# A Bill to Eliminate Federal Sin Taxes to Grant Americans Greater Personal Freedom

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT

- 1 Section 1 All federal sin taxes are hereby repealed.
- 2 Section 2 These taxes include the federal tax on beer and other liquors, wine, and tobacco.
- 3 Section 3 This bill shall be overseen by the Internal Revenue Service and the Bureau of Alcohol,
- 4 Tobacco, and Firearms.
- 5 **Section 4** This bill will take effect on January 1st, 2017
- 6 Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

8		Service.

11		interest for pain and suffering. This shall not be in excess of 3 billion dollars, but can be no
12		less.

3		corresponding reductions in the income tax.

10		the Food and Drug Administration.		
11	Section 4	This bill will go into effect one year after its passage.

14	Section 3	This legislation will take effect six months after its passage
15	Section 4	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
16		null and void.

- 15 Section 5. This shall take effect at the beginning of the 2017 fiscal year.
- Section 6. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A Bill to Offer Temporary Asylum to Syrian Refugees

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** The United States shall accept Syrian Refugees until 2018 and offer temporary asylum for these refugees until 2020.
- SECTION 2. A. Syrian Refugee is defined as any citizen of Syria fleeing the civil war.
  - **B.** The vetting process shall be a simple criminal background check.
  - C. All fees for Border Crossing Cards and work visas shall be waved.
- **SECTION 3.** The Center for Immigration Services shall oversee the enforcement of this legislation.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect as soon as passed.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby considered null and void.
