- **SECTION 2.** Training shall be defined as any help not resulting in the transfer of weapons or other materials used to cause harm.
- **SECTION 3.** The Department of Defense will be tasked with the execution and funding of this bill.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take immediately after passage.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The United States shall legalize the possession of recreational amounts of the following drugs less than or equal to: 25 g Cannabis, 10 g Opium, 5 g Hashish, 2.5 g Cannabis Oil, 2 g Cocaine (Hydrochloride), 2 g Morphine, 1 g MDMA, 1 g Heroin, 1 g Methadone, 1 g Amphetamine, 0.5 g Pure THC, 0.3 g Cocaine (Benzoylecgonine), 0.1 g PCP, and 500 μg LSD.
 - B. Persons caught in possession of quantities larger than what is specified shall be punished as if they were selling drugs
 - C. Funding from the Mérida Initiative and the Central America Regional Security
 Initiative (CARSI) will be diverted to improve and build new drug rehabilitation
 centers and syringe and Needle exchange programs will be established
- **SECTION 2**. This legislation is modeled after Portugal's law 30/2000
- SECTION 3. The Drug Enforcement Administration and The Department of Health and

 Human Services will be tasked with the execution of this bill
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect one year after passage
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The CBS Prisoner Protection Act of 2016

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The CBS Prisoner Protection Act (Commonly referred to as the

Cruz-Bezner-Samuel Initiative) aims to uphold prisoners' eighth amendment
rights by banning the use of solitary confinement as a punishment in federal
prisons.

SECTION 2. Solitary confinement is defined as a form of imprisonment in which an inmate is imprisoned in a jail cell away from prisoner to prisoner contact for more than 24 hours at a time.

SECTION 3. The Department of Justice will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.

- A. A prisoner who wishes to receive an isolated cell must submit a written response to The Department of Justice to provide his/her reasoning for asking for this special accommodation; furthermore, the prisoner will receive physical and mental screenings to determine if the prisoner is healthy enough to decide to be placed in an isolated cell.
- B. Any federal prison found in contempt of this policy will be subject to a swift and extensive investigation by The Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General.

SECTION 4. This bill will go into effect 90 days after passage.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO REPLACE THE WAR POWERS RESOLUTION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1**. The War Powers Resolution is hereby repealed. The new policy is as follows: the President must ask for Congressional approval within seven days of ordering deployment of combat and non-covert operations into a foreign territory, and then again after every 90 days.
 - A. Every 90 days, Congress must vote on the passage of a new 90 day period.
 - B. If the 90 day period elapses without Congressional approval, then the President must pull all combat forces out of the area in which he originally deployed them.
- **SECTION 2**. Combat operations shall be defined as any U.S military operation that is engaged in fighting other armed forces.
 - A. Armed forces shall be defined as a unified group's military forces.
 - B. Covert operations shall be defined as those planned and executed so as to conceal the identity of or permit plausible denial by the sponsor.
 - C. Foreign territory shall be defined as any land that is not under the jurisdiction of the United States.
- **SECTION 3.** The United States Congress, in conjunction with the President of the United States, will oversee the implementation of this legislation.
- **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect immediately.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
