I realize that many of us are gearing up for Districts & the State Speech Tournament, but it is also time to start thinking about the National Qualifying Tournament. Please take the time to carefully review all the enclosed material and pay particular attention to all deadlines and required forms.

Registration, documents & fees (PLEASE) are due to Grant Campbell by 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, February 17th. In a perfect world, I would love it if you could hand me your <u>MATERIALS AND PAYMENT</u> at CHSAA Districts on February 10th.

Rocky Mountain North NSDA District Tournament will be held at four locations:

<u>Speech Events</u> - Saturday, February 24th at Resurrection Christian School

<u>Debate Events</u> - Friday, March 2 through Saturday, March 3 at Rocky Mountain HS

<u>Congressional Debate</u> - Saturday, March 24th at Holy Family HS

<u>Big Questions Debate</u> - Saturday, April 7th at Fairview HS

Read Me:

PLEASE read this a packet of information regarding the tournament. Make sure you have read and understand all of the guidelines for the tournament. Please review both this reminder as well as the CURRENT information on the NSDA website.

Registration:

- 1. We will use TABROOM.COM to register.
- 2. Review the Powerpoint I sent out regarding the registration process.

- 1. You will need to log on to JoT (or create a new account).
- 2. From there, scroll down, find and click: "Rocky Mountain North NSDA District" on 2/24/18

Financial Notes:

- 1. Remember that you must have all dues and student memberships paid to the NSDA before the tournament begins.
- 2. Make plans to get your fees for this district tournament IN WITH YOUR REGISTRATION by 2/17/18. I need to have the \$\$ in advance in order to have cash to pay judges.
- 3. Make your checks payable to:

Entry fees:

- 1. Single person event = \$20
- 2. Team event = \$40

Entries & Quotas:

- 1. Please remember that Duo, Cross-Examination Debate, and Public Forum Debate count as one entry. Students who are entered in any of the team events (Duo, Public Forum, PolicyDebate) may also be double entered in a single event (including congress) as per our district policy. However, students who are doubled in a team event and an individual event and who happen to qualify in both events must attend the national tournament in the team event.
- 2. Remember to get your NSDA points recorded before 2/17 so they count towards your total team degrees for the district tournament quota allowances. With the online system, your members and degrees will need to be updated via tabroom.com. Simply resync your tabroom roster with the NSDA via your tabroom dashboard.
- 3. Entries in the District Tournament are based on members and degrees on record at the National Office as of one week prior to those events. Thus, **only those students who are members of NSDA prior to February 17, 2018 can participate in the District Tournament.**
- 4. I HIGHLY recommend filling in the alternate spots on your entry form in case you have to swap somebody drop due to illness, disciplinary issues, etc.

In case you may have forgotten about, or are unfamiliar with, the up/down procedure at this tournament, here's a reminder:

- Each student is guaranteed only two rounds of competition.
- At any time that a student has two downs, he/she is eliminated from the tournament. A down is defined as a loss (in debate) or placing 4ⁿ, 5ⁿ, 6ⁿ, or 7ⁿ in a round of five or seven. (In a round of four placing 3ⁿ or 4ⁿ would be a "down.") ... Questions? Please ask.
- In events, rounds continue until we have seven or fewer competitors; at that point, we would have a final round.

· Please read your manuals and bring them with you (especially in the debate areas) for the full range of procedural instructions.
