

## The Virtue Of Kindness

Do you want people to be kind to you with their words and actions? Do you want them to be kind to your children? Most people do. Kindness is almost a forsaken trait in our society. We see the lack of it while driving, or shopping, or working, or playing. Unkindness is the fruit of a selfish



heart. If you treat a dog with kindness by petting him often and feeding him well, he will never leave you. The same usually works with husbands and wives. It also works with brethren.

One of the many words Paul used in describing love was "kind." "Love suffers long and is kind." (I Cor.13:4) And to the Ephesians he wrote, "Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor (loud quarreling) and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you." (Eph.4:31,32) Kindness and forgiveness naturally go together. However, some find both to be difficult, and such people are to be pitted. Kindness involves our hearts, our thoughts, our words and our deeds. It's like producing a beautiful garden.....

> Kind hearts are the garden, Kind thoughts are the roots, Kind words are the blossoms, Kind deeds are the fruits.

Relationships improve when kindness is practiced. And the practice should be daily. It must become our nature to be kind to one another. And it doesn't require that much of us. It can even be the difference between a frown and a smile - a listening ear, a few words. "Stop, look and listen" works with people, as well as with crossing railroads.
