## A Bill to Move the Date of Halloween Celebrations

- 1. Whereas although Halloween is not recognized as a federal holiday it is celebrated across the
- 2. country on October 31st; and
- 3. Whereas this date may fall on any day of the week leading to disruption for families as work
- 4. and school schedules must be altered to accommodate Halloween celebrations; and
- 5. Whereas moving the date of celebration to Saturday would be beneficial in many ways;
- 6. **Therefore, BE IT ENACTED** by this student congress here assembled; that
- 7. Section 1: Halloween is hereby designated as a federal holiday and all federal government
- 8. offices shall be closed and all non-essential personnel shall have the day off.
- 9. Section 2: Beginning in 2018 and continuing in perpetuity the federal holiday of Halloween
- 10. shall be observed on the last Saturday in October.
- 11. Section 3: This congress encourages all states, municipalities, businesses, and schools to follow
- 12. suit and likewise observe the holiday on the last Saturday in October.

## The Zombie Bank Account act of 2017

- 1. Whereas banks have engaged in the practice of reopening closed accounts when a deposit or
- 2. automatic withdrawal is presented; and
- 3. Whereas these so-called "Zombie Accounts" may result in substantial fees, penalties, and
- 4. financial hardships for consumers;
- 5. Section 1 The Truth in Savings Act of 1991 is hereby amended by inserting the following
- 6. language after section 268 -
- 7. [(a) A federally insured bank or Credit union may not prohibit a consumer from closing an
- 8. account regardless of whether the balance in the account is positive, zero, or negative.
- 9. (b) A federally insured bank or credit union may not charge any fees to close an account.
- 10. (3) A federally insured bank or credit union may not reopen a closed account unless the
- 11. consumer explicitly requests that the account be reopened.]
- 12. Section 2 The Federal Reserve Board and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation shall be
- 13. responsible for enforcement of these regulations.
- 14. Section 3 Consumers may report violation to the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, and
- 15. said agency shall be responsible for investigating complaints of "Zombie Accounts".
- 16. Section 4 All laws in conflict are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Allow Open Air Burning of Human Remains

- 1. Whereas the use of an open-air funeral pyre for the burning of human remains is illegal in most
- 2. states, and
- 3. Whereas the tradition of the pyre has been an important cultural tradition for many cultures
- 4. including but not limited to the Romans, the Vikings, and Native Americans, and
- 5. Whereas pyres are the traditional method of cremation of the dead in both the Hindu and Sikh
- 6. religions, and
- 7. Whereas this congress ought to take a role in protecting and preserving cultural and religious
- 8. traditions, therefore;
- 9. **Be it resolved** by this congress here assembled that <u>states may not prohibit</u> the use of funeral
- 10. pyres for the cremation of the dead and must establish reasonable guidelines that will allow the
- open-air burning of dead bodies on private land.
- 12. **Be it further resolved** that while states may establish reasonable regulations and require
- 13. permits, any restrictions must not be created in a way that imposes undue burdens or
- 14. unreasonable requirements on the families of the deceased.
