# **ELDERS' COMMENTS**

The Lord's day worship and bible classes are planned for our spiritual edification and growth as Christians. All are important and are arranged, timewise, to be the most convenient for most of our people. They must not be regarded as a spiritual cafeteria in which we choose the one we want and ignore the rest. Sadly, we have some members who find the 9 AM service to be important, but the Bible class and 11:30 service as unimportant and optional. Late sleepers find the second worship service most convenient, skip the first service and Bible class and attend the last service. Of course, we know circumstances may demand a choice being made occasionally, but when it's a practice we develop, is God pleased with our habitual choices? Surely some could do better and reap the benefits.

# DISCOURAGEMENT

Do you ever feel discouraged and beaten down with the many trials and tasks of life? Most likely you do because discouragement is very common ailment. Jobs, family difficulties, financial problems, disgruntled and discontented brethren, and numerous other things often bring us down. Discouragement is one of Satan's many tactics. He knows that if he can discourage us he can probably defeat us.

There are some definite things we can do to overcome discouragement. Certainly we can be encouraged by the Word of God. We are exhorted and promised, "Be strong and of good courage; do no be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9) Such words are often repeated in Scripture to keep us encouraged in serving the Lord. What about these words... "For He Himself has said, I will never leave you nor forsake you. So we may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, I will not fear. What can man do to me?" (Heb. 12:5,6)

Secondly, we can be encouraged by others. Before Paul's arrival in Rome he saw some brethren who came out to meet him and Luke informs us, "When Paul saw them he thanked God and took courage." (Acts 28:15) Just think of the encouragement brethren received from Barnabas who was known for the encouragement and consolation he gave to others. (Acts 4:36; 11:23) If we would reach out to others during difficult times, help and support would be forthcoming. Let us seek needed support from our families and from our brethren. Listen to one of the reasons Paul wanted to visit the brethren at Rome... "that is, that I may be encouraged together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me." (Rom. 1:12)

Thirdly, we can be encouraged by encouraging others. Forgetting self and thinking of others will make you stronger. Who can you encourage today? Who needs you advice or just a listening ear? "But encourage one another day after day." (Heb. 3:13 NASV) "We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves." (Rom. 15:1) "And we exhort you, brethren, admonish the disorderly, encourage the fainthearted, support the weak, be longsuffering toward all." (I Thess. 5:14)

Things to say while encouraging others could be... "Forget it and determine to do better next time." "We learn by our mistakes." "Can I help you in some way? "Everything's difficult at first." "Just don't give up." "Try it a few times anyway, and then it will seem easier." "I'm proud of the progress you are making." "You do such good work." "Always remember that you can do what you really want to do." Just a few words of encouragement can go a long way in lifting someone's spirit to a higher level. All of us have been encouraged by someone along the way, and we have experienced times when a word of encouragement would have helped. Let's all determine to be instruments of encouragement to those around us. Just give it a try. It will encourage you.
