THE PRISONER RE-ENTRY ACT OF 2017

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1 . A. The United States Federal Government will mandate that all records of
3	federal nonviolent criminals and their crimes are erased when they have
4	completed their sentence and have been released back into society.
5	B. All employers will be prohibited from asking if a job applicant has been
6	convicted of a nonviolent crime.
7	C. States that comply with these policies will receive a 5% increase in
8	federal infrastructure funding.

17		implemented policies to monitor compliance; (4) conduct ongoing and
18		comprehensive quality assurance programs, including blind testing; (5) agree tha laboratories approved by the Secretary shall be used to test product samples; (6)
19		receive a certification from the Secretary of Health and Human Services that the
20		meet the above criteria, including any of the regulations determined by the
21		Secretary of Health and Human Services, and renew their certification every two
22		years.

A Bill to Make Graduation Pay

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** The United States will implement a nationwide high school conditional cash transfer program with a goal to help american families prioritize education.
- SECTION 2. A. The Conditional Cash Transfer program gives students a monetary benefit for meeting certain benchmarks pertaining to satisfactory academic progress toward attaining a high school diploma.
 - A. Every day a student attends school, the parent or legal guardian of the student will receive a 10 dollar allowance.
 - B. At the end of a formal grade reporting period, every passing grade (C or higher) will result in 10 more dollars the family can receive.
 - B. Any public Title 1 High School shall qualify for this program.
- **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education (DOE) will oversee the implementation of this bill.
 - A. The DOE will solicit applications from the states for block grants that will be used to fund these programs. Each state is responsible for the proper allocation of funds.
 - B. Federal funding is contingent upon the states having applications for the program and the implementations need to meet Department of Education standards.
- **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect during the Fiscal Year 2018
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. Introduced for Congressional Debate by Aarushi Sahejpal from Presentation High School.

A Bill to end the Genocide of the Rohingya

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: **SECTION 1**.

The United states shall provide 500 million dollars annually in developmental aid over the next 10 years to the government of Myanmar for the Rohingya people. Along with this, the US should continue to encourage the government of Myanmar to end discrimination within their own nation. The secretary of state will be required to annually investigate aid effectiveness. If no significant change is seen, the Secretary of state shall pass a report to congress. if no significant change manifests within one decade, the US will encourage a full sanctioning of the Burmese government.

SECTION 2.

Significant change shall be defined as the ending to the forced displacement, murder and Genocide of the Rohingya minority. Genocide shall be defined under the definition provided by Article 2 of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (1948). Developmental aid will be targeted at food, water and any basic necessities that are required.

SECTION 3.

The funding for this legislation will be appropriated from the Treasury by removing all federal Oil subsidies. The Secretary of State will be in charge in determining the effectiveness of aid. Aid can only be removed if the report submitted contains evidence of misuse that is counterproductive to the intention of the legislation.

SECTION 4.

This legislation will go into effect immediately after passage

All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Diminish Illegal Immigration Humanely by Employing More Immigration Judges and Border Patrol Agents Without Repealing Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	A. Congress shall allow Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) to	
3		temporarily continue until the number of immigration judges and border patrol officers is	
4		increased to 760 and 30,000 respectively. More courts and inland patrol lookouts will be created	
5		to accommodate these employees.	
6		B. After DACA expires all individuals previously protected by it will be allowed to remain in the	
7		United States with full citizenship protections.	
8		C. The Customs and Border Protection's scope of jurisdiction will be limited to an official 25-mile	
9		border zone.	
10	SECTION 2.	A. "Immigration judges" shall be those who specifically, under delegated authority from the	
11		Attorney General, interpret and administer federal immigration laws by conducting immigration	
12		court proceedings, appellate reviews, and administrative hearings.	
13		B. "Border zone" shall be defined as the zone in which CBP officials have the authority to stop and	
14		conduct searches on vessels, trains, aircraft, or other vehicles as well as enter private property
