

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Remove Life Tenures for Supreme Court Justices

RESOLVED, by two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

ARTICLE --

SECTION 1: All Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States appointed after the ratification will not have life long tenures.

SECTION 2: A term limit for a Supreme Court justice will be 12 years unless the justice faces illness, death, or chooses to retire.

SECTION 3: The Congress here assembled shall have the authority to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.
