking operation or service.

Article II: A. “Artificial Intelligence” shall mean any computational system capable of performing tasks, generating outputs, or influencing decisions through autonomous technologies.

B. “Financial Institution” shall include all federally regulated banks, credit unions, savings associations, and other entities under federal banking oversight.

Article III: This legislation will go into effect on January 1st, 2028.

Article IV: The Federal Reserve, Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) shall jointly enforce this act.

A. \$5 billion over the next five fiscal years shall be provided in order to fund a grant system for applicable financial institutions to assist in recruiting and retaining personnel necessary to perform functions previously conducted by artificial intelligence systems.

Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

6 time frames; and
7 Whereas: Recent dissolution of large commercial airlines has exacerbated aforementioned issues
8 and left consumers with even fewer carrier options;
9 Therefore, be it resolved by this NCFL Student Congress here assembled that: The United States
10 shall endeavor to establish and operate National Common Carrier airline. And, be it
11 Further Resolved, that: this NCFL Student Congress here assembled calls for collaborative detailed
12 reporting from the Federal Aviation Administration, Transportation Security
13 Administration, Department of Transportation in tandem with the Congressional
14 Research Service and Congressional Budget Office to effectuate future legislation in
15 furtherance of this resolution.
