SR. PASTOR REPORT

The LORD your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; He will rejoice over you with gladness;
He will quiet you by his love; He will exult over you with loud singing.”
Zephaniah 3:17 (ESV)

What an encouraging verse! The fact that God rejoices over us, delights in us, chooses to love us and to extol over us loudly is all too wonderful to take in. We may not see why He chose us but knowing He delights in us gives us assurance of Him not being distant but active in our lives.

This year we could see His hand moving in the church. God has always loved Trinity, cared for her and always, always provided for us. It is encouraging to watch Him move through the His people here in Trinity.

To begin this report, I want to acknowledge some of the ways He has moved people and brought more life into the church. We set out back in 2024 to grow the discipleship ministries in the church, ministries that would help us grow in our passion, knowledge and walk with Him. We prayed that God would begin burdening people to lead small groups, prayer meetings, youth ministry and children's ministry. And this year we saw some of the fruit and answer to those prayers.

This year Chuck put together an events team. They are the ones who creatively planned and provided exciting large events for our church family to join in and bring those they are investing in. They put together a Gala, pine car derby race, family field day and the Harvestfest. These completely unique ministries were well planned, organized and so much fun for everyone who came out.

I'd like to thank the youth team who faithfully served, grew and learned enough to take over. In the fall semester they told me to step aside and teach Bible study on Wednesday nights so that parents would be able to attend. Under their leadership the youth continue to grow and learn. Youth ministry has always been one of the strongest parts of Trinity and now we have some of the best leaders we have ever had.

Steve approached me and, in the fall, began a weekly prayer meeting. This is a time that restores the soul. If you have not attended, I strongly urge you to come out Tuesday nights at 6pm. Prayer is the primary work of God's people, and it is good to be in His presence with other believers.

Marion felt God leading her to reach the women with a Bible study, so she approached Gena, and they started a study that gets women together to study God's word. There is such a good group of women that they had to do the Bible study at 2 different times. I am thankful not just for Marion listening to God but also for the hunger He has placed in the hearts of the women of Trinity for His truth, His word and His presence.

Thea also started getting the women together for fellowship because she knew that was a need God was asking her to fill. The women have gotten together for breakfast before church, had a movie night and a craft day. It has been a huge blessing for women to come together and just enjoy each other.

Dan and Bill followed suit leading men's breakfasts which provide a place for men to come together and grow friendships.

All these new ministries have 2 things in common they are led by people who obeyed what God had put on their hearts and have brought new life and depth to Trinity. I am so thankful that God is actively pursuing and pushing Trinity.

These new ministries only enhance what God had already begun in us. I'd like to report on the other ministries God continues to bless us with. There have been a few Bible studies that have been active and growing for years. The men's Saturday morning Bible study continues. This year they studied Proverbs and Job. It is so good to see men gather for worship and to study God's word!

Monday morning, we are studying one book at a time. This year we are looking at the life of Paul which will lead us to all his letters. Studying God's word in community like this has changed my life and given me a deeper passion for His word. I have learned so much thanks to all those who come and share.

In the spring we had 4 small groups meet for 4 weeks. It was great to be in each other's homes challenging each other to grow deeper and to live life with each other.

The young adults have been a blessing to Trinity for years. Their passion and heart to serve have helped the church through difficult times including COVID. They have served on the worship and AV teams, organized and helped with large group events and helped assist and lead youth and kid's ministry. Our Sunday night small group for young adults has been a place for them to dive deep and to build deeper relationships. In the fall we took a break from the Sunday night asking the young adults to join us in the new ministries and Bible studies that have begun. Please be praying as we reorganize to meet the needs of this incredibly valuable group.

I have already mentioned what's been going on in our youth ministry but please continue to pray as we prepare for this new year. We have retreats planned to Lake Champion and The Philly Project. This next year will be one of transition for a lot of our leaders with new responsibilities, new jobs, weddings and internships. Pray for our leaders as they serve and pray for new leaders to step up as this ministry continues to grow.

As we continue to move down our age groups we come to our amazing kids church and nursery ministries. As you have seen we have a lot of babies again in the church and I want to thank you all who serve them and our young families in the nursery.

Once again, this year Mrs. Patty has followed her passion to teach kids and give them more than just a story but a chance to experience the Bible as it comes alive. Sadly, we have had a few of kid's church workers step down for various reasons. I want to thank Jim for his years of faithful service to our kids as he has felt lead to go to Sojourn where his kids and granddaughter are, helping that church to be a place where his family will continue to grow. Mrs. Jan has also been invaluable to our kids and is currently healing from a rough fall and continually needs our prayers. If you have not seen Gena in a while it's because as these leaders have stepped away, she has continued to step up each week. I can't thank her enough for all that she pours into the most valuable ministry in the church. Please pray that God would provide workers for our amazing kids church ministry. If you are feeling led to help, please see Gena.

During the year our District Superintendent decided to come for a visit one Sunday. I was speaking at the Chinese Church that week. He called and said he had been to a lot of churches, but our greeting,

ushers and security team made him feel incredibly welcome and comfortable. Thank you all so much for how well you serve in these ministries making us all feel seen, known, loved and safe.

I get asked all the time from other pastors how I manage our worship team. These questions always make me appreciate our team and their leadership team. All of you who serve on AV and worship teams you have made it a joy to be your pastor. You have led us for years into the presence of God. Thank you for making our Sunday mornings about the amazing God that you serve so well.

One of the most impactful ministries we have is our Cares Ministry with our Mason Jar Ministry. This year was a hard year with a lot of unexpected bumps in the road for so many of us. Whether we were sick, having surgery, mourning a loss or just felt down it was amazing to know that someone was praying, visiting, feeding and just all around caring for us. Cathy thank you for caring enough to visit! Leah, Donna and the whole crew thank you for the encouragement through cards, food, flowers and love. You show more than the hands of Christ, you show His heart. Thank you.

It was a year that encouraged me greatly as I saw so many experiencing the joy of obeying and serving the Lord. This year to come I am expecting to be much of the same. Usually in my report I like to share all the new things we will be doing and give direction and vision for the new year. This report is a little different. This summer many of you filled out a PEAK survey. Since that time a small leadership team has been meeting with a team from the district as they coach us.

We will be meeting through March. This PEAK coaching is very helpful as we strategically plan how we will continue to grow the church and communicate the gospel to our community. We will be coming up with pathways for discipleship and leadership along with strategies to strengthen the church in other areas. I will keep you updated on our progress and what we learn as we go through this process.

One last thing for this year to come that I want you to be aware of and praying for. For the past few years Pastor Rory has been working on ordination. Simply put, it is the process by which the Christian and Missionary Alliance approves and accredits pastors. He began this process because he saw God giving him more opportunities to preach both at Trinity and in other churches. He felt called to be in ministry but felt something was missing. He did not like preaching without being tested and approved. Last year he passed his written exam and has been studying for his oral interview. Once he passes the interview, he will be a licensed ordained reverend. I am so proud of how hard and diligently he has worked.

I see God's timing in this. As we have been going through PEAK one thing is glaringly obvious and not much of a surprise. The words intentional and systematic have come up time and time again. I know my ministry is highly personal and relational, but it is not systematic. While that is not one of my priorities or gifts it is necessary for the church to grow. Those just happen to be Rory's strengths. I'm so grateful for him and the ability to partner with him.

I am excited for another year for the opportunity to see what God is going to do in your life, your families and our church. I am so thankful you have trusted me and allowed me to have a front row seat in watching God complete the work He has begun in you because He delights in you. Thank you again!

CARE & OUTREACH MINISTRY REPORTS

240 care packages have gone out from Jan 1, 2025 – Dec 31, 2025. We continue to operate under the premise of mourning, encouraging and supporting, welcoming, and celebrating together. Leah Johnson is the main contact for this ministry. Cathy Morris is still a valuable member but has branched out into a visitation ministry that is vital and necessary to the church body. She consistently shows up and stays with people longer than dropping off a Mason Jar package: listening, praying and encouraging each person. Donna Hudson continues to show up early Sunday mornings to help pack bags, write out cards and make bags look beautiful as well as keep the ministry stocked with soup, muffins and cookies. Her heart for this ministry is evident by the care she takes and her dedication. We were joined this year by Lilly (and Theo) Conley. They took on a lot of the shopping, which was a great help. The Mason Jar Ministry also added Annette Kruse in the role of sending out cards and praying over needs and requests. I could go on and on about the support that this ministry receives and our goal is to make sure everyone has a place to serve (baking, cooking, making applesauce, buying supplies). We are very blessed to have such an amazing, hardworking, cohesive group. The ministry has continued to be blessed by the amazing support from the church in the form of soup, baked goods, individual meals, and much more. Trinity Alliance Church is a very giving and loving church and that is evident in the way that the MJM freezer has remained full (sometimes to overflowing) over the past year. Most care packages go out on Sunday still and church members continue to be a blessing and be blessed by loving and learning together. We are blessed with the team of people we have but are always willing to make room for those who feel called to serve in this way.

Meal Ministry

The Meal Ministry has also been busy this past year with 69 meals sent out. The ministry provides full meals for individuals and/ or families that need help based on a variety of needs (surgery, new baby, etc). We are not a ministry that is limited to the church family only but are ready and willing to help with families outside of the church as the need arises. The church is blessed with an abundance of talent, willing hearts and hands, and generosity in helping with this ministry. Leah Johnson is the point person for this ministry.

Cookies for the Rescue Mission

Once a month volunteers provide baked goods for the Rescue Mission ministry. If anyone would like to be a part providing baked goods, please see Leah Johnson.

Thanksgiving Baskets

This year Trinity raised money to donate 180 brownie mix and 180 apple juices to Beacon Church for their Thanksgiving Basket donations. At the last minute, Trinity learned that Beacon needed frozen turkeys for their Thanksgiving Baskets. The announcement was made on a Sunday, and 15 turkeys were provided from the congregation. Beacon offered 6 baskets, three went to needs in Trinity's congregation and community and 3 were offered to Pastor Geo for needs in his congregation and community.

Christmas

On December 21st a request was made to help a family with presents for Christmas. Through the generosity of the church family, enough money was raised to help 4 families with food, clothing, and toys just in time for Christmas.

Benevolent Fund

Because of the generosity of church family, Trinity was able to help a family with a roof, mortgage and rent assistance, utility bills, heating and air conditioning repairs, grocery bills, and covering the items needed for the Beacon Thanksgiving baskets.

MISSIONS MINISTRY REPORT

“For it is by grace you have been saved through faith-and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-not by works, so that no one can boast.” Eph. 2:8-9

Most Christians are very familiar with this verse. It explains that our salvation is from the Lord. We cannot earn it through good works. Salvation is a gift to be received. Imagine the conversations in Heaven if we were allowed to boast about our good works! Any boasting on that day will be centered around the cross of Christ!

Some months ago, I had an experience with a Muslim friend, Abe. This experience gave me a new appreciation for Eph. 2:8-9. It was an experience every Christian should have. The story begins when my friend had an accident. He had a fall and was in rehab for a long time. Once home, I visited him. His wife answered the door, but she would not allow me to come in. Abe was praying and could not be disturbed. Yet, before I could leave, he appeared and welcomed me in. After some conversation, I asked Abe the following question: What is your assurance that you will go to heaven when you die? His response: Assurance? There is no assurance! He then went on to explain his religion's belief that entrance into heaven depends on a scale where good works outweigh the bad. I repeated the Christian belief that heaven cannot be earned by good works; it is the free gift of God. We briefly discussed this, but he would have none of it. He continued to insist that good works are the way to the Father. Most of the world's religions are reiterations of this belief.

However, we know that there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people (1 Timothy 2:5-6). I left thanking God for His free gift of salvation. I thanked him for his great work on the cross and for the assurance of my salvation. I thanked him that there will be no boasting in Heaven except for the cross that all depend on. I left with a renewed sense of urgency to proclaim the Gospel to a world starving for the truth.

Thank you, Trinity, for supporting missions. Thank you for supporting Mission Sundays with prayer and pot-luck luncheons. Mission Sunday luncheons have the effect of including missionaries in a unique way. They can "rub elbows" with the people, answer questions, socialize, and present their ministry in an informal setting. Plus, they can just relax and laugh with you.

Trinity has three Mission Sundays planned for 2026: February 1, May 31, and October 4. Thank you for supporting these mission events with your prayers and presence. Special thanks to Charles and Leah Johnson and everyone else who served to make the Mission Sunday luncheons of 2025 a success. Your help is very much appreciated!
