A BILL TO PROTECT AMERICAN OIL PRODUCTION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. A. Oil companies will be allocated shares of the anticipated US oil

markets at the beginning of each fiscal year.

B. If companies produce more oil than their allotments permit, they are

forbidden to sell the oil and must store the excess at their own expense

until they have permission to sell in the future.

C. A tariff equal to 20% of the global market price of oil shall be put on

oil imports.

SECTION 2. The allotments must make up at least 85% of the domestic oil market.

SECTION 3. A. The Environmental Protection Agency and the Office of Management

and Budget will oversee the allocation of oil market shares.

B. The United States International Trade Commission shall oversee the

tariff on oil imports.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect 91 days after passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Create a Universal Reserve Currency

- 1 **WHEREAS,** The United States has too much control over international economic
2 affairs; and
- 3 **WHEREAS,** The Federal Reserve, as a national central bank, cannot properly control
4 global economic policy; now, therefore, be it
- 5 **RESOLVED,** That the United States shall encourage the International Monetary Fund
6 (IMF) to establish a Universal Reserve Currency (URC) independent of any
7 nation to be held in substantial quantities by national governments; and,
8 be it
- 9 **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That URC tender shall have no intrinsic value and shall be directly
10 convertible to a standard determined by the IMF to reflect the collective
11 economic strength of the G8 nations.

A BILL TO LIMIT INQUIRIES INTO CRIMINAL HISTORY

1 **Section 1:** To prohibit employers from requesting that an applicant for employment
2 disclose criminal history record information before the applicant has received a
3 conditional offer. This act shall not apply to employment in sensitive positions.

4 **Section 2:** "Sensitive Positions" shall include any position working with children, in law
5 enforcement, that deal with national security or are otherwise defined as sensitive in
6 regulations enacted by the U.S. Department of Labor pursuant to this Act.

7 **Section 3:** This act shall take effect six months after date of enactment.

8 **Section 4:** The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) shall
9 oversee the enforcement of this act.

10 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this act are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Join the International Criminal Court

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT

2 **Section 1:** The Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court is hereby ratified.

3 **Section 2:** The United States will uphold its obligations as a party to the Rome

4 Statute and co-operate with the Court when required, and will act to

5 support the investigations of genocide, crimes against humanity, and

6 war crimes conducted by the Court into foreign nationals, whenever

7 possible.

9 **Section 3:** The United States will consequently be entitled to participate in the

10 proceedings of the Court, including but not limited to elections of

11 judges and the prosecutor and deliberations on the budget of the Court.

12 **Section 4:** This bill shall be implemented by November 1, 2015.

13 **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Aid Israel to Bolster Security

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will provide military aid to Israel to strengthen their
3 defensive infrastructure from hostile powers.

4 **SECTION 2.** "Defensive infrastructure" shall be defined as any sanctions of the Israeli
5 armed forces that oversee domestic security.

6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State and Department of the Treasury will oversee
7 the enforcement of this bill.

8 A. \$100 million dollars will be allocated directly to the Israeli Ministry of
9 Defense.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Reauthorize the Export-Import Bank and Re-secure American Jobs and Manufacturing

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Congress shall reinstate the Import-Export Bank's charter for another 4 years

SECTION 2. The Import Export Bank is a independent government agency that acts as the official export credit agency of the United States.

SECTION 3. The US treasury shall oversee any additional funding needed to reactivate the bank

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect one month after passage

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Bolster the National Security through Cyber Security

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States Cyber Command, also known as USCYBERCOM, will undergo budget increases. The first year will see an increase of 10% over last year's budget. Each year thereafter, the budget will increase at a rate of 5% per year for the next 10 years.

SECTION 2. These increased funds shall be used specifically for the defense of these United States against cyber-attacks by foreign entities, as well as for increased cyber defense research. Research shall be defined as experimenting, producing, and determining the effectiveness of a method, with the aim of future implementation of that method.

SECTION 3. Upon the implementation of these budget increases, there will be USCYBERCOM-specific audits every two years to determine whether the funds are sufficient and being spent properly, to ensure that our cyberspace is adequately defended, and to determine whether or not the program shall be extended beyond the initial 10 years.

SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect immediately after its passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Migrant Crisis Resolution Act of 2015

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States will accept a maximum of 500,000 migrants currently
3 fleeing the war-torn Middle East through calendar year 2016.

4 **SECTION 2.** Migrants will be defined as any Middle Eastern man, woman, or child
5 currently residing in Europe that has not already been given residency or
6 asylum.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State will be tasked with accepting these 500,000
8 migrants in the next 12 months.

9 A. The Department of Homeland Security will work alongside this effort
10 in providing any necessary benefits to the migrants. An additional
11 \$30,000,000 will be allotted to the budget of this department.

12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect one month after passage.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Invest in Alternative Energy

A Bill to Limit the Use of Solitary Confinement

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Federal prisons shall adopt a new set of criteria to determine
3 whether an inmate may be sent to solitary confinement.

4 A. This criteria requires evidence of violence within the
5 prison and/or its facilities.

6 **SECTION 2.** Upon entering confinement, prisoners shall be informed of the
7 duration of their punishment.

8 A. Mentally ill prisoners shall be granted shorter periods of time
9 spent in isolation.

10 **SECTION 3.** **The Federal Bureau of Prisons shall oversee the implementation**
11 **of this law.**

12 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect one-hundred days after its enactment.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
14 and void.

A BILL TO REQUIRE A MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING BEFORE THE PURCHASE OF A FIREARM

1. **Section 1:** Require all persons who submit an application to purchase a gun from
2. a federally licensed dealer to submit a standardized mental health screening preformed
3. by a licensed mental health professional. The mental health professional shall provide the
4. screening results directly to the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives.
5. (ATF).
6. **Section 2:** The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives shall enforce this
7. act and the United States Department of Health and Human Services shall determine the
8. screening requirements.
9. **Section 3:** This act shall be implemented 3 months after the date of enactment.
10. **Section 4:** All laws in conflict with this act are hereby declared null and void.

**A BILL TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN AID TO
YEMEN**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States federal government shall provide 500 million dollars
3 annually for a period of five years in humanitarian support directly to the
4 people of Yemen.

5 **SECTION 2.** Humanitarian aid shall be defined as the construction of rudimentary
6 surface transportation systems, well drilling and the construction of basic
7 sanitation facilities, medical assistance and the construction and repair of
8 public facilities.

9 **SECTION 3.** USAID shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

10 **SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented immediately.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
