The Harbor Creek Forensics Team would like to extend an invitation to you and to your students for the CFL of Erie Tournament to be held on **Thursday, February 18, 2016**, at Harbor Creek Jr./Sr. High School.

Registration will take place in the cafeteria between 3:15 – 3:45 PM in order to start Round 1 promptly at 4:00 PM. When traveling on Depot Road, use the first entrance on the left (coming from I-90) or the second entrance on the right (coming from Route 20/Buffalo Road). The cafeteria is located on the south side of the building.

Judging Quotas are as follows (regular season):

- Speech: 1 judge for every five contestants or fraction thereof
- Congress: 1 judge for every ten competitors or fraction thereof
- Debate: 1 judge for every two entries or fraction thereof

Please provide the required judges for student entries to prevent forced student drops due to not meeting a judge quota.

This is the last regular season competition before the March 5, 2016, National Qualifier at Gannon University. As a reminder, in order to compete at that tournament, a student needs to compete in at least one regular season competition this year. Also, in order for a judge to meet the criteria for the National Qualifier, he/she must have judged in one regular season competition.

Pizza, snacks, water, and soda will be available for students to purchase throughout the evening. Also, the judges' lounge will have food available for all judges, coaches, and bus drivers.
